5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, mentioned an article that appeared in the Eastern Jackson County Examiner last Friday. The article highlighted the recent installation of a rain garden at the Tech Center in Independence, Missouri which will help manage runoff from the parking lot. The rain garden was planted by members of Boy Scout Troop 865 with the help of staff from the Public Works Department. The project helped teach the scouts about how rain gardens can help reduce erosion and flooding, as well as getting them involved with something that benefits their community.

She reminded everyone that Veteran's Day is Saturday, November 11th and Jackson County offices will be closed to observe the holiday on Friday, November 10th. She said we cannot let this day pass without thanking the men and women who have fought hard to protect our freedoms in the United States, freedoms that we often take for granted. She encouraged everyone to do something for someone they know who has served in the armed forces this weekend to thank them for helping to protect our freedoms.

Finally, she reminded everyone that tomorrow is election day and that it is not only our right but our responsibility to vote. She said to visit the Kansas City Election Board or the Jackson County Election Board website to view the issues on the ballot. It will also be the second chance to use the new electronic voting equipment which should be a good experience.

Fred Arbanas, County Legislator, said he read an article in the newspaper last week regarding a drug card made available to residents in Johnson and Wyandotte counties. He asked if the Administration had any information on this issue.

Jay Haden, Deputy County Counselor, said this is a program sponsored by National Association of Counties (NACO) and Jackson County is a member. It is a free program at no cost to the County or to County residents. He said it is not a benefit for people with health insurance. However, he said there is a cost to publicize and distribute the cards and perhaps Jackson County's Health Department would be involved. He said he will gather more information to present at the next legislative meeting.
