4 HEARINGS

Public Hearing on the 1995 budget.

James Storkamp, County Counselor, apologized for not scheduling the public hearing of the 1995 budget at an earlier date.

Larry Vaydik said he did not think it was necessary for the County Executive and County Legislature to have lobbyists in Jefferson City.

Ken McLain, a lawyer from Independence who served on the County Executive transition team, asked the Legislature to keep an open mind when considering additional space for the court facilities in eastern Jackson County. He said the Bar Association does not favor the purchase and renovation of the old City Hall building in Independence. Members of the Bar Association have met with Katheryn Shields and have formed a committee to review this matter.

James D. Tindall, Chairman, asked Mr. McLain if members of the Legislature would be welcome on the committee.

Mr. McLain replied yes.

Dennis Waits said the County has set aside money in the 1995 budget to purchase a building to be used by the courts. However, the purchase will require final approval by the County Legislature and he welcomes the Bar Association's input.

Budget hearing closed.

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, thanked Legislators for their help and cooperation during the 1995 budget process. She said since no testimony given will require changes in the budget she planned to sign it later today. She said with the exceptions of the Sheriff's and Prosecutor's office the two percent pay increase for all County employees will be reflected on the next paycheck.

Lisa White Hardwick asked for an update on the jail overcrowding litigation.

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said the County will need to present a plan to the court on February 14, 1995. Ms. Shields met with Fred Arbanas, Claudia York, the County Counselor and members of the Administration to work out a plan and will continue to report their progress to the Legislature.
