## 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said the work being done in the south parking lot is to remove the old water cooling towers. The entire area will be repaved in a couple of weeks.

She stated that the public art project on 13th Street near the detention center is under construction. The sculpture called the "Shadow Garden" should be completed within 2-3 weeks and a dedication ceremony will be planned.

Katheryn Shields spoke of the problems in the Jackson County Records Department as reported in the Kansas City Star over the weekend.

Dan Tarwater and Fred Arbanas were disappointed that as members of the Legislature they were not aware of the problems until they read about it in the newspaper. They encouraged better communication between the Administration and the Legislature.

Katheryn Shields said that the new imaging system should be in place but is not because the conversion is taking longer than anticipated. Constituent calls should be sent to Eddie Brooks at 881-3222.

Fred Arbanas acknowledged that this is an old problem and refinancing has probably been a factor.
