5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, followed up on the report given by Ken Evans, Public Information Officer, regarding online tax payment. She informed the Legislature that this e-government initiative was covered in the latest issue of Scout Solutions, a newsletter published by UMB Bank. The article highlighted Jackson County's efforts as well as the high amount of use that online tax payment saw in the first year.

She said that last week was "Clean Out Your Files Week" and a press conference was held on Tuesday which was covered on Channels 4 and 41, The Kansas City Star and the Independence Examiner. Preliminary numbers reported that 10.5 tons of paper were recycled. She is relieved to see that the tonnage is decreasing as it means Jackson County is using less paper and recycling more throughout the year. She is happy to see our employees making a difference in the environment.

Jackson County also sponsored a "school challenge" in which 50 schools participated in the contest to see who could "clean out the most files". The results will be tallied and an awards ceremony will be held on Wednesday, May 7th at 10:30 a.m. at a location to be announced. She encouranged members of the Legislature to attend.

Jackson County co-sponsored a special Earth Day Walk for the Environment at the Kansas City Zoo on Saturday, April 26th. This was also Bridging the Gap's annual "Party for the Planet". Over 1,000 people from the metropolitan area participated in the event and Jackson County facilitated the involvement of over 50 local businesses and government agencies. Jackson County's Earth Day Walk Team consisted of 127 members and \$1,060.00 was raised in donations. The Marching Cobras did a short performance as charity for Jackson County. Twenty children from Satchel Paige Elementary Computer Club participated on the walking team. Katheryn thanked her managers and directors who sponsored the children so they could participate.

Katheryn Shields, along with Dr. Paula Livingston, Director of the Jackson County Health Department, gave a brief update on the West Nile Virus plan.

Katheryn said Jackson County has developed a coordinated plan to reduce the spread of the virus.

Katheryn said the Health Department will work with cities, unincorporated areas and school districts to educate the public about the West Nile Virus and will identify human and animal cases. The Public Works Department/Environmental Health staff will collect dead birds and trap mosquitoes for testing from the cities of Blue Springs, Grandview, Lake Tapawingo, Lee's Summit, Raytown and Sugar Creek. The Parks and Recreation Department will assist these same cities by providing information about the use of larvicide.

The Parks Department will be responsible for purchasing and treating county park areas. They are also doing some preventative larviciding along the Longview trail, Little Blue Trace trail, the Fred Arbanas Golf Course and historical sites. Public Works will be responsible for purchasing and treating county road right of ways. Larviciding will be conducted in areas where West Nile Virus has been confirmed through testing of dead birds and mosquitoes.

Dr. Paula Livingston said that a meeting was held on April 17th with all the cities to develop the West Nile Virus Response Plan and she went over the handout that was distributed to the legislators.

Robert A. Stringfield, County Legislator, said he appreciated the information she included in the handout regarding SARS.

Gary Salva, Director of Parks and Recreation, talked about a letter received by the Parks Department from the Kansas City Chapter of the Missouri Alumni Association. He explained that a year and a half ago the Missouri Alumni Association asked if they would continue to receive a discount on their corporate picnic which they have annually at Longview Lake. Jackson County decided to co-sponsor thier picnic last year to see if they would generate any new business from their sponsorship. However, no new business was realized and so Jackson County has decided not to co-sponsor and not to offer a discount. As a result, the Association has sent a letter stating they will no longer have their picnic at Longview Lake. Mr. Salva explained that the Parks Department was just breaking even and losing potential revenue, since other organizations would have been paying full price for the use of the corporate site.

Bob Spence, County Legislator, asked for a percentage of corporate picnics held. Mr. Salva said he did not have that figure available.

Ronald E. Finley asked how large of an event the Missouri Alumni Association hosted. Mr. Salva responded between 500-1,000 participants.
