#### 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, introduced Sergeant Anthony Brown with the Jackson County Corrections Department who received the Model of Excellence Award for June, 1999 for assisting the Kansas City Police Department and the Jackson County Sheriff's Department in apprehending an escaped inmate in the custody of the Kansas City Police Department on May 26, 1999.

Katheryn Shields said at a press conference held today she announced that the Administration has hired Peat Marwick, a Big 5 accounting firm, to conduct a jail audit in two areas. The audit will include the construction project which will cost \$20,000.00 and the population control program which will cost \$10,000.00. The audit will be complete in approximately one week.

After hearing the presentation made on June 28 by Claire McCaskill, State Auditor, Ms. Shields said she had concerns because as Prosecuting Attorney, Ms. McCaskill helped design and operate the jail population control program which is one of the areas that would be audited. She was also concerned that Ms. McCaskill said the audit would take 60-90 days. Katheryn Shields believes the audit should be independent, objective and performed in a timely fashion.

There was further discussion on the jail audit.
