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Subject: Additional FY 2023 JAG Drug Task Force Funding

Good Afternoon,

As discussed on our phone conversation, we have identified additional funding available for the FY 2023 Edward Bryne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG). With this additional funding, the task force will receive \$34,969.42 funds to cover approximately 1 ½ months of payroll/benefits. The task force's most recent claim submission of payroll/benefits were utilized to determine the amount of funds the task force will receive.

As these funds MUST be spent by **8/31/2026**, you will need to apply your next month(s) payroll/benefit costs to your FY 2023 JAG DTF project. As the FY 2023 JAG DTF project is closed in WebGrants, the Missouri Department of Public Safety (DPS) will move the project back to underway status, submit a Subaward Adjustment to add additional funds to the payroll/benefit budget lines as well as extend the grant period of performance through 8/31/2026, and attach a Grant Adjustment Notice (GAN) to the Subaward Documents-Final Component of WebGrants. The GAN demonstrates additional funds being awarded to the DTF. You will be required to submit reports in PMT until these funds have been fully expended.

Since some task forces still have SFY 2026 DTF funds (State) and all task forces have FY 2024 JAG DTF funds (Federal) remaining, below outlines the order the funds should be spent in the Personnel/Benefits budget categories. Essentially, state funds allocated for personnel/benefits need to be spent first, next the FY 2023 JAG DTF additional federal funding, and lastly the FY 2024 JAG DTF federal funding.

1. SFY 2026 DTF (State)
2. FY 2023 JAG DTF (Federal)
3. FY 2024 JAG DTF (Federal) – we do have the ability to extend the grant period on these projects if it is needed and the funds cannot be expended by the end of the current grant period
