Dan Tarwater III, Vice Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

2 THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Jalen Anderson, seconded by Scott Burnett to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on July 29, 2019. The motion passed by a voice vote.

4 HEARINGS

Jaime Masters, Chief of Health Services, gave an update regarding the Medical Examiner's office at the request of Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator. Dr. Marius Tarau, Chief Medical Examiner was also present.

Ms. Masters said she has an ordinance prepared by the County
Counselor's office to be introduced on Monday, August 12 to adjust the
salary for the pathologist, per Schedule 2 of the Jackson County Code.
She said they reached a salary agreement for Dr. Tarau and Dr. Lindsey
Haldiman, Deputy Chief Medical Examiner. She said they have funding
necessary to support the increase through the end of 2019. Once the
salary range is approved, she will prepare a Request for Legislative Action
(RLA) for the contracts for Dr. Tarau and Dr. Haldiman. She said they
posted the vacant pathologist position and will update it with the new salary
range once it is approved by the County Legislature. Currently, Jackson
County has an agreement with two contract doctors to provide some relief
to Dr. Tarau and Dr. Haldiman as needed, primarily weekend support.

The RLA approved only provides for 15 days so she is watching to see if they will need more time and if funds are available to support it. She said Contract Forensic Pathologist (LOCUMS) may request up to an additional \$2500, in addition to what we are currently paying, for pretrial preparation and court appearance so Dr. Tarau and Dr. Haldiman have agreed to cover testimony for them. Ms. Masters said Ronald E. Finley also requested an organizational chart for the Medical Examiner's office and Tom Hensley, Chief of Forensic Operations, distributed them to the members of the County Legislature.

Ronald E. Finley thanked Jaime Masters for her responsiveness. He encouraged legislators to review the report received on May 14 regarding the Medical Examiner's office and various other duties of the Medical Examiner and to consider it when preparing the 2020 budget.

10 INTRODUCTION OF PROPOSED ORDINANCES AND ASSIGNMENT TO COMMITTEE

Renewing the tax of 6.00% of the tariff rate, for each local telephone access line, not to exceed 100 lines per person or per location, for emergency telephone service utilizing a single three-digit number "911."

Jay Haden, Deputy County Counselor, said a representative from MARC will appear before the County Legislature to speak to this issue. He also said he will check to see if this legislation requires a public hearing.

14 NEW BUSINESS

Jalen Anderson, County Legislator, asked the Administration if they would set up a time to go over with the County Legislature the intended plan of action regarding salaries after Evergreen completes the salary study.

Frank White Jr., County Executive, agreed to schedule a meeting with the County Legislature.

Dan Tarwater III asked about the Rock Island Corridor.

Jay Haden replied that they had a productive meeting today with counsel and representatives of Union Pacific. He recommended a closed session to discuss this issue. Dan Tarwater III asked Mr. Haden to notice up a closed session for next Monday, August 12, 2019.

Dan Tarwater III asked about the professional service contracts for appraisers used by the Assessment Department. He asked if the County Legislature could get copies of the reports due from the appraisers.

Ed Stoll, Chief Administrative Officer, said the Administration would provide copies of the appraisers reports to the County Legislature.

Dan Tarwater III asked why the Administration used appraisers from St. Louis. He asked why local appraisers were not used since they would be more familiar with the area and neighborhoods.

Ed Stoll said it was his understanding that there were three contracts; two with St. Louis appraisers and one with a Kansas City appraiser. He explained that local companies had potential conflicts of interest.

Ronald E. Finley said he sent a question to the County Counselor's office about the process for setting the tax levy rates and sending out the tax bills, since the deadline for appeals has been extended to September 3, 2019 due to the volume of appeals.

Jay Haden said he replied to Mr. Finley's email. He said Missouri State statute sets the deadline for setting tax levy rates in a charter county as October 1, 2019. He said there will be pending cases before the Board of Equalization when the levies are set.

Ed Stoll said the timing for setting the tax levy and sending out tax bills is not expected to be any different than in past years.

Dan Tarwater III explained that tax bills will still be due December 31, 2019. If

a taxpayer's appeal has not been heard by the due date, the taxpayer can pay under protest. If the taxpayer does not pay the bill by the deadline, penalties and interest will incur on January 1, 2020.

Ronald E. Finley appreciated the response regarding what we need to do for the Board of Equalization with the introduction of the two Ordinances and one Resolution today. He thanked Jay Haden for responding to his email.

Dan Tarwater III said in reference to his request for a copy of the report to the county that provided adequate information to support values from the six appraisal firms from St. Louis, he believes the reports should have been received by now because the dates covered by the report were March 22, 2019 through June 30, 2019.

Ed Stoll said he would send the reports that have been received to date.

Jalen Anderson said last weekend he attended a conference with young elected officials across the country. Students and parents of victims from the Parkland shooting in Florida were present at the same time shootings occurred in El Paso and Dayton. He urged his colleagues and the County Executive to be bold in their effort to stop gun violence. He said they must stand up, be vigilant, get studies and combat this issue. He said this is more than a health crisis, it is a people crisis. He encouraged everyone to remember the victims especially the woman who died in the Crossroads this past weekend in Kansas City, Missouri.
