

**FIRST ADDENDUM TO  
CONSULTING AGREEMENT**  
(June 1, 2017, through July 31, 2018)

THIS FIRST ADDENDUM, made and entered into this 20<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2017, by and between **JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI**, hereinafter called "the County" and **RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT INSTITUTE, PO Box 10163, Kansas City, Missouri 64171**, hereinafter called "RDI."

WHEREAS, RDI and County entered into a Consulting Agreement dated December 11, 2015, whereunder RDI agreed to provide an evaluate COMBAT-funded anti-drug and anti-violent crime programs; and,

WHEREAS, the parties now desire to extend the original Consulting Agreement at an increased cost;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the terms and provisions herein contained, County and RDI respectively agree with each other as follows:

1. Except as expressly provided herein, all provisions of the Consulting Agreement between RDI and County shall remain in full force and effect.

2. RDI shall facilitate the evaluation of COMBAT-funded anti-drug and anti-violent crime programs, as is more fully set out in the attached Exhibit A, which is incorporated herein by reference.

3. The maximum sum to be paid by County to RDI shall be increased by the amount of \$58,495.00, for a maximum total of \$116,120.00. Payments shall be made upon the submission of invoices by RDI in accordance with the schedule set out in

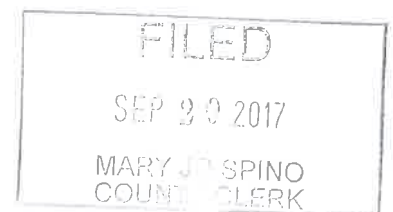


Exhibit A. Payments for 2018 are subject to appropriation in the 2018 Jackson County budget.

4. RDI shall continue to bear all the expenses of its work under this Agreement.


5. This Agreement shall be effective as of June 1, 2017, and shall extend until July 31, 2018.
