## 3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Dan Tarwater moved to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on 3/15/2004. Seconded by Dennis Waits.

The motion passed by a voice vote.

(APPROVED)

## 4 HEARINGS

Robert A. Stringfield, County Legislator, announced that he sent a letter to the County Executive suggesting that Dorothy Kennedy be reappointed to the COMBAT Commission to fill the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of Robery Woodley. He introduced Dorothy Kennedy to the Legislature and thanked her for serving on the Commission. He said Katheryn Shields, County Executive, with the approval of the Legislature, will prepare an Executive Order reappointing Ms. Kennedy.

Henry C. Rizzo, County Legislator, said Dorothy brings a wealth of experience to the Commission.

Scott Burnett, Chairman, reminded everyone of the tragedy last summer when a police dog died in a vehicle due to heat. Officer John Bullard received a resolution regarding this incident. Officer Bullard was in attendance to introduce his new dog Daro who is a two year old German Shepherd from Czechoslovakia. They started training Daro in September. Training is complete and they are now working the streets. Daro is one of the three dogs trained at the Independence Police Canine Facility. They recently received national certification and they are only one of seventeen nationally certified training facilities. He thanked the Legislature for the previous resolution which is hanging on the Wall of Honor at the canine unit with Hondo's picture. Daro is his new partner, not a replacement for Hondo. He said they have bonded well and Daro loves the job.

Rhonda L. Shoemaker, County Legislator, congratulated them and is glad to hear things are going well.

Public testimony regarding Ordinance #3480, (OHRCC).

Bob WitbolsFeugen, speaking on behalf of himself and Karen Turner, said the Jackson County Office of Human Relations and Citizen Complaints had the power to subpoena testimony and secure the necessary documents to settle the Turner complaint but chose not to do so at the behest of the Jackson County Sheriff's Department and it's representative, the Jackson County Counselor's Office. The Commissioners of the OHRCC committed at least four violations of the Missouri Sunshine Law as decided in Turner vs. Garcia in 2002. He said they violated the Charter in the process and those actions are the very cause for this review. Duncan Fowler, who is recommended by the United States Ombudsmen Association, and the Legislative Auditor have both acknowledged the fundamental importance of reviewing the Turner complaint as it will address the public criticism. He asked the Legislature to approve Ordinance #3480 as it will serve the common interest of every citizen in Jackson County. He asked the Legislature to renounce the agenda of those who desire their cooperation to cover up the misconduct of individuals who serve only the appointing authority.

Deborah Tircuit, Director/Ombudsman for the Office of Human Relations and Citizen Complaints, said the office has been in existence for 30 years. The office accepts complaints and gives information and referrals to citizens of Jackson County regarding county government. She said she and the commission support Ordinance #3480 requesting the United States Ombudsmen Association to review the OHRCC. Deborah believes a comprehensive review of the structure and the operation of OHRCC would be beneficial to all. She hopes the review will bring forth some recommendations that will help to enhance the office's operations. Ms. Tircuit said her office is a charter functioned office. It is separate from the Administration and is to operate independently of political influence from any Administration or governmental body. She said she will fully support and cooperate with a review of the OHRCC as it relates to the operations and structure.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, asked how many staff members work in her office.

Deborah Tircuit said currently it is her as Director and her Administrative Secretary. She lost her Complaint Officer in September 2003 due to illness and the position still remains open. She has submitted the appropriate requisition to the Administration to allow her to exercise her authority to replace the position but that authorization has not been granted.

Ronald E. Finley said he thought he understood her to say she had an independent office.

Deborah Tircuit replied she is supposed to be independent. She stated that the position is budgeted for 2004.

Troy Thomas, Chief Financial Officer, said it was his understanding that the position should not be filled until the structure review is completed.

Deborah Tircuit said her employee went on FMLA in September 2003 so she had to reserve the position for her when she returned. The employee then decided to go on disability and submitted her resignation letter effective December 31, 2003. On December 7, 2003, she notified the Administration that she needed to post and hire for the position. She did not get a response but when she inquired about it, was told it was pending until the review. She said this places her in an adverse situation having to undertake and go under the review process when she does not have staff and equipment to perform the essential functions of her job.

Currently, Deborah has been handling a dual role as the Administrator/Director and also accepting complaints and information and referral. She said she is handling the complaints to the best of her ability with the resources that she has been provided. Her budget is approximately \$135,000.00 per year which includes salaries.

Bob Stringfield asked Ms. Tircuit if she brought her request to fill the position before the OHRCC Commission, who has the authority to approve.

Deborah Tircuit said the Commission supports her efforts to fill the position. She said the Commission has the authority to hire and fire the Director of the Office of Human Relations and Citizen Complaints. The Director is the hiring authority for office staff.

Roger James Davis, Chairman of the Office of Human Relations and Citizen Complaints, said he has served on the commission for a little over five years. He said the commission fully supports the review of the OHRCC that will be conducted by the consultant.

Dennis Waits moved to perfect Ordinance #3480. Seconded by Dan Tarwater. The motion passed by a voice vote.

(PERFECTED)

Scott Burnett asked Mr. Davis if he has looked at the scope and if the areas he is interested in have been covered.

Mr. Davis said the Director will present the scope to the Commission at their next meeting so they can discuss it.

Ronald E. Finley asked if the intent of the review was to look at operations and make suggestions on improving operations or is it the intent to re-review Mr. WitbolsFeugen's case. He said the WitbolsFeugen case has been to court and he is not sure what other relief can be offered.

Deborah Tircuit said her understanding of the scope is to look at the operations and structure of OHRCC. It will not delve into an individual complaint but will look randomly at how OHRCC may have handled and processed complaints, how they are structured, what powers the organization has, whether or not the organization has been supported both by funding and staffing.

Bob Stringfield asked Kelly Markham-Stegall, County Auditor, to give information and a timetable for this review.

Kelly Markham-Stegall said the original contract for the consultant was \$16,000.00 which would cover the review of the operations of the OHRCC office. The consultant said he could review this specific case but the cost would be an additional \$5,000.00. If the Legislature desires to do this the monies are available. The consultant suggests that the specific case review be separate from the operational report. It is a decision that will be made by the Legislature. It is also important to know that the consultant will interview Mr. WitbolsFeugen and Ms. Turner.

Ronald E. Finley asked the sponsors if that was their intent.

Dennis Waits, County Legislator, said he did not anticipate limiting this review in any way other than what was procluded for review by state law. There are limits that state law provides that we cannot provide a settlement to Mr. WitbolsFeugen and the case is over. However, he thinks it would be a mistake to not allow the ombudsmen to review it without getting into specifics of the case, especially since it is really the bone of contention. Mr. Waits thinks Mr. WitbolsFeugen has presented enough facts that it warrants taking a look at it. He thinks he deserves it to the degree to find out if OHRCC is functioning in handling a case like this because it was an important case. He does not want to put limits on it and risk not having what we need when it is done. He thinks to go forward and spend the money without reviewing the case is a waste. He also thinks we need some idea about hiring staff. He would like a timetable of when the hiring process might begin.

Kelly Markham-Stegall said the consultant gave a range between \$13,000.00 and \$16,000.00. He believes the work can be done for approximately \$13,000.00 - \$14,000.00. By making the amount \$20,000.00 in the ordinance, the additional money would be available if the Legislature desired to review the specific case.

Bob Spence asked the County Auditor if she or her staff would participate in this review.

Kelly Markham-Stegall said no, but she will be assisting him in gathering information for him to read and digest. He would like to come to Jackson County the first week of April and do his field work. He would like a list of individuals he will be interviewing so they could be available during the week he is in town.

Bob Stringfield concurs with Mr. Waits. He said the ordinance includes the scope of the review and he hopes the Legislature will proceed.

Deborah Tircuit said she does not support an additional \$5,000.00 cost to review a particular complaint because there is no resolution. She explained that in 1999, the Commission and herself were sued for violations of the Missouri Sunshine Law not how the complaint was handled. The Commission went through a tedious trial. Mr. WitbolsFeugen received a favorable finding against the Commission for violating the Sunshine Law. The Commission accepted it and made many improvements within the operation in the office to ensure that there will be no problems in the future.

Jay Haden, Deputy County Counselor, said he does not know what the Legislature wants to do as there does not seem to be a consensus. The ordinance reads that it is a comprehensive review of the structure and operation of the office. He said if the Legislature wants a specific review of the case at an additional cost, he thinks that language should be included in the ordinance so there is no doubt about the contract.

Mr. WitbolsFeugen said the purpose of reviewing the Turner complaint is to see if the process by which OHRCC is following is in line with the Jackson County Charter and the responsibilities that it has. To view their responsibilities without looking at how they execute them is a wast of time and money. The purpose of reviewing the Turner case is to bring about a comparison between what is out there that they are responsible for doing and seeing exactly what they would do under the circumstances which that case presented to them.

Dennis Waits moved to suspend the rules to consider final passage of Ordinance #3480. Seconded by Robert A. Stringfield.

The motion passed by a voice vote.
