Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, was not present.

Tony Stansberry, Superintendent of Lee's Summit School District and Bud Hertzog, member of the Lee's Summit School Board were present to ask for the County Legislature's support for the Lee's Summit Voluntary Residential Development Surcharge. In this program, developers are asked to voluntarily pay a \$1,000.00 fee per housing unit within the city limits of Lee's Summit. The school district where the housing is located will receive all of this money. The two school districts in Lee's Summit are Blue Springs and Lee's Summit. Funds will be used by the school districts for new construction and renovation. They distributed pamphlets to members of the Legislature which explains the surcharge program. They asked Jackson County to endorse this effort by placing the pamphlets in the County Planning Department and making them available to developers.

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, clarified that this program is entirely voluntary.

Bud Hertzog responded yes and said that this program is patterned after a county in Arizona.

Victor E. Callahan said the Legislature will prepare a resolution.

Dennis Waits, County Legislator, said the Legislature will communicate with the County Counselor's office and the school district representatives to get the proper wording for the resolution.

Mr. Stansberry said he has spoken with Bob Kelly, Manager of Operations, and he has indicated that the Administration supports this program.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, asked Mr. Stansberry for a dollar amount in reference to the discussion last week regarding assessments of property in the school district.

Mr. Stansberry said the district realized a decrease of \$950,000.00 and he said they have provided the breakdown of this figure to the Administration.

Mr. Finley requested a copy of the breakdown from the Administration.

Victor E. Callahan said he has received calls from constituents regarding the following: Taxpayers and mortgage companies are receiving duplicate tax bills when in fact the bill should only be sent to the mortgage company; Taxpayers are receiving personal property tax bills on vehicles which have been sold 3-4 years ago and they are being billed with penalties.

Troy Thomas, Manager of Finance, said the computer system is set up so that it cannot accept double payment on a tax bill. He is aware that several hundred properties are affected by the problem of duplicate tax bills being sent to the taxpayer as well as the mortgage company. He said if the taxpayer received the tax bill they should forward it to the mortgage company. He said he was not aware of the tax problem on vehicles but would check into it and penalties would not be incurred on vehicles no longer on the rolls.

Victor E. Callahan said he received a letter from Ed Severeid who recently resigned as Director of Assessment. He said he would provide a copy to Troy Thomas for the Administration to review. He said the letter mentions that Mr. Severeid was instructed not to meet with school district representatives. He asked for an explanation from Katheryn at next week's legislative meeting.

Troy Thomas assured Chairman Callahan that the County Executive did not tell Mr. Severeid not to meet with the school district representatives.

Fred Arbanas, County Legislator, asked how long it takes for the County to receive notice from mortgage companies that the property has been paid in full.

Troy Thomas said it could take 30-60 days.

Fred Arbanas said he will talk with Mr. Thomas later regarding a problem.

Terry Young, County Legislator, said she regrets the County Executive was not present. She said she is concerned after receiving this letter from Mr. Severeid as the Legislature was not informed that he resigned from his position until they read about it in the newspaper. She asked for an update on the Assessment Departments ongoing audit.

Troy Thomas said the update will be given at a meeting scheduled to be held on Thursday, December 6, 2001 at 3 P.M.
