## 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, congratulated John Walsh on being the recipient of the National Association of Counties "Acts of Caring" award. Mr. Walsh is the founding father of our Parks & Recreation Volunteer Program. He is also a retired Colonel in the United States Army Medical Service Corps, President of the Greater Kansas City Gardeners of America and past President of the O'Hara Council of Knights of Columbus. He also received the Bernie Hoffman Community Service Award for Outstanding Volunteer Achievement in the Grater Kansas City Community in 1997.

It is National Boys and Girls Club Week and Ms. Shields presented a proclamation to Dot Colemen, a representative from the Boys and Girls Clubs of Eastern Jackson County and Kansas City.

Katheryn Shields announced that Jackson County has hired a new MIS Director. His name is Thad Thomas and he comes to us from the City of Birmingham, Alabama. Mr. Thomas is originally from Kansas City having lived here from 1973 to 1986. His two children were born in Independence and he is still a member of Palestine Baptist Church. In Birmingham, Mr Thomas managed 26 departments relating to MIS including their police and fire departments. With assistance from Southwestern Bell and DST, the search was narrowed down to three candidates and Mr. Thomas was everyone's first choice. He will begin work on Monday, April 17, 2000 and will attend the Legislative meeting next week.

Census Bureau Officials will be setting up tables at the Kansas City Courthouse and Corrections Department on Tuesday to take applications and test persons interested in working part time. Jackson County is happy to be a partner with them in this effort, as a service to our employees who may be interested.

Katheryn Shields said that the seasonal hiring process has begun. Jackson County has a lot of seasonal positions that are open in our parks and both the Personnel and Parks Departments are gearing up for this process. Eighteen different types of positions are available from "parks intern" to "recreation specialist" at the marinas, golf courses and soccer complexes. Applicants must be at lease 16 years of age. Evening, weekend and holiday work may be required. Applications can be picked up at the Parks Department, the Downtown Courthouse, or Independence Annex.

Earth Day 2000 is approaching and Jackson County will be playing a major role. Earth Day will be celebrated with 30 days of activities beginning with the "Walk for Environmental Excellence" at the Kansas City Zoo on April 22. Jackson County will focus its efforts on the citywide "Clean Out Your Files Day" on May 10, 2000.
