

COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

COMBAT Drug Prevention

(January 1, 2012, through December 31, 2012)

AN AGREEMENT by and between **Jackson County, Missouri**, a Constitutional Home Rule Charter County, hereinafter referred to as "the County," and **Ad Hoc Group Against Crime, 3116 Prospect Ave, Kansas City, MO 64128**, (a Missouri not-for-profit corporation), hereinafter referred to as "**Organization**."

WHEREAS, the voters in Jackson County approved and renewed a quarter cent sales tax for the purpose of providing revenue to combat illicit drug use in our community; and,

WHEREAS, the voters and the Jackson County Legislature authorized the County Executive to contract with qualified not-for-profit community organizations, whether public or private, for the purpose of preventing drug use and drug related offenses or violence, if such organization has been in existence for a period of not less than two (2) years; and,

WHEREAS, **Organization** has been in existence for more than two (2) years and proposes to provide services to prevent illegal drug use, drug-related offenses and/or violence; and,

WHEREAS, COMBAT Administration has carefully reviewed the **Organization's** proposal for 2012 funding; and,

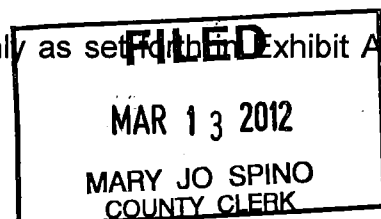
WHEREAS, the Jackson County Legislature has recommended the expenditure of **\$25,000.00** of COMBAT Anti-Drug Sales Tax funds (hereinafter referred to as "COMBAT funds") for **Organization** to assist in the prevention of drug use, drug related offenses or violence;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the terms and provisions herein contained, the County and **Organization** respectively promise, covenant, and agree with each other as follows:

I. **SERVICES**

Organization shall use COMBAT funds solely for the purpose of providing prevention activities to prevent illegal drug use, drug related offenses, or violence for Jackson County; and,

Organization has agreed to use COMBAT funds only as set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto; and,



Organization shall administer the program as outlined on the application's Program Logic Model. Any changes to the **Organization's** program as funded by COMBAT, must receive written approval from the County before implementing any changes from their submitted proposal.

II. PAYMENT

The County agrees to pay to the **Organization** a total amount not to exceed **\$25,000.00**. Upon execution of this contract, an advance payment equal to one-quarter of the contract amount, totaling **\$6,250.00** will be submitted to **Organization**. This award is contingent upon collection of sales taxes as budgeted at the time of the contract award. If COMBAT funds are reduced, contractor will be informed of necessary contract revisions, as provided for in this Agreement.

Organization understands that the failure to execute this Agreement by March 31, 2012, shall disqualify **Organization** from funding under this Agreement. Additionally, **Organization** understands that no payment shall be made under this Agreement until **Organization's** 2011 COMBAT contract has been fully reconciled.

Organization agrees to submit a monthly expense report on forms provided by COMBAT Administration by the 20th of the following month. All payments will be processed within 30 days of receipt of invoice, if the invoice is complete and accurate. Any reports that are incorrect will delay payment. The remaining contract amount will be paid in a monthly amount equal to:

- (1) 1/12th of the 2012 contract amount or
- (2) Expenses year to date, whichever is the lesser of the two.

Organization agrees to submit quarterly program reports and an Annual Report on forms provided by COMBAT Administration by the 20th of the month following the quarter's end. All April, August, and October payments will be detained until quarterly program reports are received and accurate.

The County reserves the right to audit all invoices and to reject any invoice for good cause. The County retains the right to deduct from an invoice of **Organization** any overpayment made by the County on a prior invoices. The County retains the right to make invoice corrections/changes. The County will not reimburse sales tax expense.

The final payment will not be processed until the agency's annual program report has been completely reconciled.

III. PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

All COMBAT Prevention funded programs must adhere to the following:

1. **Organization** must maintain a complete program expense file that reconciles to the invoices submitted to the COMBAT Administration.
2. **Organization** must operate an evidence-based or research-based drug, under-aged alcohol-consumption, and/or violence prevention program which focuses on risk and protective factors recognized and supported by prevention research and scientific theory.
3. **Organization** must be chartered in the State of Missouri and have received an exemption from Federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and must provide such documentation to COMBAT Administration.
4. **Organization** must have been in existence for two years prior to proposal submission (Statement of Contractor's Qualifications).
5. **Organization** must notify COMBAT Administration in writing on **Organization** letterhead, within five working days of the following changes:
 - a. **Organization** name, address, telephone number, administration, or board of directors
 - b. **Organization** funding that will affect the program under this contract
 - c. Liability insurance coverage
 - d. Management or staff responsible for providing services pursuant to this contract
 - e. Any proposed or actual merger or acquisition either taken by the **Organization** or towards the **Organization**
 - f. Changes to program and/or services, and the program's Logic Model and Outcome Measurement Framework chart.
6. **Organization** must submit monthly invoices and narratives on program activities

If this outline is not met during Year One, COMBAT Administration will not recommend continued funding for the following year.

IV. ANNUAL REPORT/OTHER DOCUMENTATION

Organization shall submit annual program reports and other documentation directly related to this Agreement as requested by the County's Director of Finance and Purchasing, or by such other manager as designated in writing by the County Executive, to show that funds paid to **Organization** by the County were used for the purpose set forth in this Agreement.

The **Organization** program annual report for 2011 shall be submitted no later than January 20, 2012.

V. EVALUATION REQUIREMENTS

Organization agrees that evaluative outcomes shall be given priority status. COMBAT Administration or its designee will monitor the **Organization** to assure that not only are the terms of this Agreement being fulfilled, but also to monitor the prevention program's impact on the community. The **Organization** agrees to participate in an effectiveness evaluation of the **Organization's** program objectives and an overall evaluation of specific core items, as required by COMBAT Administration. **Organization** further agrees to utilize an agency specific evaluation document. **Organization** agrees to participate in and respond to periodic COMBAT Administration evaluations, assessments, and data inquiries.

The COMBAT Administration will evaluate **Organization's** performance periodically based on the **Organization's** quarterly performance reports and compliance with contractual provisions. The County reserves the right to terminate this Agreement pursuant to paragraph 18 if the **Organization** does not meet stated performance measures and contractual requirements.

VI. AUDIT

The County reserves the right to examine and audit the books and records of **Organization** pertaining to the finances and operations of **Organization** related to this Agreement. **Organization** agrees to establish and adopt accounting standards and forms for this program as may be recommended by the County's Financial Advisor prior to receipt of the County's first distribution of funds under the terms of this Agreement. The forms used to document the expenditure of these funds may be changed from time to time upon mutual agreement.

VII. DEFAULT

If **Organization** shall default in the performance or observation of any term or condition herein, the County shall give **Organization** ten (10) days' written notice setting forth the default. If said default shall continue for ten (10) days after **Organization** receives written notice thereof, the County may at its election terminate the Agreement and withhold any payments not yet made to **Organization**. Said election shall not in any way limit the County's right to sue for breach of contract.

VIII. SUBMISSION OF DOCUMENTS

No payment shall be made under this contract unless the **Organization** has submitted to COMBAT (1) a written proposal setting out in detail the intended use of the County's funding, including the target population to be served; (2) a statement of the **Organization's** total budget for this program for its most recent fiscal year; and, (3) a detailed explanation of actual expenditures of COUNTY funds (pertains to final payments and payments on contracts for future years.) Any document described herein which was submitted to COMBAT, as a part of an application for funding need not be resubmitted to qualify for payment. No payment

shall be made if the contract agency is out of compliance on any other County contract.

IX. **INDEMNIFICATION**

Organization shall indemnify, defend, and hold the County harmless from any and all claims, liabilities, damages, and costs (including reasonable attorney's fees directly related thereto) to the extent caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of **Organization** or its employees, agents or representatives.

X. **INSURANCE**

Organization shall maintain the following insurance coverage during the term of this Agreement.

A. **Organization** shall maintain Commercial General Bodily Injury and Property Damage Liability insurance, each in a combined single limit of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) each occurrence for bodily injury and property damage liability. **Organization** agrees to name the County as Additional Insured on such policies, but only to the extent of **Organization's** negligence under this Agreement and only to the extent of the insurance limits specified herein.

B. **Organization** shall maintain, if any motor vehicles are used in the performance of the Services, Commercial General Bodily Injury and Property Damage Liability insurance, and Automobile Liability insurance including owned, non-owned, or hired vehicles, each in a combined single limit of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) each occurrence for bodily injury and property damage liability. **Organization** agrees to name the County as Additional Insured on such policies, but only to the extent of **Organization's** negligence under this Agreement and only to the extent of the insurance limits specified herein.

C. **Organization** agrees to provide the County with certificates of insurance evidencing the above described coverage prior to the start of Services, and annually thereafter, if required by the County. Such certificates shall provide that the applicable insurance policies have been endorsed to provide a minimum of thirty days advance notice to the County in the event of cancellation, non-renewal, or reduction in limits by endorsement.

XI. **STANDARD OF CARE**

Organization shall exercise the same degree of care, skill, and diligence in the performance of the Services as is ordinarily possessed and exercised by professionals operating under similar circumstances.

XII. **TERM**

The term of this Agreement shall commence as of January 1, 2012, and will continue until December 31, 2012, unless sooner terminated pursuant to paragraph 7, 18, or 26 hereof.

XIII. NO REPLACEMENT REVENUE

It being recognized by the parties that the purpose of the COMBAT funds is to improve the quality and effectiveness of drug prevention services in Jackson County, it is therefore declared as the express intent of the parties that the services to be rendered hereunder shall be in addition to those deemed necessary and required to maintain the efficient and effective operation of **Organization** in its normal duties.

XIV. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Organization warrants that no officer or employee of the County, whether elected or appointed, shall in any manner whatsoever be interested in or receive any benefit from the profits or emoluments of this Agreement.

XV. FINANCIAL CONTACT

Organization shall designate a fiscal representative to act as a liaison between the parties to resolve any problems, complaints, or special circumstances encountered in the billing of the services agreed upon here.

XVI. INFORMATIONAL REPORTING

A designated representative of **Organization** shall attend meetings of the County Legislature and COMBAT Administration activities when so requested by either entity.

XVII. PUBLICITY

If **Organization** receives or obtains any media attention because of this project, **Organization** is required to acknowledge that funding for the project is from COMBAT funds. Printed material involving this program shall contain the COMBAT logo and a COMBAT sign shall be posted at the program site(s) for the duration of the contract.

XVIII. TERMINATION

This Agreement may be terminated for any reason or no reason by either of the parties upon thirty (30) days written notice to the party's designated fiscal representative. All services and payments shall continue through the effective date of termination. Termination of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of the rights or obligations which the County or **Organization** may be entitled to receive as provided in this Agreement, or be obligated to perform under this Agreement for services prior to the date of termination. Should this Agreement terminate, all County written materials of any kind must be delivered and returned by **Organization** to the County within ten (10) days of the termination of this Agreement.

XIX. UNSPENT ALLOCATION

Any appropriated funds under this Agreement not invoiced by **Organization** within 45 days from the expiration of this Agreement shall not be paid but shall remain in the COMBAT funds. These funds shall be subject to reappropriation. Such funds refer only to those funds that have not been committed for costs or purchases by purchase order, contract or other formal documentation.

XX. MINORITY HIRING

Organization shall have a twenty percent (20%) goal for minority hiring and employment regarding all positions funded out of the proceeds of COMBAT funds.

XXI. APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS

Organization and the County recognize that the County intends to satisfy its financial obligation to **Organization** hereunder out of funds annually appropriated for that purpose by the County. County promises and covenants to make its best efforts to appropriate funds in accordance with this Agreement. In the event no funds or insufficient funds are appropriated and budgeted, or are otherwise unavailable by any means whatsoever for payments due hereunder, County shall immediately notify **Organization** of this occurrence and this Agreement shall terminate on the last day for which appropriations were received, without penalty or expense to the County of any kind whatsoever, except as to the portions of the payment amounts herein agreed upon for which funds shall have been appropriated and budgeted or are otherwise available, or at any time after the last date that County has paid for the Services, if earlier.

County further agrees:

- A. That any funds authorized or appropriated for services rendered under this Agreement shall be applied to the payments hereunder until all such funds are exhausted.
- B. That County will use its best efforts to obtain authorization and appropriation of such funds including, without limitation, the inclusion in its annual budget, a request for adequate funds to meet its obligation under this Agreement in full.

XXII. **EQUAL OPPORTUNITY EMPLOYMENT**

Organization shall maintain policies of employment as follows:

A. **Organization** and **Organization's** subcontractor(s) shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, age, disability or national origin. **Organization** shall take affirmative action as set forth to ensure that applicants are employed and employees are treated without regard to their race, religion, color, sex, age, disability, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited, to the following; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. **Organization** agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the policies of non-discrimination.

B. **Organization** and **Organization's** subcontractor(s) shall, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by them or on their behalf, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, religion, color, sex, age, disability, or national origin.

XXIII. **EMPLOYMENT OF UNAUTHORIZED ALIENS PROHIBITED**

Pursuant to §285.530.1, RSMo, **Organization** assures that it does not knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien to perform work within the State of Missouri and/or Jackson County, and shall affirm, by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation, its enrollment and participation in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees working in connection with the contracted services. Further, **Organization** shall sign an affidavit, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit C, affirming that it does not knowingly employ any person who is an unauthorized alien in connection with the contracted services.

XXIV. **INSPECTIONS OR AUDITS BY THE COUNTY**

The performance of this Agreement shall be subject to review by the County. The County Compliance Review Officer shall review this contract according to their responsibilities as set out in Chapter 6 of the Jackson County Code. **Organization** shall file quarterly program specific compliance reports as required by the County Compliance Review Office. The County may provide to **Organization** a list identifying specific areas funded by COMBAT funds which are to be inspected or audited by the County, and the definition and scope of a review audit of each specific area identified.

Organization shall conduct internal audits of each specific area identified relative to the program and shall provide its findings to the County and/or COMBAT Administration. If the County and/or COMBAT Administration desire additional

study, after the in-house audit provided above, the County and/or COMBAT Administration and **Organization** shall engage a mutually agreed upon outside auditing firm to conduct further audit of each specific area identified, and shall share the costs of the outside auditor equally. The County warrants that all books, records, accounts, and any other documents in the possession of the County relative to COMBAT funds are public records open for inspection in accordance with Chapter 610, RSMo.

XXV. REMEDIES FOR BREACH

Organization promises, covenants and agrees to faithfully observe and perform all of the terms, provisions and requirements of this Agreement, and **Organization's** failure to so observe and perform in accordance with said Agreement represents and constitutes a breach of this Agreement. In such event, **Organization** consents and agrees as follows:

A. The County may without prior notice to **Organization** immediately terminate this Agreement; and,

B. In addition to the foregoing, the County shall be entitled to collect from **Organization** all payments made by the County for which **Organization** has not yet rendered services in accordance with this Agreement, and may also be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees, court costs and other expenses if it is necessary to bring legal action to recover such amount.

XXVI. SEVERABILITY

If any term of this Agreement is invalid, or incapable of being enforced by reasons of any rule of law or public policy, all other conditions and provisions of this Agreement shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect and no covenant or provision shall be deemed dependent upon any other covenant or provision unless so expressed herein.

XXVII. ASSIGNMENT AND TRANSFER

Organization shall not assign or transfer any portion or the whole of this Agreement without the prior written consent of the County.

XXVIII. COMBAT CONTACT

For the purpose of this Agreement, COMBAT Administration or the person designated by COMBAT Administration, shall act as the COMBAT Contact. The COMBAT Contact shall be responsible for overseeing the performance of the services to be rendered under this Agreement. The COMBAT Contact shall be authorized to accept minor changes in services rendered as long as they are not material nor do they substantially alter the services to be performed. Any

substantial or material changes in the service provided under this Agreement must be approved by COMBAT Administration and the County.

XXIX. ORGANIZATION IDENTITY

If **Organization** is merged or purchased by another entity, the County reserves the right to terminate this Agreement. **Organization** shall immediately notify the County in the event it is merged or purchased by any other entity.

XXX. INCORPORATION

This Agreement contains the entire understanding and agreement of the parties, and modifications hereof shall be enforceable only if in writing, signed by the parties hereto.



WORK AUTHORIZATION AFFIDAVIT

As a condition for any service provided to the County, a business entity shall, by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation, affirm its enrollment and participation in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees working in connection with the contracted services.

Business entity, as defined in section 285.525, RSMo pertaining to section 285.530, RSMo, is any person or group of persons performing or engaging in any activity, enterprise, profession, or occupation for gain, benefit, advantage, or livelihood. The term "business entity" shall include but not be limited to self-employed individuals, partnerships, corporations, contractors, and subcontractors. The term "business entity" shall include any business entity that possesses a business permit, license, or tax certificate issued by the state, any business entity that is exempt by law from obtaining such a business permit, and any business entity that is operating unlawfully without such a business permit.

Every such business entity shall complete the following affidavit affirming that it does not knowingly employ any person who is an unauthorized alien in connection with the contracted services. The completed affidavit must be returned as a part of the contract documentation.

This affidavit affirms that **Ad Hoc Group Against Crime**, (Organization name) is enrolled in, and is currently participating in, E-verify or any other equivalent electronic verification of work authorization operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security under the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 (IRCA); and, **Ad Hoc Group Against Crime**, (Organization name) does not knowingly employ any person who is an unauthorized alien in conjunction with the contracted services.

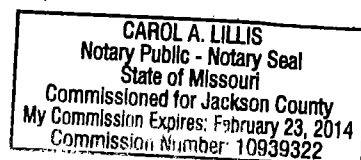

units that fall under the Violent Crimes Division, to assist in bringing justice to crimes and finding those missed by loved ones.

There are great resources in the community to assist AdHoc in making the community a safe place. AdHoc hosts community forums where justice agencies have the opportunity to respond to community concerns, as well as partners with The Office of Community Complaints (OCC) to serve as a site for individuals to file complaints against police officers they feel have violated KCPD's code of conduct. AdHoc also works closely with The State Division of Youth Services, Family Court, Jackson County Prosecutors Office, Kansas City Crime Commission, COMBAT, individuals and community organizations. The gaps in the community resources is funding for more programs and making sure individuals who are not in school receive proper training that will prepare them for a normal future. The community is ready to embrace a change.

III. Statement of Work

AdHoc will ensure that 50 African American males between the ages of 9-19 in the Kansas City Missouri area receive proper guidance from an Angry Management Intervention Specialist. Starting the program the youth will meet with the Intervention Specialist to set goals and develop a strategy to succeed. They will be taught to document all of their activities. One of the goals is to teach the youth to document all activities at home that may have an adverse affect on his behavior. When something happens that is violent, the youth should call the program office. The end result should be that a trained individual will go to the area to support the youth and get help immediately. The AdHoc group will also seek out youth that are not in school in order to make sure that their educational requirements are met in non-traditional ways.

The AdHoc group receives on average 12 referrals a month on individuals who meet the demographics of the target population. The agency will recruit from that pool of clients.

The criteria that will be used for eligibility for service is as follows: Assessment phase: environment risk factors, family risk factors, current school enrollment; experimentation/usage of drugs; public housing; previous violent behavior; school suspension; runaway history; abuse; family substance abuse; family incarceration; single parent home; gang involvement; poverty; weapon usage/history (owned, possessed, used). Violence will be defined as violent incidents or behavior. The risk for violent behavior will be clearly determined by the above mentioned facts. The estimated number to be served is 50 African American males between the ages of 9-19. The total cost per person is \$500.00.

According to Violence Prevention (Youth Violence: a Report of the Surgeon General):

Risk factors are not necessarily causes. Researchers identify risk factors for youth violence by tracking the development of children and adolescents over the first two decades of life and measuring how frequently particular personal characteristics and social conditions at a given age are linked to violence at later stages of the life course. Evidence for these characteristics and social conditions must go beyond simple empirical relationships, however. To be considered

risk factors, they must have both a theoretical rationale and a demonstrated ability to predict violence—essential conditions for a causal relationship⁴

No Modification is anticipated. The staff will collect data that allow for modifications during subsequent years.

This is an existing program and the goals will be accomplished by hiring Project Manager and an Anger Management Intervention Specialist. Volunteer mentors will also be used to accomplish all goals.

The AdHoc group has no partners.

The families have been victimized by violence, so the category of Prevention is Selective Prevention Measures.

We will be using small group sessions for youth ages 9-19. Mentors and the Intervention Specialist and other leaders in the community will be assisting with the sessions “Prevention Education.” Leadership training as well as community service activities will also be implemented which supports “Alternatives.

Family Domain will be addressed and Individual Domain identifying Family History of Problem Behavior. Family protective factors deals with healthy beliefs. Individuals will also be a focus addressing Early and Persistent Antisocial Behavior with the Protective factor associating with peers who are involved in school, recreation, services. Religion or other organized activities.

Family Domain- Families with African American males ages 9-19 will receive intensive case management, and "how to cope" services to include: general individual group counseling, and community support. The general individual and group counseling will focus on specific or common themes that families are facing related to violence. An example of an individual or group session is a Jackson County Victim Support representative facilitates a group about how to best navigate the Jackson County Court system or what the steps are to develop a neighborhood watch. These sessions will be directed by client need, interest as well as the expertise of AdHoc staff and volunteers. African American males, in general, represent 75% of homicides in Kansas City and the target group for this program represents 65% of total homicides annually. This Support Services program will provide intensive case management to African American males that belong to the 50 families served. AdHoc will contact these families, and also accept self referrals. It can be an immediate or distant relative; or even a close friend. The extensive case management will address the specific protective and risk factors that exist for each African American male. The case manager will work with the family and community partners to build protective factors and minimize risk factors. Protective factors include access to employment, education and a caring support system. Family Risk Factors: Family History of Problem Behavior; Parental Attitudes and Involvement in Drug Use, Crime, and Violence; Drug Use Crime and Violence. Family Protective Factors: Healthy Beliefs/clear Standards for Behavior; Positive Family Dynamic.

Individual/Peer Domain- Each participant will have an opportunity to speak with someone individually. These meetings will depend on the client's needs. Participants will learn how to be non-violence, and how to cope when it is hard to avoid violence. They will learn the tools necessary to cope with anger that contributes to retaliation. Leadership sessions will also be taught. The counselor will be responsible for reinforcing self-worth and educational focus. Risk Factors: Alienation or Rebelliousness; early initiation to the problem behavior; Early and Persistent Antisocial Behavior: Protective Factor: Opportunities for pro-social involvement; Healthy beliefs and clear standards for behavior; Association with peers who are involved in school, recreation, service, religion, or other organized activities.

Program Supervisor (hired) %? FTE- Alvin Brooks, President/CEO of AdHoc Group Against Crime will serve as the primary Prevention Coordinator and is accountable for program outcomes. He is responsible for resource development, staff training, reviewing program reports and overseeing AdHoc's staff related to the program and evaluation efforts. The AdHoc Group Against Crime was formed in 1977 when a group of concerned citizens came together to address the unsolved murders of 9 African American women. Alvin Brooks was one of the founding members and led the organization in combating crime and violence in the Kansas City Metropolitan area until the year 2000. At that time, AdHoc merged with Project Neighborhood, which focused on reducing substance abuse among the target population, to form a new entity called Move Up.

Angry Management Intervention Specialist (not hired) 100% FTE- Will require a background in Social Science/Psychology and have knowledge of the area to be served. Experience with African American Youth and their social environment that put them at risk will be required.
