COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT FOR DESIGN SERVICES TO RESTORE JACKSON COUNTY LONGVIEW TRAIL IMPACTED BY REPLACEMENT OF RAYTOWN ROAD DOUBLE-PIPE CULVERTS

This Cooperative Agreement is made as of May 2022, between Jackson County, Missouri (the "County"), and the City of Grandview, Missouri (the "City").

Recitals

- A. Heavy rainfall over the years has caused erosion and settlement of a double-pipe culvert under Raytown Road and the Longview Trail.
- **B.** The City retained Alfred Benesch & Company ("Benesch") to design replacement of the failed culverts.
- C. Benesch recommended that bridge structures be built on Raytown Road to replace the existing culverts that will impact and require the placement of a new bicycle and pedestrian trail bridge crossing over the area where the existing culverts will be removed. (the "Project").
- **D.** In order to avoid delay of the Project and to eliminate coordination conflicts, the City and County have agreed to include design of the County's new pedestrian bridge in the overall design services for the Project.
- **E.** County agrees that Benesch, the City's design consultant for the City's Project, is the appropriate design firm for design services for the new pedestrian bridge.
- **F.** County agrees to make payment to City in advance for overseeing design work for the new pedestrian bridge.
- **G.** An amendment to this Cooperative Agreement will be negotiated in the future if County approves a bid for construction of the Project procured by the City, including an alternate bid for the new pedestrian bridge. The amendment is necessary to cover the cost of construction and inspections of the new pedestrian bridge, which will be paid by the County to the City before construction begins.

Therefore, the parties agree as follows:

A. Design and construction of replacement Raytown Road pedestrian bridge.

Construction of the new pedestrian bridge adjacent to Raytown Road will be included in the City's Project as an alternate bid. The County is responsible for the cost of the design of the new pedestrian bridge and will be responsible for the cost of construction if the alternate bid is acceptable.

i. Obligations of County. County agrees to:

Expend only local dollars in the Project including the funds to be remitted to the City or used to pay the contractor. In no event shall federal funds received by the County be used for this project.

Remit to City, upon approval of this Cooperative Agreement by County Executive, the sum of Twenty Thousand Six Hundred and Twenty-One Dollars (\$20,621.00) for design of the new pedestrian bridge near Raytown Road; provided however that if City fails to fulfill its obligations as set forth in this Cooperative Agreement, County shall be entitled to withhold in full, or recover in full if already remitted to City, County's contribution.

Remit design criteria to City for the new pedestrian bridge in a timely manner and in general accordance with the adopted Project design schedule.

Review and approve plans and specifications submitted by City in a timely manner and in general accordance with the adopted Project design schedule.

Negotiate an amendment to this Cooperative Agreement with City, upon acceptance of the alternate bid for the new pedestrian bridge, for the sum necessary to cover the cost of construction and inspections of the new pedestrian bridge.

If the alternate bid is unacceptable, the County would have the right to re-bid the new pedestrian bridge construction as a separate project utilizing the design produced by Benesch.

Comply with all other requirements applicable to County as set forth in this Cooperative Agreement.

ii. Obligations of City. City agrees to:

Accept the sum of Twenty Thousand Six Hundred and Twenty-One Dollars (\$20,621.00) from County and maintain the same intact to be spent exclusively on the design of the new pedestrian bridge set forth in this Cooperative Agreement and none others.

Exercise general supervision over the design of the new pedestrian bridge. The design year shall be 2022.

Ensure that all plans, drawings, and specifications for the new pedestrian bridge conform to County's standards for structures, subject to County's right to issue variances to these standards as it deems necessary.

Provide to County the new pedestrian bridge plans and specifications at key milestones for County's review, comments and final approval. Ensure final

approval is received from County prior to advertisement for the Project. Deliverable plans and specifications will include Preliminary plans, Final Plans and Project Manual (technical specifications) for the Project.

Bid the City's Project through the City's standard bidding procedures, anticipated for 2022, with the costs for the construction of the new pedestrian bridge as an alternate bid on the City's bid form, which will ensure costs to construct the new pedestrian bridge are evident.

Negotiate an amendment to this Cooperative Agreement with County, upon acceptance of alternate bid for new pedestrian bridge, for the sum necessary to cover the cost of construction and inspections of the new pedestrian bridge.

Provide to County an accounting sufficient to satisfy County that the funds contributed by County herein were spent in accordance with the terms of this Cooperative Agreement and provide such additional supporting documentation as may be required by County to establish City's compliance with all other terms and conditions of this Cooperative Agreement.

Comply with all other requirements applicable to City as set forth in this Cooperative Agreement.

- B. Execution Documents. This Cooperative Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original and all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one agreement.
- C. Authority. This Cooperative Agreement is entered into by the parties pursuant to the authority set forth in Article VI, Section 16 of the Missouri Constitution and RSMo §70.210 et. seq.

ORDINANCE NO. 7383

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT WITH JACKSON COUNTY FOR DESIGN SERVICES TO REPLACE THE COUNTY'S PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE AS PART OF THE RAYTOWN ROAD CULVERT REPLACEMENT.

WHEREAS, heavy rainfall caused erosion and settlement of a double-pipe culvert under Raytown Road; and

WHEREAS, the City of Grandview, Missouri ("City"), retained Alfred Benesch & Company ("Benesch") to design replacement of the failed double-pipe culverts; and

WHEREAS, Benesch recommended that bridge structures be built to replace the existing culvert pipes (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the trail around Longview Lake maintained and operated by Jackson County, Missouri ("County") is located on top of the double-pipe; and

WHEREAS, the Project will impact and require replacement of the County's pedestrian bridge crossing over the culverts; and

WHEREAS, the City and the County agree that a new pedestrian bridge structure will be required to accommodate the trail and have negotiated a Cooperative Agreement in the form attached as Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, under the Cooperative Agreement, the County will reimburse the City for its costs incurred to add design services for the pedestrian bridge structure to the existing Agreement with Benesch; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen of the City deems it to be in the City's best interest to approve the Cooperative Agreement with Jackson County, Missouri.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF GRANDVIEW, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Cooperative Agreement Approved. The Mayor, City Administrator and other City Officials as may be required are hereby authorized and directed to execute the Cooperative Agreement with Jackson County, Missouri, attached as Exhibit "A" for design of a pedestrian bridge structure to be located adjacent to the roadway bridge planned to replace the double-pipe culvert under Raytown Road.

<u>Section 2. Effective Date.</u> This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage by the Board of Aldermen and execution by the Mayor.
