Project Description

1. Describe your Project:*

The Jackson County Sheriff's Office is requesting funding to purchase ALPR (Automatic License Plate Recognition) systems for deployment in the unincorporated community of Blue Summit.

The Jackson County Sheriff's Office patrols in five unincorporated patrol districts where the Sheriff's Office is the primary responsible law enforcement agency. The smallest of the five districts is the unincorporated community of Blue Summit, Missouri. Blue Summit is an area of less than one square mile, bordered on the east by the City of Independence, and on the west by Kansas City, Missouri.

Blue Summit is a Census-Designated Place and had a population of 658 as of the 2020 U.S. Census.

Despite containing dramatically less geographic area than any of the Sheriff's Office's other four patrol districts, more than 25% of the violent crimes (as defined by NIBRS) known to the Sheriff's Office and reported to the Missouri State Highway Patrol in 2021 occurred in Blue Summit.

Blue Summit contains portions of Truman Road and 23rd Street Trafficway, two heavily traveled east-west conduits connecting areas of Kansas City and Independence which have been identified by Jackson County's COMBAT Commission as Violent Crime Hotspots.

1.a Explain how this project will assist the reduction and/or prevention of local violent crime:*

The Sheriff's Office proposes placing ALPR systems along roadways in Blue Summit to assist in the apprehension of violent offenders traveling through the area, and to provide an investigative resource to Sheriff's Office and other law enforcement agencies through the collection and sharing of historical ALPR data.

1.b Describe the local violent crime challenges in your area:*

The Jackson County COMBAT Commission identifies Violent Crime Hotspots in Jackson County. COMBAT's "Hotspot D" is an area of 8.8 square miles. Blue Summit is contained within Hotspot D. Within the boundaries of Hotspot D between January 2018 and May 2021, there were 15 homicides or nonnegligent manslaughters, 216 sex offenses, 129 robberies, and 698 aggravated assaults. This Hotspot includes portions of the City of Independence and unincorporated Jackson County. Truman Road and 23rd Street are two of the three primary east-west roadways crossing the hotspot.

COMBAT's "Hotspot C" has an eastern boundary that is less than one mile west of Blue Summit. Within the boundaries of Hotspot C between January 2018 and May 2021, there were 73 homicides or nonnegligent manslaughters, 174 sex offenses, 513 robberies, and 1,233 aggravated assaults. Truman Road and 23rd Street are two of the three primary east-west roadways crossing the hotspot.

When violent crimes occur and offenders leave the scene in a vehicle from within either of

the two hotspots, they can very quickly cross jurisdictional boundaries of three separate law enforcement agencies. This presents a challenge when the agency to which the offense was reported attempts to locate or determine a last known direction of travel for suspect vehicles.

Challenges are also present when suspect vehicles in previous or repeated violent offenses commit offenses in jurisdictions which may be geographically close but separate from jurisdictions where the suspect vehicle otherwise frequently travels.

1.c Describe how the proposed project will help provide solutions to the listed challenges:*

ALPR systems deployed by the Sheriff's Office along the two primary east-west conduits through Blue Summit (Truman Road and 23rd Street Trafficway) could collect license plate information from suspect vehicles traveling the two roadways, which are inside COMBAT's Hotspot D, and would be used two out of three times to travel between Hotspot C and Hotspot D.

ALPR systems could significantly increase law enforcement officers' efficiency in locating and apprehending violent offense suspects traveling in vehicles, and in identifying travel patterns of vehicles newly identified as suspect in violent offenses.

Information from the ALPR systems, both live alerts of identified suspect vehicles, and historic information on previous travel of newly identified suspect vehicles would be available to deputies working in Blue Summit. These deputies have authority to enforce federal, state, and county ordinances in the entirety of the mentioned hotspots, including in unincorporated Jackson County, in Kansas City, and in Independence.

Suspect vehicles leaving either high-violent-crime area surrounding Blue Summit can be quickly outside the primary patrol jurisdiction of the Kansas City or Independence Police Departments. Attempts to locate or canvas areas for violent offense suspect vehicles without hot pursuit may be hampered by jurisdictional boundaries for either municipal police agency but would not be for deputy sheriffs.

Additionally, and perhaps most importantly, both the live and historic information from the ALPR systems would be easily and immediately available to the Kansas City and Independence Police Departments using existing regional ALPR data sharing platforms.

2. What items are you requesting to purchase?*

(4) Motorola Solutions - Vigilant Solutions L6Q Quick-Deploy Automatic License Plate Recognition (ALPR) systems. Each system is capable of scanning two lanes of traffic. Four systems could cover both directions of two four-lane roadways, such as Truman Road and 23rd Street Trafficway.

ALPR systems could significantly increase law enforcement officers' efficiency in locating and apprehending violent offense suspects traveling in vehicles, and in identifying travel patterns of vehicles newly identified as suspect in violent offenses.

L6Q Quick Deploy ALPR systems are ALPR systems designed to be deployed on utility poles, area or street lighting poles. The systems are self-contained, drawing power from batteries and solar chargers, and connecting to network resources using cellular modems. Each system has one camera which is capable of reading license plates from two lanes of traffic.

The L6Q ALPR systems would be deployed in Blue Summit in suitable locations along major travel roadways contained in, crossing through, or connecting identified areas of high violent crime. The ALPR

systems will provide live and historic alerts and information to the Sheriff's Office, and to any law enforcement agency that requests the information or participates in existing ALPR data sharing platforms.

The Jackson County Sheriff's Office will purchase and own the four L6Q ALPR systems, will install them in appropriate locations, and maintain them while they are in use. The systems are not replacements for any current equipment. The Sheriff's Office does not currently own any fixed-location or location-deployable ALPR systems.

The cost for the package was determined using a quote for the package provided by Vigilant Solutions | Motorola Solutions, a State of Missouri approved vendor which currently has a State of Missouri contract to provide ALPR equipment.

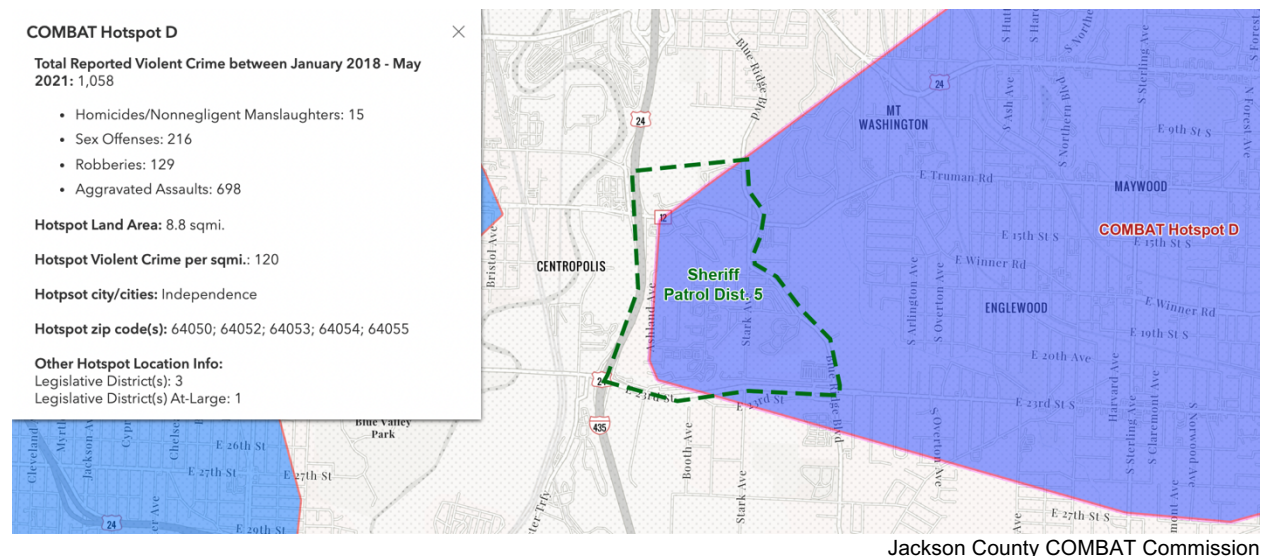

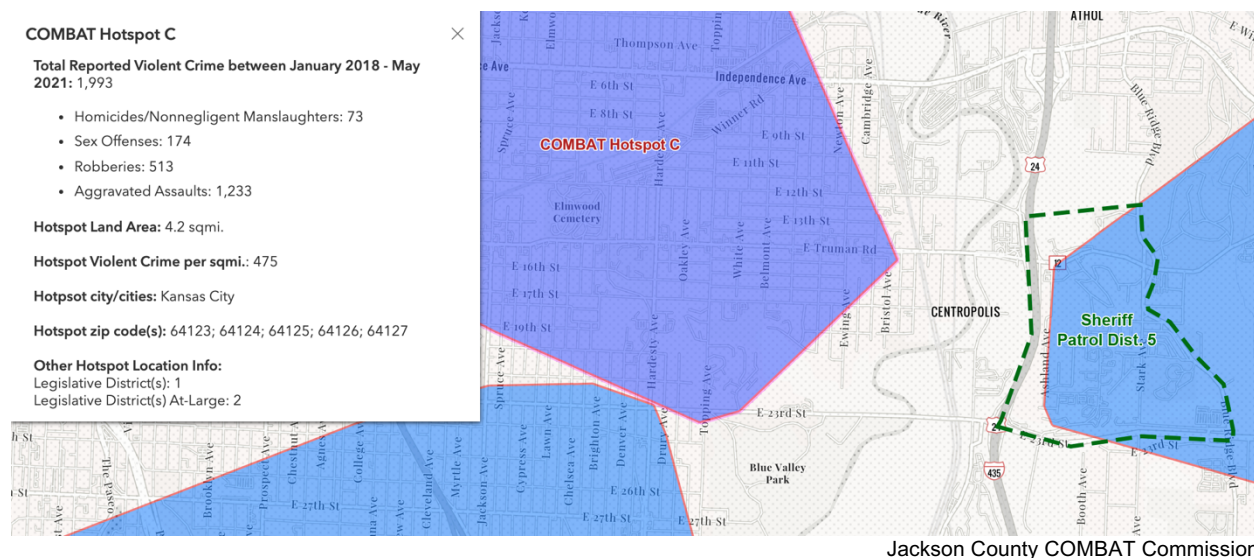

The Annual Average Daily Traffic (AADT) for both directions of Truman Road where it crosses through Blue Summit is 19,651 vehicles. The AADT for both directions of 23rd Street where it crosses through Blue Summit is 19,528. Additional information regarding AADT as reported by the Missouri Department of Transportation is included at the end of this document.

When violent crimes occur and offenders leave the scene in a vehicle from within either of the two hotspots, they can very quickly cross jurisdictional boundaries of three separate law enforcement agencies. This presents a challenge when the agency to which the offense was reported attempts to locate or determine a last known direction of travel for suspect vehicles.

Challenges are also present when suspect vehicles in previous or repeated violent offenses commit offenses in jurisdictions which may be geographically close but separate from jurisdictions where the suspect vehicle otherwise frequently travels.

ALPR systems deployed by the Sheriff's Office along the two primary east-west conduits through Blue Summit (Truman Road and 23rd Street Trafficway) could collect license plate information from suspect vehicles traveling the two roadways, which are inside COMBAT's Hotspot D, and represent two of the three primary east-west travel paths between Hotspot C and Hotspot D.

ALPR systems could significantly increase law enforcement officers' efficiency in locating and apprehending violent offense suspects traveling in vehicles, and in identifying travel patterns of vehicles newly identified as suspect in violent offenses.

Information from the ALPR systems, both live alerts of identified suspect vehicles, and historic information on previous travel of newly identified suspect vehicles would be available to deputies working in Blue Summit. These deputies can cross municipal boundaries during routine patrol and attempt-to-locate activities.

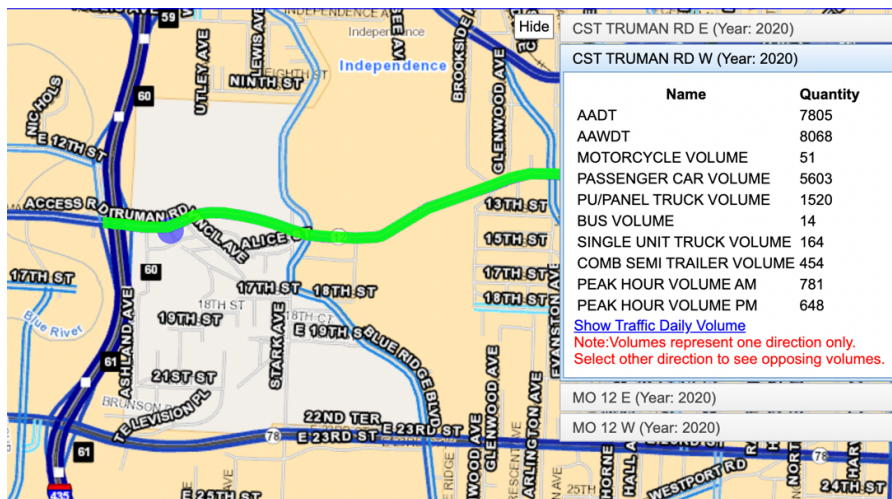
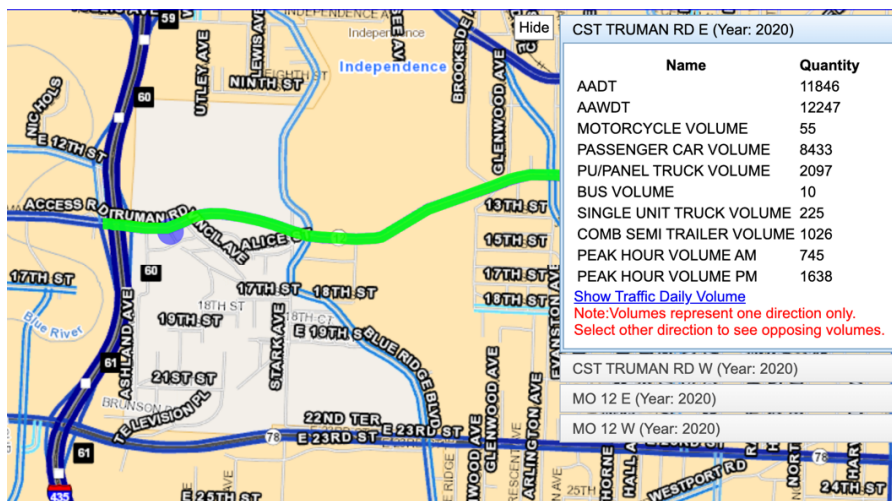
Suspect vehicles leaving either high-violent-crime area surrounding Blue Summit can be quickly outside the primary patrol jurisdiction of the Kansas City or Independence Police Departments. Attempts to locate or canvas areas for violent offense suspect vehicles without hot pursuit may be hampered by jurisdictional boundaries for either municipal police agency but would not be for deputy sheriffs.

Additionally, and perhaps most importantly, both the live and historic information from the ALPR systems would be easily and immediately available to the Kansas City and Independence Police Departments using existing regional ALPR data sharing platforms.

The Sheriff's Office, Independence, and Kansas City Police Departments are all currently operating significantly below authorized staff levels. Call volume has increased for all agencies, leaving less time for law enforcement officers to actively patrol and attempt to locate violent offenders. These challenges, along with limited ability to identify when at-large violent offenders are traveling roadways, in which direction, and how frequently, can enable offenders to remain at large and a danger to the community.

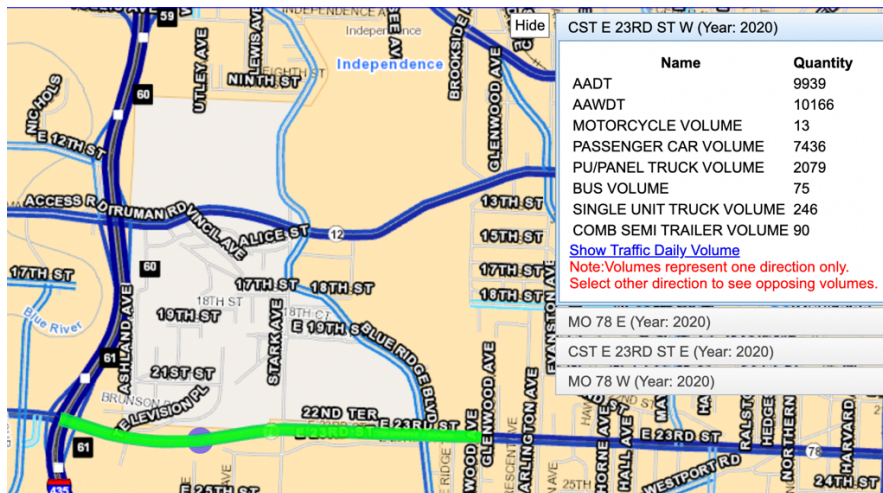
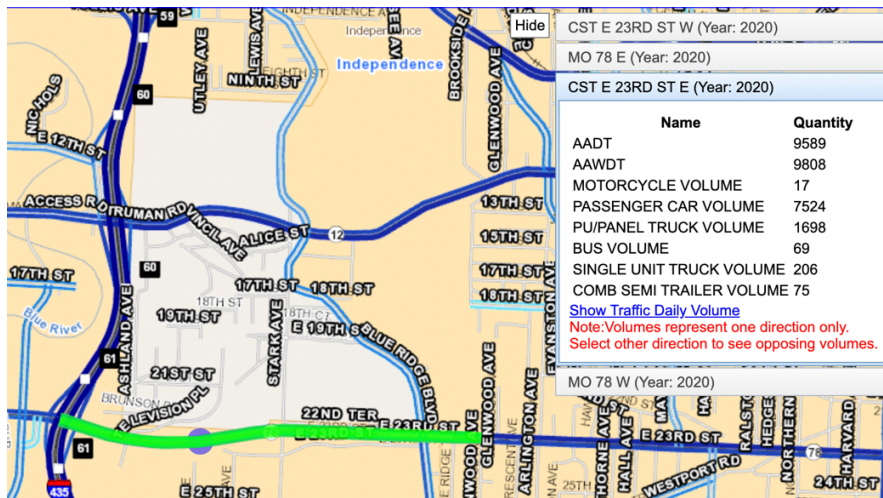
AADT Reports for Truman Road from Missouri Department of Transportation

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Article I - Governing Directives: The Recipient assures that it shall comply, and all its subcontractors as applicable shall comply, with the applicable provisions of the "LVCP Solicitation", the "DPS Financial and Administrative Guide", the "DPS Subrecipient Travel Guidelines", any applicable federal nondiscrimination requirements, which may include the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. § 3789d); the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) of 1984 (42 U.S.C. § 10604(e)); the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act (JJDP) of 2002 (42 U.S.C. § 5672(b)); the Violence Against Women (VAWA) Act of 2013 (42 U.S.C. 13925(b)(13)); Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. § 2000d); Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. § 794); Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. §§ 12131-34); Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (20 U.S.C. §§ 1681, 1683, 1685-86); the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (42 U.S.C. §§ 6101-07); 28 C.F.R. Reg. 51225 (October 1, 2009), the Missouri Department of Public Safety encourages the Recipient to adopt and enforce policies banning employees from text messaging while driving any vehicle during the course of performing work funded by this award, and to establish workplace safety policies and conduct education, awareness, and other outreach to decrease crashes caused by distracted drivers.

Article XII - Computer Networks: The Recipient understands and agrees that funds awarded may be used to maintain or establish a computer network unless such network blocks the viewing, downloading, and exchanging of pornography. Nothing in this provision limits the use of funds necessary for any Federal, State, tribal, or local law enforcement agency or any other entity carrying out criminal investigations, prosecution, adjudication activities, or other law enforcement-or victim assistance-related activity.

Article XIII - Unlawful Employment Practices: The Recipient assures compliance with Section 213.055 RSMo in regards to non-discrimination in employment practices as it relates to race, color, religion, national origin, sex, ancestry, age, or disability.

Article XIV - Discrimination in Public Accommodations: The Recipient assures compliance with Section 213.065 RSMo in regards to non-discrimination in public accommodations as it relates to accommodations, advantages, facilities, services, or privileges made available in place of public accommodations.

Article XV - Fund Availability: The Recipient understands all awards are subject to the availability of appropriated funds and any modifications or additional requirements that may be imposed by law. It is understood and agreed upon that, in the event funds from federal and/or state sources are not appropriated and continued at an aggregate level sufficient to cover the costs under this award, or in the event of a change in federal and/or state law relevant to these costs, the obligations of each party hereunder shall thereupon be terminated immediately upon receipt of written notice.

Article XVI - Release of Funds: The Recipient acknowledges no funds will be disbursed under this award until such time as all required documents are signed by the Recipient Authorized Official and Recipient Project Director and returned to the Missouri Department of Public Safety for final review and signature by the Director or his/her designee.

Article XVII - Duplicative Funding: The Recipient agrees that if it currently has an open award of federal and/or state funds or if it receives an award of federal and/or state funds other than this award, and those award funds have been, are being, or are to be used, in whole or in part, for one or more of the identical cost items for which funds are being provided under this award, the Recipient will promptly notify, in writing, the Missouri Department of Public Safety. If so requested and allowed by the Missouri Department of Public Safety, the Recipient shall submit an award Adjustment for a budget revision or program revision to eliminate any inappropriate duplication of funding.

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Article XVIII - Allowable Costs: The Recipient understands that only allowable and approved expenditures will be reimbursed under this award. These monies may not be utilized to pay debts incurred by other activities. The Recipient agrees to obligate funds no later than the last day of the project period. (Funds are obligated when a legal liability to pay a determinable sum for services or goods is incurred and will require payment during the same or future period.) The Recipient also agrees to expend funds no later than the date identified in the "LVCP NOFO". (Funds are considered to be expended when payment is made.) Any funds not properly obligated and/or expended will lapse. Any deviation from the approved award must have prior approval from the Missouri Department of Public Safety. The Recipient shall fully coordinate all activities in the performance of the project with those of the Missouri Department of Public Safety. Article XIX – Procurement: The Recipient assures that all procurement transactions whether negotiated or competitively bid and without regard to dollar value shall be conducted in a manner to provide maximum open and free competition. In addition, the Recipient assures that all procurement transactions will meet the minimum standards set forth in the "DPS Financial and Administrative Guidelines" and identified here:

- (a) All quotations and the rationale behind the selection of a source of supply shall be retained, attached to the purchase order copy, and placed in the accounting files.
- (b) Purchases to a single vendor totaling less than \$10,000 may be purchased with prudence on the open market.
- (c) Purchases estimated to total between \$10,000 but less than \$100,000 to a single vendor, must be competitively bid, but need not be solicited by mail or advertisement.
- (d) Purchases with an estimated total of \$100,000 or over to a single vendor shall be advertised for bids in at least two daily newspapers of general circulation in such places as are most likely to reach prospective bidders at least five days before bids for such purchases are to be opened.
- (e) Where only one bid or positive proposal is received, it is deemed to be sole source procurement.
- (f) Sole source procurement on purchases to a single vendor of \$10,000 and over requires prior approval from the Missouri Department of Public Safety.

Article XX – Buy American: The Recipient acknowledges Sections 34.350-34.359 RSMo regarding the Missouri Domestic Products Procurement Act (or commonly referred to as the Buy American Act) and the requirement to purchase or lease goods manufactured or produced in the United States, unless exceptions to the Buy American Act mandate in Section 34.353 RSMo are met.

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Article XXI - Buy Missouri: The Recipient also acknowledges Sections 34.070 and 34.073 RSMo regarding the preference given to all commodities and tangible personal property manufactured, mined, produced, or grown within the State of Missouri and to all firms, corporations, or individuals doing business as Missouri firms, corporations, or individuals, or which maintain Missouri offices or places of business, when quality is equal or better and delivered price is the same or less, quality of performance promised is equal or better and the price quoted is the same or less, or when competing bids are comparable.

Article XXII – Compensation: The Recipient understands that federal funds may not be used to pay cash compensation (salary plus bonuses) to any employee of the Recipient at a rate that exceeds 110% of the maximum annual salary payable to a member of the federal government's Senior Executive Service (SES) at an agency with a Certified SES Performance Appraisal System. (The Recipient understands it may compensate an employee at a higher rate, provided the amount in excess of this compensation limitation is paid with non-federal funds.)

Article XXIII – Suspension/Termination of Award: The Missouri Department of Public Safety reserves the right to suspend or terminate any award entered into as a result of this award at its sole discretion and without penalty or recourse by giving written notice to the Recipient of the effective date of suspension or termination. In the event of termination pursuant to this paragraph, all documents, data, and reports prepared by the Recipient under the award shall, at the option of the Missouri Department of Public Safety, become property of the State of Missouri.

In the event an award is suspended or permanently terminated, the Missouri Department of Public Safety may take action as deemed appropriate to recover any portion of the award funds remaining or an amount equal to the portion of the award funds wrongfully used.

Article XXIV – Enforceability: If a Recipient fails to comply with all applicable federal and/or state requirements governing these funds, the State of Missouri may withhold or suspend, in whole or in part, funds awarded under the award, or recover misspent funds following an audit. This provision is in addition to all other remedies provided to the State of Missouri for recovery of misspent funds available under all applicable state and federal laws.

Article XXV – National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS), formerly Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR): The recipient assures, where the project agency is a law enforcement agency, its law enforcement agency is in compliance with the state provisions of Section 43.505 RSMo which states each law enforcement agency is required to submit crime incident reports to the department of public safety on forms or in the format prescribed by the department, and submit any other crime incident information which may be required by the department of public safety.

Article XXVI – Vehicle Stops: The Recipient assures, where the project agency is a law enforcement agency, its law enforcement agency is in compliance with the state provisions of Section 590.650 RSMo relating to vehicle stop reporting and will remain in full compliance for the duration of the project period.

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Article XXVII – Police Use of Force Transparency Act of 2021: The recipient assures, where the project agency is a law enforcement agency, its law enforcement agency is in compliance with the state provisions of Section 590.1268 RSMo relating to use of force incidents reporting standards and procedures, and publication of report data, analysis report.

Article XXVIII - Federal Equitable Sharing Funds: The Recipient assures, where the project agency is a law enforcement agency, its law enforcement agency is in compliance with the state provisions of Section 513.653 RSMo relating to participation in the federal forfeiture system and the reporting of proceeds therefrom to the Missouri State Auditor.

Article XXIX - Custodial Interrogations: The Recipient assures, where the project agency is a law enforcement agency, its law enforcement agency is in compliance with the state provisions of Section 590.700 RSMo relating to custodial interrogations and has adopted a written policy to record custodial interrogations of persons suspected of committing or attempting to commit the felony crimes described in subsection 2 of this section.

Article XXX - DWI Law – Law Enforcement: The Recipient assures, where the project agency is a law enforcement agency, its law enforcement agency is in compliance with the state provisions of Section 43.544 RSMo relating to the "DWI Law" and has adopted a written policy to forward arrest information for all intoxication-related traffic offenses to the central repository as required by Section 43.503 RSMo.

Article XXXI - DWI Law – Prosecutors: The Recipient assures, where the project agency is a county prosecutor's office or municipal prosecutor's office, its county prosecutor's office or municipal prosecutor's office is in compliance with Section 43.544 RSMo relating to the "DWI Law" and has adopted a written policy to forward all charge information for intoxication-related traffic offenses to the central repository as required by Section 43.503 RSMo.

Article XXXII - Data Reporting Requirements: The recipient agrees to complete and submit any data or statistical reports required for this program as outlined in the "OSET Notice of Funding Opportunity". Failure to submit reports by the deadline dates may result in delay for reimbursement requests and/or cancellation of the award.

Article XXXIII - Body Armor: The Recipient understands, if monies are requested and awarded for the purchase of body armor, that JAG funds may be used to purchase body armor but may not be used as the 50% match for purposes of BJA's Bulletproof Vest Partnership (BVP) Program. Further, the Recipient understands that body armor purchased with JAG funds may be purchased at any threat level, designation, make, or model from any distributor or manufacturer, as long as the body armor has been tested and found to comply with the latest applicable National Institute of Justice (NIJ) ballistic or stab standards. Further, body armor or armor vests must also be "uniquely fitted vests". In addition, body armor purchased with JAG funds must be made in the United States.

Article XXXIV - Body Armor Policy: The Recipient understands, if monies are requested and awarded for the purchase of body armor, that the law enforcement agency must have a written "mandatory wear" policy in effect. Per the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA), there are no requirements regarding the nature of the policy other than it being a mandatory wear policy for all uniformed officers while on duty.

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The Recipient will be required to forward a copy of such policy to the Missouri Department of Public Safety at the time of acceptance of the award.

Article XXXV - Body-Worn Cameras: The Recipient understands, if monies are requested and awarded for the purchase of body-worn cameras, that JAG funds may be used to purchase body-worn cameras but may not be used as the 50% match for purposes of BJA's Body-Worn Camera Policy and Implementation Program (BWC Program).

Article XXXVI - Body-Worn Camera Policy: The Recipient understands, if monies are requested and awarded for the purchase of body-worn cameras, the law enforcement agency must have written policies and procedures in place related to equipment usage, data storage and access, privacy considerations, training, etc. [The Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) Body-Worn Camera (BWC) Toolkit, which can be found online at <https://bja.ojp.gov/program/body-worn-cameras-bwcs/overview>, provides model BWC policies and best practices to assist departments in implementing BWC programs.] **The Recipient will be required to forward a copy of such policy(s) to the Missouri Department of Public Safety at the time of acceptance of the award.**

Article XXXVII - Criminal Intelligence Systems: The Recipient agrees that any information technology system funded or supported by OJP funds will comply with 28 C.F.R. Part 23, Criminal Intelligence Systems Operating Policies, if OJP determines this regulation to be applicable. Should OJP determine 28 C.F.R. Part 23 to be applicable, OJP may, at its discretion, perform audits of the system, as per the regulation.

Article XXXVIII – Duplication of Networks: The Recipient assures that all equipment/software requested and purchased under this award must be compatible with the statewide system. All software, if applicable, must be compatible with the statewide criminal records system. All communication devices, if applicable, must be capable of operating in accordance with the guidelines established by the Missouri Homeland Security Advisory Council.

Article XL - Mitigation Plan: The Recipient agrees to fully comply with the Missouri Department of Public Safety's *Mitigation Plan for Clandestine Methamphetamine Laboratory Enforcement Operations*, where such grant-funded project is for a drug task force. No monies from this award may be obligated to support methamphetamine lab operations unless the Recipient agrees to this special condition and fully participates in implementation of the *Mitigation Plan*.

Article XXXIX - Criminal Justice/Law Enforcement Unit (CJ/LE), Specific:

By accepting this award, the Recipient agrees:

1. To participate in Status Report submissions, if applicable.
 - Status Report #1 and Final Claim for the period February 1, 2022 – May 30, 2022, due by June 15, 2022
2. Equipment means tangible personal property (including information technology systems) having a useful life of more than one year and a per-unit acquisition cost, which equals or

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exceeds the lesser of the capitalization level established by the non-federal entity for financial statement purposes, or \$1,000. Expenditures for equipment shall be in accordance with the approved budget. The Recipient shall use and manage equipment in accordance with its procedures as long as the equipment is used for its intended purposes. When original or replacement equipment acquired under this award is no longer needed for the original project or program or for other activities currently or previously supported by the Department of Public Safety, you must request instructions from DPS to make proper disposition of the equipment following the DPS Administrative Guide.

3. Expenditures for equipment and supplies and operating expenses shall be in accordance with the approved budget and documentation in the form of paid bills and vouchers shall support each expenditure. Care shall be given to assure that all items purchased directly relate to the specific project objectives for which the contract was approved.
4. DPS reserves the right to terminate any contract entered into as a result of this grant award at its sole discretion and without penalty or recourse by giving a thirty (30) day written notice to the Recipient of the effective date of termination. In the event of termination pursuant to this paragraph, all documents, data, and reports prepared by the Recipient under the contract shall, at the option of the DPS, become property of the State of Missouri. The Recipient shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for that work completed prior to the effective date of termination.
5. It is understood and agreed upon that in the event funds from state and/or federal sources are not appropriated and continued at an aggregate level sufficient to cover the contract costs, or in the event of a change in federal or state laws relevant to these costs, the obligations of each party hereunder shall thereupon be terminated immediately upon receipt of written notice.
6. To follow the grant program guidelines as stated in the DPS Administrative Guide for CJ/LE Grants, as well as, Information Bulletins released by the CJ/LE Unit to provide important updates, clarifications and policy statements related to the Criminal Justice/law Enforcement Unit grant programs.
7.
