WHEREAS, this sponsorship will allow COMBAT to provide information to a regional audience of families, professionals, and community leaders about the prevention of violent crimes and substance abuse prevention and treatment services available to the neighborhoods and community organizations throughout Jackson County; and,

WHEREAS, said sponsorship is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of

the citizens of Jackson County; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the Director of Finance and Purchasing be and hereby is authorized to issue a check to Lee's Summit CARES, in the amount of \$1,000.00 for sponsorship of the Parent University event, to be held February 23, 2013, at Pleasant Lea Middle School.

One overarching recommendation for Youth again emerged for 2012: Implement an ongoing youth consortium and a Comprehensive Youth Master Plan. This recommendation is based on the successful model of the Child & Youth Master Plan created for Metropolitan Nashville and Davidson County. Key to the continued progress on this plan was the assignment of a high level staff person in the Nashville Mayor's office, to convene task force meetings and coordination of the myriad partners involved in plan construction and work on its components. Such a plan should address these priority objectives:

1. **Safety -** Reduce the number of children and youth exposed to violence, including family violence.

2. Out of School Time_-

- ♦ Increase the number of children & youth who experience active, consistent parenting, positive communication and emotional support from their families.
- ♦ Increase the number of children and youth who are exposed to learning opportunities that will provide them with the life/soft skills needed to succeed.
- ♦ Increase the number of youth contributing to the community in meaningful ways.
- ♦ Increase the number of children and youth who hold leadership positions/have roles in the city.
- ♦ Increase the number of parents, children and youth who are aware of what is offered in the community during out-of-school time.
- ♦ Increase the number of children and youth who participate in high quality
- out-of-school-time activities or service learning opportunities.
- Increase the balance of offerings with regard to creative-based, academic-based and physical activity-based programs for children and youth.

3. Stability

- ♦ Increase number of youth who experience active consistent parenting, positive communication and emotional support from their families:
- Increase the number of youth who are exposed to and have access to supports that show them that they can be successful adults.
- Decrease the number of youth who are influenced by gang culture.
- ♦ Decrease the number of youth committing or are victims of delinquent acts.
- ♦ Increase the number of children, youth, and families who are literate.
