WHEREAS, a transfer is necessary to place the funds in the proper spending account; and,

SUBMITTER'S STATEMENT

I am basically a basketball coach, who realizes fully that basketball is mechanism through which we build life skills for our youth. Clearly, my many years as a coach at both the high school and college level, I am convinced that basketball does and can offer much more than just the activities on a hardwood floor. It is my strong belief that we can use basketball as a "hook" to insure continued involvement in our educational system. My motto has become "it's not only about basketball...it's much more". That much more is what this proposal is all about.

PROPOSED PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The temptation to leave school before graduation is overwhelming. However, the departure from school doesn't begin on the day the student refuses to attend school...it starts well before that. Studies have shown that the decision to depart from school begins months before. Thus, counteracting this approaching event is what our proposal is all about. We propose to introduce basketball to up to 40 youth from the eastern and western parts of Jackson County, each. We propose to start this summer with a modicum of fun....but eventually graduate into discipline, program for the arts, homework assistance and even violence and drug prevention.

SUMMER AND FALL CONNECTIONS

We will employ every method imaginable to maintain the youth's interest, knowing that the bonding period may take a while. That is the reason for the summer start. During this period, the other life skills will be introduced and enhanced, all directed toward getting and keeping "a head start" when school actually opens in the fall of 2013. It is our plan to meet with each individual teacher and make them fully aware of each student's experience in this program. Also, that line of communication would remain open throughout the school year. Too many similar programs only intervene after something negative has occurred, thereby placing

undue time and effort on the problem, rather than the total student. This program aims to interrupt this unrewarding cycle.

PROPOSED ACTIVITIES

During the summer and the school year, this schedule will likely guide our mission. For the most part, the activities will take place in the evenings:

6:00 p.m. Brief Planning Meeting, Overview

- 6:10 Homework Checking And Assistance (in the summer, anticipated homework by grade) and my arts program (trained professions from eastern and western Jackson county area will conduct these sessions)
- 7:10 Short Break
- 7:20 Alternating Seminars/Discussion On Obesity Prevention, violence prevention, and Self-Discipline (trained professionals will conduct these seminars during each evening)
- 7:45 Basketball Instruction, emphasizing skill development and discipline
- 9:10 Short Briefing On Accomplishments/Preparation For Next Meeting
- 9:15 Dismissal

TARGETED GROUPS

The program would target third up to eighth grade boys and girls for the program. It is important for younger children to witness the attitude and approach of the older youth. Also older youth are excellent skill enhancers are their younger, less agile counterparts. Youth will be residents of the eastern part of Jackson County and from Kansas City. Educators and community leaders have already been contacted and have pledged to refer to and support the program. No problem is foreseen in attracting the forty "lucky" youth from each area.

LOCATION

As of now, in the east we are talking with administrative officials at both the Blue Valley Community College as well as Sports Lodge, which we have used in the past. For the Hickman Mills/Southern Kansas City area we have worked with Hillcrest Community Center and the new gymnasium at the Kansas City Police South Patrol. All of these facilities would accommodate the need for classrooms as well as athletic accommodations. Inherently, the college campus sends a subtle but strong message about the importance of education.

COMBAT will be introducing a request for legislative action to authorize the transfer of funds from the COMBAT anti-drug sales tax contingency fund for the purpose of funding the Shooter's Touch Academy: An Intervention to Address Early School Departure proposal. This amount of this funding request is \$38,200.00.

On Monday, May 13, 2013, Clyde Harvey, Youth Development Specialist from Shooter's Touch Academy, LLC, made a presentation to the Anti-Drug Committee of the Jackson County Legislature on an intervention proposal to address early school departure. This proposed program would take place during the summer months and fall semester of school. The academy attracts youth through physical coaching (basketball), while providing life-skills and academic support, for 3 hours per evening, 4 nights a week, throughout the summer and school year. The target population will be 40 youth at each site in 3rd through 8th grades, and from Eastern and Western parts of Jackson County. The program will be offered two times per week at two different locations (total of 4 days per week for program length of 30 weeks). The Life Skills curriculum includes Healthy Living (Obesity Prevention), Violence Prevention, and Self-Discipline. These courses are led by trained professionals. In addition, an hour each day is provided for academic assistance, including homework checks during the school season

The program was perfected at Penn Valley Community College in Kansas City. Now, it is operating in Independence, with plans to expand to Southern parts of Jackson County (specifically the Hickman Mills area). COMBAT has been asked to help attract programming to the Hickman Mills area, so recruiting a strong, proven program will allow these underserved youth to get desperately needed services. Funding of this program would provide a great benefit to youth in Jackson County by encouraging them to stay in school and increasing other protective factors that help in reducing substance use and violence. Funding of anti-drug and anti-violence projects has been strongly supported by the Jackson County Drug Commission.

The 2013 budget included \$596,150 for the anti-drug sales tax (COMBAT) contingency fund. Prior to this proposed legislative action, \$86,000 has been utilized for other projects.
