5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said she had the pleasure of presenting some employee awards. The months skipped will be awarded at later meetings in Independence.

Carl Harmon from the MIS Department, received the January 2004 Employee of the Month Award for his assistance in the development of the case management system for the County Counselor's office.

Lesa Mays, Direct Supervision Officer for A-Pod in the Jail Annex (Corrections Department), received the March 2004 Employee of the Month Award for superior customer focus and for preventing an inmate from hanging himself. Officer Mays has received the Model of Excellence Award from the Department of Corrections and was named the Corrections Employee of the Year for 2003. Drenna Higgins, Records Representative in the Records Department, received the April 2004 Employee of the Month Award for excellent productivity and customer service. She has also been a key contributor in the department-wide cross training effort, learning each of the 8 functions in Records. Katheryn mentioned that turnaround time for returning documents has dropped from 7 days to 5 days during the past year.

Rochelle Neal, Supervisor of Employment and Selection, Human Resources, received the May 2004 Employee of the Month Award. Rochelle began as a Personnel Analyst and was promoted to her current position. As part of Jackson County's E-Government Initiative, in May 2000, Rochelle implemented the timesaving, cost-reduction procedure of electronic referrals. This process allows applications to be scanned and electronically referred to the hiring department. Less paper is generated and the process moves faster. As a result Jackson County has been able to hire applicants in a more timely way and reduce the number of candidates who take another job prior to receiving notification from the County.

Katheryn Shields said over the last several months there has been a lot in the news about Jackson County's Community Backed Anti-Drug Sales Tax (COMBAT). Since the citizens of Jackson County deserve to know exactly how their tax dollars are being spent, the real numbers and actual facts are now posted on the Jackson County web site at www.jacksongov.org. The information is listed under "Frequently Asked Questions". She said detailed financial information is posted on-line, as well as the appropriate resolutions and ordinances, budget information, audit information, a chart showing how the COMBAT tax dollars flow and other relevant documentation. It is her hope that making the facts more accessible to the average citizen will help clear up some of the misinformation that has accumulated about COMBAT.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, gave an update on awarding a contract to an auditor to perform the financial review of COMBAT. He said the Finance and Audit Committee has received 3 bids and have interviewed twice. The committee will proceed this week with negotiations on the fee schedule and structure, which is the second part of the selection process. The Committee hopes to have a recommendation to submit to the Legislature at next week's legislative meeting.

Scott Burnett presented a 20 year service pin to Barbara Casamento, an employee in the Purchasing Department.

He presented a 10 year service pin to Christina Cavallaro, an employee of the Legislative Auditor's office.
