**AN ORDINANCE** appropriating \$5,000,000.00 from the undesignated fund balance of the 2020 CARES Act Fund to provide funds for school districts located in Jackson County, Missouri, to compensate them for unanticipated costs necessary in connection with the fight against the ongoing Coronavirus/COVID-19 pandemic and authorizing the County Executive to execute Intergovernmental Agreements with school districts, at an actual aggregate cost to the County not to exceed \$5,000,000.00.

ORDINANCE NO. 5398, September 14, 2020

INTRODUCED BY Theresa Cass Galvin and Ronald E. Finley, County Legislators

WHEREAS, U.S. President Donald J. Trump, Missouri Governor Mike Parson, and County Executive Frank White, Jr., have all declared, in one form or another, the ongoing Coronavirus/COVID-19 pandemic to be a public health emergency; and,

WHEREAS, the County, through its various efforts, plays a significant role in the public health of its citizens; and,

WHEREAS, an appropriate response by the County to this emergency will require significant expenditures from the County CARES Act Fund, which consists of monies provided by the U.S. Treasury for this purpose; and,

WHEREAS, with the funding provided by this appropriation, public school districts located in Jackson County will be compensated for unanticipated COVID-related costs incurred from March 1, 2020, through and including December 30, 2020; and,

WHEREAS, each school district's allocation is based on Fall 2019 student enrollment data and the percentage of students in each district that receive free and reduced lunch; and,

WHEREAS, under this formula the districts shall be entitled to allocations as follows:

**AN ORDINANCE** repealing section 9504., <u>Jackson County Code</u>. 1984, relating to the Freedom Memorial Wall Commission, and enacting, in lieu thereof, one new section relating to the same subject.

ORDINANCE NO. 5403, September 14, 2020

INTRODUCED BY Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, as follows:

Section A. <u>Enacting Clause</u>. Section 9504., <u>Jackson County Code</u>, 1984, is hereby repealed, and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 9504., to read as follows:

9504. Freedom Memorial Wall Commission, Purpose and Duties.

The Freedom Memorial Wall Commission shall have the following purpose and duties:

9504.1 Purpose.

The Commission's purpose is to select inductees for the Freedom Memorial Wall, which will be located at 31st Street and Benton Boulevard in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri in the Leon Jordan Memorial Park. The Freedom Memorial Wall will honor those that have made significant contributions to the Civil Rights Movement in Jackson County.

#### 9504.2 Inductee Selection.

The Commission shall meet [[annually]] to select up to one hundred (100) inductees each year for approximately ten (10) years. Inductees can be selected posthumously. The inaugural Commission will create the guidelines for the selection process of inductees. The Commission shall not be required to meet during any period in which, in the opinion of the Commission's chairman, public health conditions or other exigent circumstances warrant against meeting.

#### 9504.3 Induction Ceremonies.

With the assistance of the Jackson County government, the Commission will plan an induction ceremony that appropriately honors inductees and or their families. The Commission may decide to conduct this ceremony during Black History Month, or on Memorial Day, Martin Luther King's birthday, or on any other date the Commission may choose.

**AN ORDINANCE** repealing subsection 1503.10 and sections 1525., 1532., and 1533., <u>Jackson County Code</u>,1984, relating to the County Employees' Pension Plan and enacting, in lieu thereof, one new subsection and three new sections relating to the same subject.

ORDINANCE NO. 5409, September 21, 2020

INTRODUCED BY Charlie Franklin, County Legislator

WHEREAS, at its meeting of May 21, 2020, the Jackson County Employees' Pension Plan Board of Trustees recommended that the Plan be amended to allow for a beneficiary of a deceased plan member, other than a surviving spouse of domestic partner, to receive a death benefit; and,

WHEREAS, additionally, the Plan's special counsel has recommended certain technical revisions to the Plan to bring it into compliance with the U.S. SECURE Act, enacted by Congress in December 2019; and,

WHEREAS, the recommended revisions are in the best interests of the health, welfare and safety of the citizens of Jackson County; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, as follows:

#### Section A. Enacting Clause.

Subsection 1503.10., amd sections 1525., 1532., and 1533., <u>Jackson County Code</u>, 1984, are hereby repealed, and one new subsection and three new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as subsection 1503.10 and sections 1525., 1532., and 1533., to read as follows:

#### 1503.10 <u>Beneficiary</u>.

The term "Beneficiary" shall mean any person or persons (or a trust) designated by a Member in such form and manner as the Board may prescribe to receive a Death Benefit, in the form specified in sections 1511.1, 1511.2, 1511.3, [or] 1511.4, 1532., or 1533., payable hereunder if such person or persons survive the Member. Any designation under sections 1511.1 [and], 1511.2., 1532., or 1533., may be revoked at any time in similar manner and form.

#### 1525. Required Minimum Distributions.

## 1525.1 <u>Postponement of Commencement of Benefits to Age [70] 72 ½</u>.

A Member may elect, in a written statement filed with the Board, to receive benefits first payable for a later month, provided that no such election filed on or after January 1, 2020, may postpone the commencement of benefits to a date later than April 1 of the calendar year following the calendar year in which the Vested Employee attains age [seventy and one-half (70 ½)] seventy-two (72).

#### 1525.2 Effect of Benefit Commencing after Age [70 ½] 72.

Failure to commence benefit payments by the prescribed date can trigger an excise tax levied against the Member equal to fifty percent (50%) of the amount by which the minimum required distribution exceeds the actual amount distributed during the Plan Year. In effect, if no distribution is made during a Plan Year when it should have been made under Code section 401(a)(9), the Member loses one-half (1/2) of the distribution, which should have been made. This benefit shall be paid in accordance with any other provisions reflecting section 401(a)(9) requirements, as prescribed by the IRS commissioner.

#### 1525.3 Required Minimum Distributions.

#### A. General Rules.

#### 1. Effective Date.

The provisions of this subsection will apply for purposes of determining required minimum distributions for calendar years beginning with the 2003 calendar year.

#### 2. Precedence.

The requirements of this subsection will take precedence over any inconsistent provisions of the Plan.

#### 3. Requirements of Treasury Regulations Incorporated.

All distributions required under this subsection will be determined and made in accordance with the Treasury regulations under section 401(a)(9) of the Internal Revenue Code.

#### 4. TEFRA Section 242(b)(2) Elections.

Notwithstanding the other provisions of this subsection, other than subsection 1525.3.A(3), distributions may be made under a designation made before January 1, 1984, in accordance with section 242(b)(2) of the Tax Equity and Fiscal Responsibility Act (TEFRA) and the provisions of the Plan that relate to section 242(b)(2) of TEFRA.

#### B. <u>Time and Manner of Distribution</u>.

#### 1. Required Beginning Date.

Beginning [April 1, 1988] <u>January 1, 2020</u>, a Member's entire interest will be distributed, or begin to be distributed, to the Member no later than April 1 of the calendar year following the Calendar Year in which the Member reaches [70 ½] <u>72</u>.

#### 2. <u>Death of Member Before Distributions Begin.</u>

If the Member dies before distributions begin, the Member's entire interest will be distributed, or begin to be distributed, no later than as follows:

i. If the Member's surviving Spouse is the Member's sole Designated Beneficiary, then distributions to the surviving Spouse will begin by December 31 of the calendar year immediately following the calendar year in which the Member died, or by December 31 of the calendar year in which the

Member would have attained age [seventy and one-half (70 ½)] seventy-two (72), if later.

If the Member's surviving Spouse is not the ii. Member's sole Designated Beneficiary, then distributions to the Designated Beneficiary will begin by December 31 of the calendar year immediately following the calendar year in which the Member died. If there is no Designated Beneficiary as of iii. September 30 of the year following the year of the Member's death, the Member's entire interest will be distributed by December 31 of the calendar year containing the fifth anniversary of the Member's death. iv. If the Member's surviving Spouse is the Member's sole Designated Beneficiary and the surviving Spouse dies after the Member's but before distributions to the surviving Spouse begin, this subsection 1525.3.B(2), other than 1525.3.B(2)(i), will apply as if the surviving Spouse were the Member.

For purposes of this subsection 1525.3.C.2 and subsection 1525.3.E, distributions are considered to begin on the Member's Required Beginning Date (or, if subsection 1525.3.B(2)) applies, the

date distributions are required to begin to the surviving Spouse under subsection 1525.3.B(2)). If annuity payments irrevocably commence to the Member before the Member's Required Beginning Date (or to the Member's surviving Spouse before the date distributions are required to begin to the surviving Spouse under subsection 1525.3.B(2)(i)), the date distributions are considered to begin is the date distributions actually commence.

#### 1532. Death Prior to Age 55, Effect.

If any active Member should die (i) prior to reaching the Attained Age of fifty-five; (ii) being Vested in the Plan; and (iii) be survived by a Spouse or Domestic Partner, that Spouse or Domestic Partner shall be entitled to a Death Benefit. Such Death Benefit shall be a monthly income, payable for the life of the Spouse or Domestic Partner, equal to the benefit that would have been payable to such Spouse or Domestic Partner if the Member had retired on the day before the date of the death and elected the form of payment specified in section 1511.2 with 75% of the reduced benefit continued to the Member's Spouse or Domestic Partner for lifetime. Such Spouse or Domestic Partner Death Benefit payments shall commence on the first day of the month next following the Member's date of death. If a Member dies without a Spouse or Domestic Partner, [a Member's surviving child or children shall receive a return of contributions equal to the contributions made on behalf of the Member by the Employer up to \$10,000.00, to be paid in a lump sum distribution and in equal shares] such a Death Benefit shall be payable to the Designated Beneficiary in an amount equal to the contributions made on behalf of the Member by the Employer up to \$10,000, to be paid in a lump sum distribution.

#### 1533. Death After Age 55, Effect.

If any active Member should die (i) after reaching the Attained Age fifty-five, (ii) being Vested in the Plan, and (iii) being survived by a Spouse or Domestic Partner, that Spouse or Domestic Partner shall be entitled to a Death Benefit. Such Death Benefit shall be a monthly income, payable for the life of the Spouse or Domestic Partner equal to the benefit that would have been payable to such Spouse or Domestic Partner if the Member had retired on the day before the date of death and elected the form of payments specified in section 1511.2 with 100% of the reduced benefits continued to the Member's Spouse or Domestic Partner for lifetime. Such Spouse or Domestic Partner Death Benefit payments shall commence on the first day of the month next following the Member's date of death. Notwithstanding the above, if a Member had reached the Member's Normal Retirement Date and had made a written election as to the form of benefit payments pursuant to section 1511, then, upon the Member's death prior to the commencement of benefits, any Death Benefit shall be payable in accordance with such written election. If a Member dies without a Spouse or Domestic Partner, [a Member's surviving child or children shall receive a return of contributions equal to the contributions made on behalf of the Member by the Employer up to \$10,000.00, to be paid in a lump sum distribution and in equal shares] such a Death Benefit shall be payable to the Designated Beneficiary in an amount equal to the contributions made on behalf of the Member by the Employer up to \$10,000, to be paid in a lump sum distribution.

WHEREAS, the County has a continuing need for climate-controlled records storage and office space for use by the Recorder of Deeds' Records Center and the 16<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit Court of Jackson County; and,

WHEREAS, the County has leased such space from Space Center-Kansas City of Independence, MO, since 1995; and,

WHEREAS, the current lease will expire on December 31, 2020; and,

WHEREAS, in March 2019, ownership of Space Center-Kansas City was transferred to BRE (Blackstone Real Estate) Space Kansas City, LLC, of Kansas City, MO, and the property is now managed by Link Industrial Properties of Independence, MO; and,

WHEREAS, Link has submitted, on behalf of BRE, a proposal for a sixty-month extension to the current lease; and,

WHEREAS, section 1030.1, <u>Jackson County Code</u>, 1984, eliminates the requirement for competitive bidding when the item to be acquired can be obtained from only one source; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance and Purchasing recommends award of a lease extension to BRE and Link, as sole source providers, because the cost of moving the County's records to alternate leased or newly constructed space, estimated at \$382,050.00, would be prohibitive; and,

WHEREAS, the new lease term will be effective January 1, 2021, with the availability of funds for 2021 and future years subject to annual appropriation; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the County Executive be and hereby is authorized to execute the attached extension to the lease agreement with BRE Space Kansas City, LLC, and Link Industrial Properties of Independence, MO; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Finance and Purchasing be and hereby is authorized to make all payments, including final payment, on the extension, to the extent that sufficient appropriations to the using spending agencies are contained in the then current Jackson County budget.

#### **Background History:**

The Jackson County Records Center currently leases 55,000 square feet of floor space from Space Center-Kansas City, Inc., an environmentally controlled and secure underground facility located at 1500 South Geospace Drive, Independence, Missouri for the storage of 16<sup>th</sup> Circuit Court and other County department records. A three year lease was initially signed and went into effect in April, 1996. Additional three-to-five year lease extensions, with Legislative appropriations, have been executed over time (the latest in 2015) in order to provide County-wide record storage space through December 31st, 2020.

#### Records Center Storage/ Staffing:

Currently, of the 80,000 boxes stored at the Records Center, the vast majority of records retrieved from and returned to the facility on a weekly basis (370 files) are considered "Active" files, i.e., one to five years old. Remaining records retrieved from and returned to the facility are considered "Archived" files, i.e., six years or older. "Active" files comprise approximately 15% of all inventory with Archived files comprising the remaining 85%. Daily management and staffing of the Records Center is divided between the Recorder of Deeds Department and the 16th Circuit Court. All Recorder of Deeds staff salaries are funded from the Recorders Fee Fund.

#### Records Center Ownership / Current Lease Expenses:

In March, 2019, ownership by Space Center storage complex was transferred to BRE (Blackstone Real Estate) Space Kansas City, LLC, and the property is now managed by Link Industrial Properties. The initial monthly fee for leasing of this space in 1996 (23 years ago) was \$15,079 per month and included additional Common Area Maintenance (CAM), janitorial and, at-that-time only, tenant improvement fees. Both CAM and janitorial fees, regarding the current lease extension, are annually adjusted based on the Consumer Price Index. Current lease expenses for this facility, negotiated in 2015, are \$2.55 per square foot plus a monthly CAM of \$0.92, totaling \$3.47 per square foot or a monthly fee of \$15,904, through the end of 2020.

#### Storage Need Analysis:

An evaluation of responses regarding a recently completed five-year storage needs questionnaire submitted by twenty departments/agencies, with input from 16<sup>th</sup> Circuit Court Administration, indicated that future County-wide existing storage/space needs will remain unchanged over the next five-year period. Although various County-wide digitization initiatives have commenced in various departments/divisions and will help limit in-coming storage growth, such efforts will not immediately impact the vast majority of existing, hard-copy archived holdings that are considered permanent.

Based on such reporting and analysis, Jackson County and the 16<sup>th</sup> Circuit Court will continue to need approximately 55,000 sq. ft. of records storage space over the next several years. Options for addressing such on-going needs include: (1) Temporarily extending the County's current vendor lease; (2) Seeking less expensive alternate storage space from another storage vendor; or (3) Consider construction of a County owned facility or modification of an existing County-owned building facility (Example: Lower levels of the 14<sup>th</sup> Street parking garage) for permanent record storage.

In evaluating Option 1 the Recorder of Deeds Department approached Link Industrial Properties and asked the company to determine costs if the County wished to extend the existing lease (negotiated in 2015) for up to an additional one-to-five year period, subject to annual appropriations and/or need. Link Industrial Properties responded with a written proposal, offering to extend the current lease for an additional five year period, i.e., 2021 to 2025. Costs would average \$2.83 per square foot plus a monthly estimated CAM of \$1.01, totaling \$3.84 per square foot or a monthly fee of \$17,600.

In evaluating Option 2 seeking less expensive alternate storage, informal bids were sought in lieu of a formal Request for Proposal RFP, to assess current market pricing. Two comparable public storage space centers (Carefree Industrial Park, Indep., Mo. and Dean Underground, Kansas City, Mo. were contacted, conducted an on-site visit, and were asked for square footage estimates for Jackson.County holdings. Carefree Industrial Park does not have comparable space at this time with a future build-out estimated in a \$4.00+ square foot range. Dean Underground would be over \$4.00 per square foot or a monthly fee in excess of \$18,000 in comparison with the Link Industrial Properties proposal of \$17,600.

Additional bids could be sought, either formally (RFP) or informally, but facility relocation costs would also need to be factored in overall costs estimates. A.Arnold Company (Jackson County's term and supply moving service vendor) was contacted and conducted an on-site analysis. Estimated expenses, including use of multiple transportation trailers, lifting equipment, twenty-five contact staff (with appropriate security clearances), totaled \$382,050 for the relocation of such holdings within a ten mile radius of the existing facility. Estimated project completion would take four to five weeks in order to disassemble, transport and reassemble all holdings at another location, i.e., 80,000 storage boxes/books plus 93 aisles of commercial grade shelving units twelve to fourteen feet tall. During this period of time the County, in order to maintain timely services to departments and Circuit Court divisions, would need to staff and operate two storage centers during the month+ long process.

In evaluating Option 3, based on discussion with Administration, no potential alternatives are in place through 2020 to fund either the construction or modification an existing building for records storage.

#### Management Recommendation:

Based on the above analysis, giving consideration to each of the above storage options, renewing the Space Center lease with Link Properties (that would include open termination options based on County appropriations or need), is recommended as the best near-term solution for the interim storage of Jackson County and 16<sup>th</sup> Circuit Court records.

#### RECITALS

- A. Lessor (as successor in interest to Space Center Kansas City, Inc., a Minnesota corporation, as successor in interest to GeoSpace Joint Venture, a Missouri general partnership) and Lessee are parties to that certain Lease Agreement dated December 29, 1995 (the "Original Lease"), which Original Lease has been previously amended by that certain First Addendum to Lease Agreement dated March 3, 1999, by that certain Second Addendum to Lease Agreement dated March 1, 2000, by that certain Third Addendum to Lease Agreement dated January 24, 2004, by that certain Fourth Addendum to Lease Agreement dated April 17, 2009, by that certain Fifth Addendum to Lease Agreement dated December 18, 2012 and by that certain Sixth Lease Agreement Addendum to Lease Agreement dated December 4, 2015 (collectively, the "Existing Lease"). Pursuant to the Existing Lease, Lessor has leased to Lessee space currently containing approximately 55,000 square feet of net usable space (the "Premises") lying below the top of the Bethany Falls ledge of rock and commonly identified as 1560 West GeoSpace Drive, Independence, Missouri 64056 (the "Building").
- B. The Existing Lease by its terms expires on December 31, 2020, and the parties desire to extend the term of the Existing Lease, all on the following terms and conditions. The Existing Lease as amended by this Seventh Addendum is herein referred to as the "Lease".

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the above recitals which by this reference are incorporated herein, the mutual covenants and conditions contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, Lessor and Lessee hereby amend the Existing Lease and agree and represent as follows:

- Extension. The term of the Existing Lease is hereby extended for a period of 60 months and shall commence on January 1, 2021 (the "Sixth Extension Date") and expire on December 31, 2025 ("Sixth Extended Termination Date"), unless sooner terminated in accordance with the terms of the Lease (the "Sixth Extended Term"). Effective as of the Sixth Extension Date, the term of Lease shall mean the term of the Lease as extended through the Sixth Extended Termination Date.
- 2. Rent. From and after the Sixth Extension Date, the schedule of rent payable with respect to the Premises during the Sixth Extended Term is the following:

Consistent with Paragraph 3 of the Original Lease, funds sufficient to meet the Lessee's financial obligations set out herein are subject to appropriation in Lessee's 2021 and future years' annual budgets. Lessee agrees to use its best efforts to ensure that funds sufficient to cover rental payments for each year of the Lease (including the Sixth Extended Term) and any subsequent renewal term, are included in its annual budgets and agrees that in the event that sufficient funds to pay any rental payment due under the Lease are not appropriated in Lessee's annual budget for any year under the Lease, including the Sixth Extended Term and any subsequent renewal term, Lessee shall not

lease space for money from any other owner of real property or leasing agent for the purpose of storing the same materials which are to be stored on the Premises under the Lease.

- 3. <u>Condition of Premises.</u> Lessee is in possession of the Premises and accepts the same in their current condition subject to the Existing Lease without any agreements, representations, understandings or obligations on the part of Lessor in conjunction with this Seventh Addendum to perform any alterations, repairs or improvements.
- 4. Lessor Notice and Rent Payment Addresses. Effective as of the date of this Seventh Addendum, any notice required under the Lease to be given to Lessor shall be sent to BRE Space Kansas City LLC, 90 Park Avenue 32<sup>nd</sup> Floor, New York, New York 10016, Attention: General Counsel with a copy to BRE Space Kansas City LLC, 220 Commerce Drive, 4<sup>th</sup> Floor, Fort Washington, PA 19034, Attention: Lease Administration. Rent shall be made payable to an entity, and sent to the address or addresses, Lessor designates in writing to Lessee and shall be made by good and sufficient check payable in United States of America currency or by other means acceptable to Lessor.
- 5. No Options. The parties hereto acknowledge and agree that during the Sixth Extended Term, Lessee shall have no rights to extend the term of the Lease, or expand, terminate or contract the Premises. The parties agree that any rights existing in the Lease to extend the term of the Lease, or expand, terminate or contract the Premises shall be deleted in their entirety and are of no further force and effect.
- 6. OFAC and Anti-Money Laundering Compliance Certifications. Lessee represents, warrants and covenants to Lessor that from and after the date of this Seventh Addendum (i) Lessee is not acting for itself or acting for the benefit of, a person or entity blocked pursuant to Executive Order 13224 signed on September 24, 2001 and entitled "Blocking Property and Prohibiting Transactions with Persons Who Commit, Threaten to Commit, or Support Terrorism" or under any rules or regulations promulgated thereunder (collectively, the "Executive Order") and (ii) Lessee does not have any interest in any property blocked by the Executive Order. In the event that Lessee breaches the above representations, warranties or covenants in this Section, Lessor shall have the right to terminate the Lease and all other rights and remedies available at law and in equity. Lessee hereby agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless Lessor from and against any and all claims, damages, losses, risks, liabilities, fines, penalties, forfeitures and expenses (including costs and reasonable attorneys' fees) arising from or related to any breach of its obligations under, or of its representations, certification and warranties set forth in, this Section.
- 7. Miscellaneous. This Seventh Addendum sets forth the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the matters set forth herein. Except as herein modified or amended, the provisions, conditions and terms of the Existing Lease shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect. In the case of any inconsistency between the provisions of the Existing Lease and this Seventh Addendum, the provisions of this Seventh Addendum shall govern and control. Each signatory of this Seventh Addendum represents hereby that he or she has the authority to execute and deliver the same on behalf of the party hereto for which such signatory is acting. The capitalized terms used in this Seventh Addendum shall have the same definitions as set forth in the Existing Lease to the extent that such capitalized terms are defined therein and not redefined in this Seventh Addendum. Lessee hereby represents to Lessor that Lessee has dealt with no broker, agent or finder in connection with this Seventh Addendum. Lessee agrees to indemnify and hold Lessor, its trustees, members, managers, principals, beneficiaries, partners, officers, directors, employees, mortgagee(s) and agents, harmless from all claims of any brokers, agents or finders claiming to have represented Lessee in connection with this Seventh Addendum. Lessor hereby represents to Lessee that Lessor has dealt with no broker, agent or finder in connection with this Seventh Addendum. Lessor agrees to indemnify and hold Lessee, its trustees, members, managers, principals, beneficiaries, partners, officers, directors, employees, and agents, and the respective principals and members of any such agents harmless from all claims of any brokers, agents or finders claiming to have represented Lessor in connection with this Seventh Addendum. This Seventh Addendum may be executed in counterparts and shall constitute an agreement binding on all parties notwithstanding that all parties are not signatories to the original or the same counterpart provided that all parties are furnished a copy or copies thereof reflecting the signature of all parties. Barb,

The current EZ-GO Textron four year Golf Cart Lease Agreement ends December 31, 2020. Jackson County Parks + Rec recommends using the NIPA/OMNIA Partners agreement through EZ-GO Textron Company, to lease 76 TXT Gas golf carts. This agreement will also include a Hauler 1200X Range Picker and Hauler 1200X Beverage cart, all to be used at the Fred Arbanas Golf Course. Throughout our relationship with EZ-GO, their Representative and Service Tech have always been very responsive to our needs and available when cart issues arose.

The current lease fleet payments are to PNC in a monthly amount of \$4,461.09 for 76 carts, 1 Range Picker and 1 Beverage cart. The new monthly four year Lease Agreement proposed amount would be \$4,738.60 for the 76 golf carts and two 1200 Haulers. This is an exceptional price, as it is only an increase of \$277.51. We would be receiving an all new fleet of carts with added technology for fuel savings and performance.

Upon acceptance of the new Lease Proposal, the Fred Arbanas Golf Course's current payment schedule will be terminated after the October 2020 payment has been made. November & December will be forgiven, saving the Arbanas Golf Course \$8,922.18 in our 2020 budget. # COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT FOR COLLECTION OF PACE SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS

This Agreement is made and entered into effective as of \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, 2020 (the "Effective Date"), by and between Jackson County, Missouri ("County"), and Show Me PACE Clean Energy District ("Board").

#### WITNESSETH:

**WHEREAS**, the Board is a political subdivision of the State of Missouri, organized under RSMO Sections 67.2800 to 67.2835, as amended (the "Act"), and having authority to enter into this Agreement pursuant to RSMO Sections 70.210 to 70.230; and

**WHEREAS**, on June 15, 2015 the Board was created by Ordinance 919 of the City of Bel Nor, Missouri; and

WHEREAS, the Act provides that the county collector is to collect and distribute special assessments imposed by a clean energy development board such as the Board in the same manner as ad valorem taxes, and the Board and the County desire to set forth their mutual agreements with respect thereto, as more particularly set forth in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, prior to the Effective Date, the Board entered into multiple commercial assessment contracts, as defined in RSMO Section 67.2815, described on Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (the "Prior Commercial Contracts") and the Board desires that the County collect and distribute the special assessments levied under the Prior Commercial Contracts.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the premises and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are acknowledged, it is agreed by the parties as follows:

1. (a) The County will include on its annual joint governmental property tax bills the special assessments levied by the Board ("Special Assessments") which are levied for the tax year of the annual tax bill and are not delinquent, provided that not later than September 1 of said tax year, such Special Assessments are calculated by the Board and provided to the County in a format adapted to the County's billing system, and are certified to the County in writing by the Board's District Administrator (collectively, "Annual Special Assessment"). Upon written request by the Board, the County, in the County's sole and absolute discretion, may include on non-annual property tax bills Special Assessments levied by the Board that are levied for the tax year of the tax bill, provided that such Special Assessments are calculated by the Board and provided to the County in a format adapted to the County's billing system,

and are certified to the County in writing by the Board's District Administrator (collectively, "Non-annual Special Assessments", and individually, "Non-annual Special Assessment"). Non-annual Special Assessments that are to be billed by the County will be billed by the County within sixty (60) days after such Special Assessments are calculated by the Board and provided to the County in a format adapted to the County's billing system, and are certified to the County in writing by the Board's District Administrator. Any Special Assessment certified by the Board's District Administrator to the County for inclusion in a County property tax bill under this section after September 1 of the applicable tax year shall be deemed to constitute a request by the Board for said Special Assessment to be included in a non-annual property tax bill of the County as a Non-annual Special Assessment.

- (b) The Board's request for billing of Special Assessments by the County shall include the parcel number of each parcel against which such Special Assessment has been levied, the designation of such Special Assessment levied against each such parcel as "Show Me PACE" or "Ygrene SMP", the amount of such Special Assessment levied against each such parcel, and a certification by the Board's District Administrator that to the best of his or her knowledge, each such Special Assessment was properly levied by the Board, and is proper, valid, legally authorized and accurate. The Board shall be solely responsible for the calculation and determination of the amount of any Special Assessment levied by the Board against any parcel. The County shall have no responsibility or obligation for any such calculation or determination.
- (c) The County will assess interest, delinquent and back tax collection fees, and other fees and charges on delinquent Special Assessments included on County tax bills at the same rates and in the same manner as on delinquent ad valorem real property taxes.
- 2. The County will accept payment of Special Assessments and related charges billed by the County at any location and in any manner that the County then accepts payment of ad valorem real property taxes.
- 3. For each Special Assessment, the related special assessment and interest assessed thereon collected by the County, less Authorized Deductions (defined below) for such Special Assessment shall be distributed by the County to the Board via ACH (Automated Clearinghouse) on or before the fifteenth day of each month to the "Show Me PACE" bank account of the Board or the "Ygrene SMP" bank account of the Board in accordance with the designations by the Board under subsection 1(b), of this Agreement (collectively, "Distributions", and individually, "Distribution"); provided that amounts impounded under RSMO Section 139.031 or otherwise not lawfully available for distribution due to protest or challenge ("Impounds") shall not be subject to distribution under this section. As used herein, the term "Authorized Deductions" shall mean and include Collector's Commissions (defined below), Supplemental Processing Charges (defined below), Extraordinary Collection Costs (defined below), Indemnity Obligation Amounts (defined below), Assessment Fund Amounts (defined below), Correction Amounts (defined below), Impounds, and all other retentions, offsets and deductions that the County is authorized to deduct from distributions under this Agreement and/or Missouri

- law. Any amount required to be distributed to the Board for a given Special Assessment under this section shall be subject to offset for amounts previously distributed to the Board for that Special Assessment that were assessed, collected or distributed in error ("Correction Amounts"). With each Distribution the County shall provide the Board a detailed accounting of all amounts collected and the Authorized Deductions withheld for each parcel of property, in substantially the form attached as **Exhibit B** to this Agreement showing the applicable parcel number, the base amount and interest amount collected for each parcel, and the Collector's Commission and Assessment Fund Amount applicable to each parcel.
- 4. The County shall be entitled to a collection fee equal to a percentage of each Special Assessment and interest assessed thereon collected by the County at the same rate and in the same manner as provided under RSMO Section 52.260 for the collection of taxes by the County (the "Collector's Commissions"). To provide for payment of Collector's Commissions for a given Special Assessment, the County may deduct said amounts from the distribution of monies for such Special Assessment made to the Board by the County. Collector's Commissions shall be in addition to all other fees, deductions, offsets and reimbursement to which the County is entitled under other sections of this Agreement and/or Missouri law, shall be Authorized Deductions and shall be in addition to all other Authorized Deductions.
- 5. The County shall be entitled to reimbursement by the Board in the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each Non-annual Special Assessment billed by the County, as reimbursement for additional labor, printing and postage costs associated with such billing and additional labor and other costs associated with the collection of such assessments ("Supplemental Processing Charges"). To provide for payment of Supplemental Processing Charges for a given Special Assessment, the County may deduct said amounts from the distribution of monies for such Special Assessment made to the Board by the County. Supplemental Processing Charges shall be in addition to all other fees, deductions, offsets and reimbursement to which the County is entitled under other sections of this Agreement and/or Missouri law, shall be Authorized Deductions and shall be in addition to all other Authorized Deductions.
- 6. In the event that any Special Assessment billed by the County under this Agreement is uncollectible by the County due to the Board's failure or inability to support its claim in defense thereof, the Board's retraction or dismissal thereof, the impropriety, invalidity or inaccuracy thereof, the Board's failure to comply with the provisions of the Act or this Agreement, any inconsistency or conflict between the provisions of the Act and any other provision of Missouri law, or the statute of limitations, then the County shall be entitled to reimbursement by the Board of all expenses incurred by the County in connection with the billing and attempt to collect such uncollectible Special Assessment, as follows ("Extraordinary Collection Costs"): (a) the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each such uncollectible Special Assessment as reimbursement for associated County labor costs; and (b) the pro rata portion of all other costs and fees (including, without limitation, attorney's fees and suit costs at statutory rates, publication costs and posting costs) allocable to each such uncollectible Special Assessment as reimbursement for such costs

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and fees. To provide for payment of Extraordinary Collection Costs for a given Special Assessment, the County may deduct said amounts from the distribution of monies for such Special Assessment made to the Board by the County. Extraordinary Collection Costs shall be in addition to all other fees, deductions, offsets and reimbursement to which the County is entitled under other sections of this Agreement and/or Missouri law, shall be Authorized Deductions and shall be in addition to all other Authorized Deductions.

- The County shall be entitled to reimbursement by the Board for, and the Board shall hold the County harmless from and indemnify and defend the County against, any and all claims, demands, actions, causes of action, suits, writs, judgments, damages. expenses and costs (including, without limitation, reasonable in-house and outside counsel attorney's fees and court costs) directly resulting from or arising out of any special assessment, lien or default under any of the Prior Commercial Contracts or any judicial challenge to (i) the propriety, validity or accuracy of any Special Assessment certified to the County by the Board, or (ii) the termination of a Special Assessment lien or related assessment contract or any other lien or other rights by reason of the foreclosure of such Special Assessment lien under RSMO Chapter 141, except to the extent that the County fails to notify the Board in writing promptly after receiving notice of the commencement of the applicable claim, demand, action, cause of action, suit or writ (a "Claim Notice"), and such failure results in prejudice to any defense by the Board authorized in this section (the "Indemnity Obligation"). Any amounts owed to the County under the Indemnity Obligation shall be herein referred to as "Indemnity Obligation Amounts". To provide for payment of Indemnity Obligation Amounts for a given Special Assessment, the County may deduct said amounts from the distribution of monies for such Special Assessment made to the Board by the County. Indemnity Obligation Amounts shall be in addition to all other fees, deductions, offsets and reimbursement to which the County is entitled under other sections of this Agreement and/or Missouri law, shall be Authorized Deductions and shall be in addition to all other Authorized Deductions. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Board shall have the right, at its option and at its expense, to elect in writing to provide the County with a defense against such claim, demand, action, cause of action, suit or writ with counsel reasonably acceptable to the County (the "Assumption of Defense Notice"), in which event (a) the Indemnity Obligation will not include in-house or outside counsel attorney's fees except those incurred by the Board for the defense provided to the County and except those incurred by the County after the County gives the applicable Claim Notice to the Board but prior to the County's receipt of the Assumption of Defense Notice, and (b) the Board shall have the right to compromise and settle any such claim, demand, action, cause of action, suit or writ on terms acceptable to the Board in its sole discretion, so long as the Board obtains a complete release of the County from any such claim, demand, action, cause of action, suit or writ.
- 8. The County shall be entitled to retain an amount equal to the percentages of all Special Assessments collected by the County at the same rates and in the same manner as provided under RSMo Sections 137.082 and 137.720 in connection with the collection of ad valorem taxes by the County ("Assessment Fund Amounts") for deposit into the County's assessment fund. To provide for payment of Assessment Fund Amounts for a given Special Assessment, the County may deduct said amounts from the distribution of

monies for such Special Assessment made to the Board by the County. The Assessment Fund Amounts shall be in addition to all other fees, deductions, offsets and reimbursement to which the County is entitled under other sections of this Agreement and/or Missouri law, shall be Authorized Deductions and shall be in addition to all other Authorized Deductions.

- 9. This Agreement shall be effective as of the Effective Date and shall continue in force and effect unless terminated by either party upon ninety (90) days' advance written notice to the other party. In the event of such termination, the provisions of this Agreement shall continue to apply with respect to Special Assessments certified to the County by the Board prior to such termination.
- 10. If any covenant or other provision of this Agreement is invalid, or incapable of being enforced, by reasons of any rule of law or public policy, all other conditions and provisions of the Agreement shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect and no covenant or provision shall be deemed dependent upon any other covenant or provision unless so expressed herein.
- 11. This Agreement may be executed in two (2) or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original and all of which together shall constitute but one and the same instrument.
- 12. This Agreement may be recorded by the Board in the office of the Recorder of Deeds, Jackson County, Missouri.
- 13. This Agreement incorporates the entire understanding and agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. Neither party waives its legal rights with respect to issues outside or not contained in this Agreement.
- 14. This Agreement and the rights of the parties hereunder shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Missouri including all matters of construction, validity, performance, and enforcement and without giving effect to the principles of conflict of laws. Any action brought by any party hereto shall be brought within the State of Missouri, County of Jackson.



# SERVICE and MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT Between The Down town Community Improvement District And Jackson County, Missouri

THIS SERVICE and MANA	AGEMENT AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is made and
entered into as of theday of	. 2020, by and between Jackson County Missouri
(the "Owner"), and the Downtown Co	ommunity Improvement District/CID, (the 'Manager").

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Owner is the owner of certain real property commonly known as Oppenstein Brothers Memorial Park, the Jackson County Courthouse, the Jackson County Detention Center, the Jackson County Regional Correctional Center, the Jackson County Community Justice Center, and all related parking lots located in the Central Business District loop of the City of Kansas City, County of Jackson, State of Missouri (collectively the 'Properties') and

WHEREAS, the Owner desires to engage Manager to clean and secure the Properties as described above, and the Manager desires to render such management services to Owner, upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, inconsideration of the mutual covenants and agreements set forth below, Owner and Manager agree as follows:

#### 1 Engagement of Manager

Owner engages Manager, and Manager agrees to serve as Manager in connection with the Properties for the period of calendar year 2020, renewable up to four additional years, upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth below.

#### 2. Manager's Duties

Manager shall provide the following services with regard to the Properties as provided herein.

#### A. Oppenstein Brothers Memorial Park

#### General Maintenance

- Supervise and direct the maintenance operation of the park on behalf of Owner, in an efficient and satisfactory manner and to the best of its abilities, to include properly irrigating and maintaining turf, plants and flowers.
- Sweep the park two (2) times each business day.
- Remove trash, debris and any other matter each business day.

- Promptly remove graffiti from any visible surface as needed.
- Power wash the properties as needed to keep all surfaces clean.
- Promptly report any repairs needed of capital equipment (benches, trash cans, etc.) to Owner.
- Provide all turf maintenance each year of the Agreement from the months of March through October. This shall include all mowing, trimming, edging, debris removal and removal of weeks in paved areas.
- Provide all maintenance, repair and replacement to any permanent or temporary structures that were installed by Manager, with the approval of the Owner. Capital replacement items may be provided by Owner at its discretion.

#### **Snow Events**

- When snow/ice accumulation has covered hard surface areas the CID snow crew will be initiated. The park will be cleared of all snow and ice by the CID snow crew.
- If the snow event accumulated during the night, the snow crew will report to the designated facility early enough each morning, 7 days a week, to have the area cleared by 8:00 a.m. Every attempt will he made to make passable all areas by 8:00 a.m. If the snow continues to accumulate during the day, appropriate staff will stay and clear sidewalks until 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

## B. Jackson County Courthouse and Corrections Locations:

- Jackson County Courthouse; 415 East 12th Street, Kansas City, Mo
- Jackson County Corrections Facility; 1300 Cherry Street, Kansas City, Mo.
- Jackson County Regional Correctional Center; 505 East 12th Street, Kansas City, Mo.
- Jackson County Community Justice Building; 1315 Locust Street, Kansas City, Mo.

#### **Grounds Cleaning**

#### Standard:

- Grounds should be clean and free of evidence of vandalism, unnecessary markings, excessive dirt, sticky spills, etc.
- Tables, chairs and benches should be clean and free of graffiti, insects or structural damage.
- Grounds should be free of wasp nests, bird nests and spider webs, if reachable.
- Grounds should be generally free of trash, cigarette butts, bottles, cans, glass and obvious litter.

#### Procedures:

 Pick up all litter in the grounds area including sidewalks, steps, porches, parking lots as needed. Pay particular attention to broken glass, pop tops and cigarette butts.

- Gum, etc. should be scraped from the ground surface with a putty knife.
- With sprayer-washer or broom, remove any cobwebs, etc., that have built up overhead.
- Sweep collected debris off hard surfaces into trash containers. Do not push into edging cut.
- Pick up around trash barrels, paying particular attention for broken glass and pop tops. Dispose of all cleaned-up material in the trash.
- Remove all litter and other debris from tree catch basin.

#### Frequency:

Once daily before 10:00 a.m.

#### Safety:

- Supervise and direct the safety operation of the properties on behalf of and for the Owner, in an efficient and satisfactory manner and to the best of its abilities.
- Patrol the property four (4) times each business day.
- Coordinate Parking Lot patrols with appropriate Owner representative.
- Coordinate communications with Jackson County Sheriff's Office and Kansas City Police Department, as needed.
- Distribute service information with the CID kiosk as needed.
- Distribute homeless service cards as needed.

#### Programs:

- Request (through the Owner's Special Use Permit Application Process) the use of the Property for all special events at least two weeks in advance of the event.
- Apply for all required permits identified through the Special Use Permit Application process.
- Owner and manager will discuss collaborative training for staff on an annual basis, for topics that mutually benefit each respective work force.

#### Mowing and Landscaping Procedures:

- When arriving to an area to be mowed: Walk the area to be mowed and remove any debris, limbs and trash from the area.
- Proceed to mow the area never directly pointing the discharge chute onto sidewalks/hard surface walk areas.
- Trim around any obstacles such as trees, poles, stumps, signs etc.
- Keep mowers and support equipment off sidewalks.
- When completed with mowing, grass should be blown off any concrete/hard surface.

#### Standard:

• The area must maintain a neat and clean appearance at all times. Under normal conditions the area should be moved every five (5) days (The Courthouse lawn will be moved on Mondays and Thursdays).

- Grass should be generally uniform in appearance and attractive. Grass catcher must be used. Rocks, trash, limbs and debris must be removed.
- Height of grass should be maintained as recommended for the species, a minimum height of 3" and a maximum height of 4.5".
- Concrete edges (walkways and shelters) should be edged/trimmed to provide a neat appearance. Grass around trees, sign posts, poles, marker posts will be trimmed to provide a neat and clean appearance.

#### Sidewalk Trees:

- Any and all weeds should be removed at least weekly.
- Any and all trash should be removed daily.

#### 3. Owner's Duty

Jackson County Parks + Rec, Facilities, and Corrections Personnel will meet with the CID staff to walk the properties quarterly, addressing all areas and responsibilities covered by this agreement.

#### 4. Contract Service Cost

Manager is to provide all labor, tools, equipment, training, materials and supervision to perform daily requirements. Manager is to provide Safety and Security requirements consisting of patrol and observation, report illegal or unusual activity, provide assistance when needed to County employees and County visitors and to participate in special events when requested. Location for this Scope of Work is for the above mentioned properties within the Central Business District Loop of Downtown Kansas City, Missouri.

Yearly Contract Service Cost for all Services shall be \$50,000. The first payment shall be made by Owner to Manager in one lump sum payment, upon full execution of this Agreement by both parties, and annually thereafter in the first quarter of the year, for any additional years of this Agreement, subject to appropriation.

#### 5. Insurance

- Manager shall take out and keep in force during the term of this Agreement, at its own cost and expense, commercial general public liability with commercially reasonable limits, to protect the Owner against any liability to persons or property incident to Manager's use or maintenance of or resulting from any accident occurring in or about the Property that shall be due to, arise out of, result from, or in any way connected to the maintenance, use or occupancy of the Property by the Manager or any other party acting by or through Manager; and name Jackson County, Missouri as an additional insured.
- The policy of insurance required under Subsection (a) above shall be primary and non-contributory, shall be issued by an insurance company licensed to do business in Missouri, shall name the Owner as additional insured, and shall

provide that the policy cannot be canceled or not renewed without first giving thirty (30) days written notice of such to the Owner. Upon demand the Manager shall furnish to the Owner, evidence reasonably satisfactory to the Owner that the insurance required herein is in full force and effect.

 Manager shall indemnify, defend and hold the County harmless from any and all claims, liabilities, damages and costs (including reasonable attorney's fees directly related thereto) to the extent caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of Manager or its employees, agents or representatives.

#### 6. Subject to Appropriation

Manager and the County recognize that the County intends to satisfy its financial obligation to Organization hereunder out of funds annually appropriated for that purpose by the County. County promises and covenants to make its best efforts to appropriate funds in accordance with this Agreement. In the event no funds or insufficient funds are appropriated and budgeted, or those funds are otherwise unavailable by any means whatsoever for payments due hereunder, the County shall immediately notify Manager of this occurrence and this Agreement shall terminate on the last day for which appropriations were received, without penalty or expense to the County of any kind whatsoever, except as to the portions of the payment amounts herein agreed upon for which funds shall have been appropriated and budgeted or are otherwise available, or at any time after the last date that County has paid for the Services, if earlier.

#### 7. Notice

Any notice, request, instruction or other communication to be given to either party hereunder shall be in writing and shall be conclusively deemed to be delivered when personally delivered or when (a) transmitted by facsimile number indicated below followed with a mailing by regular United States Postal Service mail; (b) deposited for overnight delivery with an overnight courier such as Federal Express, Airborne, United Parcel Service or other overnight courier service; or (c) deposited in the United States Postal Service mail, sent by celtified mail, return receipt requested. IF any covenant or other provision of this Agreement is invalid, or incapable of being enforced, by reasons of any rule of law or public policy, all other conditions and provision of this Agreement shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect and no covenant or provision shall be deemed dependent upon any other covenant or provision unless as expressed herein.

#### 11. Incorporation

This Agreement incorporates the entire understanding and agreement of the parties.



### **Expected Attendance:**
