#### IN THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI

**AN ORDINANCE** enacting section 5292., <u>Jackson County Code</u>, 1984, relating to road and street names.

**ORDINANCE #4384,** January 3, 2012

INTRODUCED BY Bob Spence, County Legislator

WHEREAS, the Inter City Fire Protection District submitted to the Jackson County Plan Commission an application, Case No. LA-2011-024, to rename certain streets within the unincorporated area of Blue Summit because the current addressing system in the area makes emergency response difficult; and,

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission held a hearing on Case No. LA-2011-024 on November 17, 2011, and voted 6 to 3 to recommend APPROVAL of this application; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Jackson County that certain streets located in the unincorporated area of Blue Summit be renamed to improve emergency response; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, as follows:

Section A. <u>Enacting Clause</u>. Section 5292., <u>Jackson County Code</u>, 1984, is hereby enacted, to read as follows:

# 5292. Road and Street Name Changes.

The roads designated in Schedule XII to this chapter are hereby renamed as indicated in said schedule. All references in this chapter, and all schedules thereto, to any of the former names of the listed streets, and/or segments thereof, shall now apply to the newly-named streets.

# SCHEDULE XII ROAD AND STREET NAME CHANGES

- 1. Karleen Street between Marsh Avenue and Vincil Avenue renamed to E. 16<sup>th</sup> Street.
- 2. Maud Avenue, Karleen Street, Elizabeth Street and Alice Avenue between Vincil Avenue and Stark Avenue renamed to E. 16<sup>th</sup> Street.
- 3. Peter Avenue between Alice Avenue and Vincil Avenue renamed to E. 16<sup>th</sup> Terrace.
- 4. 17<sup>th</sup> Street (including those portions that are unpaved and unused) renamed to E. 17<sup>th</sup> Terrace.
- 5. Alice Avenue between Vincil Avenue (including those portions that are unpaved and unused) to proposed E. 16<sup>th</sup> Street to McKinley Avenue.

Streets listed in paragraphs 1-5 above are as shown on the plats Stark Acres, The Crown, Pittsburg, and Subdivision of Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, Blue Summit, all subdivisions in Jackson County, Missouri.

Streets as shown on Stark Acres, The Crown, Pittsburg, Subdivision of Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6, Blue Summit, subdivisions in Jackson County, Missouri.

#### 2. LA-2011-024 - Public Works Development Division

Requesting that certain street names within the Blue Summit area be changed. This request by the Inter City Fire Protection District would allow more unison to the street layout in Stark Acres by bringing it into conformity with the E911 grid system and better serve the residents of the District.

Mr. George introduced LA-2011-024 and entered 14 exhibits into the record. Mr. George gave the staff report with comments and recommendation as follows: The request is to amend Chapter 52 of the Jackson County Code by adding Schedule XI – Road and Street Name Changes. The request is to change street names within the Stark Acres and The Crown subdivisions (Blue Summit area) and renumber some residences accordingly.

The Inter City Fire Protection District has submitted to Jackson County Resolution 11-08 passed by the District requesting certain streets within the Blue Summit area be renamed. The addressing in Blue Summit makes emergency responding difficult due to the confusing combination of Kansas City and Independence street grids being utilized, as well as some streets that do not follow any type of grid. The District would like the northern part of Blue Summit (Stark Acres) to follow the Kansas City street grid for E911 purposes.

Blue Summit is an un-incorporated area between Kansas City and Independence, generally located between I-435 and Blue Ridge Boulevard, and a half mile south of US 24 Highway to 23<sup>rd</sup> Street. The Plat of Pittsburg was recorded in 1890. The streets were laid out in line with the Kansas City street grid, however the street names were aligned with Independence's grid. In 1908 a subdivision of blocks in the Blue Summit area were re-platted into lots. The adjacent plat of Pittsburg is shown as reference. The street shown as 20<sup>th</sup> Street is now shown as 19<sup>th</sup> Street. Sometime between 1890 and 1908, 18<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> Streets within Pittsburg may have been changed to 17th, 18th and 19th Streets and now aligned with the Kansas City grid. The Kansas City grid and the Independence grid are similar but not exactly alike. In some places, they are about a block off in some north-south places. About this same time, the City of Kansas City annexed the area which is now their eastern limits in this area. This may have contributed to the changing of the streets names in Pittsburg. The Crown subdivision, platted in 1910, shows the streets in line with Kansas City. In 1920, the plat of Stark Acres was recorded laying out streets. A replat of portions was recorded in 1929 . With the exception of Van Horn Road (now Truman Road, and also shown as 15th Street) and 17th Street, the streets within Stark Acres do not follow any logical street grid system. Their alignment may have been based on more of a geological reasoning than that of a typical grid system. The streets were named for family members of the late Dr. John K Stark, who had been a prominent dentist in the Independence and Kansas City area. This was part of the land he had purchased in 1872.

In September 2011, the Fire Protection District implemented E911 for the Blue Ridge Mobile Home Park. Previously, addressing for the park was a single address of 1800 Blue Ridge Blvd and pad number. The District suggested naming the private streets within the park to match the addressing grid already in place and assigning 911 compliant numbers to each pad site. This change was implemented in September. Staff assisted the District with implementation by

working with Mid America Regional Council (MARC) to add the needed changes into the regional E911 database.

These changes help eliminate the chances for misrouted calls for emergency services. There is an 1800 block of Blue Ridge Blvd in Grandview, and there have been instances of calls being inadvertently routed to the wrong emergency service provider.

By renaming the streets in Stark Acres, this helps bring the streets into a logical grid that is easier not only for emergency services but for delivery and postal services as well. It eliminates the confusion of streets changing names at curves. It also clears up the double numbered addresses that are currently on "South" Alice and "East" Alice.

Staff realizes that such changes can be burdensome to the residents of the area. If these changes are implemented, there are a total of 40 properties that will be affected. Out of the 40, there are 19 residences that will be changed. Of the 19, 6 homes will be renumbered and remaining 13 will have only a street name change.

Therefore, staff recommends the following:

- 1) Rename Karleen Street between Marsh Avenue and Vincil to E. 16<sup>th</sup> Street.
- 2) Rename Maud Avenue, Karleen Street, Elizabeth Street and Alice Avenue between Vincil Avenue and Stark Avenue to E. 16<sup>th</sup> Street.
- 3) Rename Peter Avenue between Alice Avenue and Vincil Avenue to E. 16<sup>th</sup> Terrace.
- 4) Rename 17<sup>th</sup> Street (including those portions that are unpaved and unused) to E. 17<sup>th</sup> Terrace.
- 5) Rename Alice Avenue between Vincil Avenue to proposed E. 16<sup>th</sup> Street to McKinley Avenue.

The Development Division requests the Plan Commission forward a favorable recommendation to the County Legislature.

Mr. Pointer wanted to know if the postal service had been contacted regarding these changes.

Mr. George said the changes had been discussed with the postmaster and there were no issues.

Mrs. Mershon wanted to know why a street was being named McKinley instead of being given a number.

Mr. George said that in the street grid system, east/west streets were given numbers and north/south streets were given names.

There were no further questions for staff.

Monte Olsen, district manager of the Inter-City Fire Protection District appeared to speak in favor of the legislative action. Mr. Olsen clarified that McKinley Street ran both north and south of the area so that renaming the street was in keeping with a street name already established. He stated that smoke and flames made an address easy to find but that a medical emergency was not so easily located; this could be caused by unfamiliarity with the area or confusion on the part of the caller and/or the responder. Mr. Olsen said that changing addresses would be difficult but it would be for the better good of the area.

There was no one else to speak in favor of the legislative action.

Joe Pace, 1700 McKinley, appeared in opposition to the legislative action. Mr. Pace said he had lived in the area since 1975 and many of the residents have lived there for 40 – 50 years. He said that only he and another resident were present at this hearing and he had talked to 15 people who said they had received no notification of the meeting. Mr. Pace said a previous meeting had been held in Blue Summit regarding the address changes and 30 – 40 people voiced opposition to the changes. He said the Blue Summit area was one of the oldest areas in Kansas City and the fire department has always been a volunteer department. He said he had been a member of the department for 30 years. He said the current personnel had only been there for a few years and they needed to learn the addresses. Mr. Pace said the area encompassed a 1-mile radius and he had marked the fire hydrants so that everyone knew their locations. He said the current volunteer firemen needed to learn the addresses and location of fire hydrants. He said street names didn't need to be changed but the fire department needed to be better organized.

Mr. Pointer wanted to know what the main objection was to changing the addresses.

Mr. Pace said people had lived in the area for 50 years and now were facing an address change. He said the addresses were not the problem, the fire department was the problem. He said the volunteers don't live in the area and instead of learning current addresses, they wanted to change the addresses to accommodate them.

Chairman Antey said in a 911 situation, there was potential for miscommunication to occur.

Mr. Pace said the sheriff's office was familiar with the area and had no problem finding addresses.

Mr. Tarpley wanted to know how many houses were in the area.

Mr. Pace said there were less than 1000 houses. He said MAST previously provided ambulance service but now AMR had the contract and they were not familiar with the area. He said they need to learn the addresses and not change them.

Mr. Haley asked if changing the addresses would be worth it if a medical emergency occurred and responders were not able to locate the address in time.

Mr. Pace wanted to know why the people whose addresses were to be changed weren't notified of the change.

Mr. George said a public notice had appeared in the Examiner regarding the public hearing and letters sent to residents involved in the address change. He pointed out that a list of the property owners receiving notification was included as an exhibit.

Mr. Pointer said if only 2 people were present at the meeting, the other property owners must not have any interest in attending the meeting.

Mr. Pace said he couldn't speak for them.

Mr. George said he had received only one phone call in response to the letters sent out and the property owner was not opposed.

Mr. Tarpley said if there were 1000 houses and only 19 were affected by the address change, 6 with new numbers and the remaining with a name change and emergency response time was shortened, he couldn't see why anyone would object.

Chairman Antey said he understood the opposition to change but if there was better emergency response time, it was for the better good.

Mrs. Querry wanted to know why the fire department and ambulances couldn't find the addresses if the sheriff's department could.

Chairman Antey said it depended on who was responding and their length of time on the job. He said he didn't routinely see ambulances driving in a neighborhood to learn addresses.

Mr. Pointer said in the past people stayed with jobs for a lifetime. He said in today's world, people change jobs every few years so there are constantly new people on a job. He said it's necessary to enable everyone to find an address.

Mrs. Mershon asked if the fire department was volunteer or paid.

Mr. Pace said it had always been volunteer. He said it's too costly to have a paid department as it is a low income area and many of the streets are only one block long.

Mrs. Mershon wanted to know how the fire department was supported.

Mr. Pace said it was supported by taxes.

Mrs. Mershon asked if the property owners paid property taxes for this purpose.

Mr. Pace said recently they had been able to secure a portion of the sales tax paid in the area. He repeated that he thought when a person came to a new job, they should learn what needed to be done.

There were no further questions for Mr. Pace.

Plan Commission November 17, 2011

Monte Olsen reappeared to offer further testimony in favor of the legislative action. Mr. Olsen said there are 358 buildings in the district. He said the previous public hearing mentioned by Mr. Pace had only 2 attendees who would be affected by the address changes. He said most of the people attending the meeting would not be affected. Mr. Olsen said 80% of the residents of the mobile home park were in favor of the address changes that would occur in the park. He said there were currently several paid positions in the fire department and it was hoped that revenue from the sales tax would enable them to hire one or two paid positions next year.

Mr. Tarpley wanted to know if the sheriff's office was in favor of the address changes.

Mr. Olsen said that the sheriff had previously spoken to legislators regarding a logical address system that would make it easier for deputies to find addresses. He said the sheriff had not given an opinion on this plan.

Mr. Tarpley wanted to know if the sheriff was aware of this plan.

Mr. Olsen said yes.

There were no further questions for Mr. Olsen and no one else to appear in favor of or in opposition to the legislative action.

Mr. Pointer moved to take LA-2011-024 under advisement. Mrs. Mershon seconded the motion.

Mr. Pointer said if the sheriff had concerns about the address changes, he or representative would be present at the hearing.

Chairman Antey said it would probably be safe to assume that the sheriff was in favor of a logical address grid.

Mr. Tarpley said he understood the concerns about the changes but if emergency response time were improved, it would be better to have the ordinance in place. He said he thought the addresses needed to be in sequence.

Mr. Haley said every obstacle needed to be removed for emergency responders.

Chairman Antey said confusion between E. Alice and S. Alice could be the difference between life and death.

Mr. Gibler asked if the county or the community was doing the address changes.

Chairman Antey said the county was doing the address changes.

Mr. Gibler wanted to know if the county could do address changes with the city of Lee's Summit.

Chairman Antey said the county could only do this in an unincorporated area.

Counselor Snyder said Blue Summit had a name but was never incorporated. He said it remains an unincorporated area and is the only one between Kansas City and Independence.

Mr. Tarpley said if the fire district includes 350 residences and only 19 addresses are being changed, that was a very minimal change.

Mr. Crawford said he understood the concern over changes but the changes could save one of their lives.

Mr. Aikins said the street layout on the original plat is a popular layout today. He said it is no different than having an Alice Street, Alice Court, Alice Terrace and Alice Circle as is found in many areas today. He said the original plat is a very contemporary layout.

Mr. Crawford asked to move out of advisement of LA-2011-024 as further information was needed from the public. Mr. Tarpley seconded the motion.

Joe Pace reappeared to offer more testimony in opposition to the legislative action. Mr. Pace said Blue Summit had asked Kansas City and Independence to annex the area and both cities had refused due to the amount of infrastructure work needed on streets and addition of street lights among other things. He said the residents try to take care of the area and everyone knows, cares and watches out for each other. He said elderly people may not understand why they live in the same place but have a different address. Mr. Pace repeated that responders need to learn the addresses.

Mr. Aikins wanted to know how many of the streets shown on the plat still remain.

Mr. Pace said the streets are there but no longer used. He said most of the streets are only a block long.

Mr. Pointer repeated that employees today don't stay in a job for a lifetime. He said they don't learn because they don't plan to stay in the job for longer than a few years.

Mr. Pace said that GPS units were economical and could be placed in emergency vehicles. He said the residents shouldn't be burdened with changing addresses. He said the fire department needed to be involved in the neighborhood and to learn the names and addresses of the residents.

Mr. Tarpley moved to re-enter advisement for LA-2011-024. Mr. Crawford seconded the motion.

Chairman Antey said he understood about the concern for elderly residents having to make a change but in 20-30 years the population in the area would most likely be different people. He said new employees tend to concentrate on big aspects of a job and not the minute ones.

Mr. Tarpley said if one live were saved, the address changes would be worth it.

Mr. Crawford said use of GPS units made sense, but there was still room for human error when calling in addresses.

Plan Commission November 17, 2011

Chairman Antey said he agreed that in many neighborhoods today the street name was the same with different suffixes such as street, court, parkway, ect.

Mr. Haley said he uses a GPS and occasionally it fails.

There was no further discussion and Mrs. Mershon moved to approve LA-2011-024. Mr. Tarpley seconded the motion.

Therefore, staff recommends the following:

- 1. Rename Karleen Street between Marsh Avenue and Vincil to E. 16<sup>th</sup> Street.
- 2. Rename Maud Avenue, Karleen Street, Elizabeth Street and Alice Avenue between Vincil Avenue and Stark Avenue to E. 16<sup>th</sup> Street.
- 3. Rename Peter Avenue between Alice Avenue and Vincil Avenue to E. 16<sup>th</sup> Terrace.
- 4. Rename 17<sup>th</sup> Street (including those portions that are unpaved and unused) to E. 17<sup>th</sup> Terrace.
- 5. Rename Alice Avenue between Vincil Avenue to proposed E. 16<sup>th</sup> Street to McKinley Avenue.


