5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, advised the Legislature that for the past year the Administration has been working on the issue of siltation at Prairie Lee Lake. The Administration has been working closely with many groups and individuals to find a solution, including: Mayor Karen Messerli of Lee's Summit, residents of Prairie Lee Lake, Lee's Summit Parks Department and the Park Board, the Missouri Department of Natural Resources, the County Counselor's office and Jackson County Parks Department. The matter of siltation of lakes is a serious one affecting the residents quality of life, development surrounding the county lakes and the health of the natural environment. She reported that a tentative short term and long term solution has been reached. For approximately \$350,000.00 we can purchase a state-of-the-art dredge. The City of Lee's Summit has agreed to share the cost with the County and share its use. She said there will be a resolution before the Legislature after they receive bids on the dredge. Ms. Shields thanked the residents of Prairie Lee Lake and Mayor Messerli for their cooperation in this matter.

Mayor Messerli said she was happy with the solution and appreciates the opportunity to work with the County on this project.

Ms. Shields thanked Frank Fitchener, a representative for the residents at Prairie Lee Lake, for his help and for pledging his continued assistance throughout the clean-up process.

Fred Arbanas thanked Mayor Messerli and County Executive Shields for their work on this matter, but said he knew nothing about it until he read it in the newspaper. He suggested that the County also dredge Sheer Lake in Lee's Summit.

Ms. Shields thanked Legislators Arbanas and Spence for their support on this project.

Dennis Waits asked when the equipment would be received and when the work would begin.

Ms. Shields said the plan was to begin work by summer 2002.

Ms. Shields advised the legislators that on March 7th and 8th, 2002, Cindy Frewen from Frewen Architectural Firms will be hosting meetings to discuss possible landscaping improvement options for future consideration for the downtown courthouse one-block area. Ms. Frewen has been an integral part of developing the Civic Mall area, just north of City Hall, and she has been working with the Administration, Parks Department, Sheriff's Department and the Circuit Court on ideas for future landscaping and security improvements. She encouraged the legislators and or their aides to attend and give any input they may have on these issues. The meeting will be held on Thursday, March 7, 2002 from 10 A.M. until noon at the Power and Light Building located at 12th and Walnut. Friday's meeting will be held from 11:30 A.M. until 2 P.M. in Kansas City Legislative Conference Room A. Anyone planning to attend should contact Bob Kelly.
