Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Bill Petrie moved to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on 12/11/2000. Seconded by Terry Young.

Due to inclement weather, the meeting scheduled for Monday, December 18, 2000 was rescheduled and held on Tuesday, December 19, 2000 at 3:30 p.m. in the Legislative Assembly Area, Kansas City, Missouri.

4 HEARINGS

None.

Scott Burnett, County Legislator, introduced his parents, Harry and Frances Burnett, who were in the audience. He also mentioned that the McCoy Elementary courtesy resolution would be held until January 2001.

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, announced Aaron Gunzel, a Park Ranger, as the employee of the month for December. Last July, he saw a 10 year old boy fall into Longview Lake while at the marina, he pulled the young boy safely to the dock. He has worked for Jackson County since 1996.

She distributed to members of the Legislature a preliminary report by the Public Health Task Force which was appointed in September by the County Executive. Jackson County's Health Department operates under a contract with Truman Medical Center - Lakewood. The restaurant inspections are handled under the Environmental Unit of the Public Works Department. She said the report does identify the key questions we face in both structure and service delivery but it does not yet offer specific recommendations for structural changes. The task force does favor rejoining the Environmental Unit with the Health Department. She commended the members for the work they have done so far on this issue.

Terry Young, County Legislator, asked what will be the next step for the task force.

Ms. Shields said they will continue to meet and come up with recommendations. It will then be brought to the Administration and Legislature for implementation. She will provide the Legislature with a schedule of meeting dates for the Public Health Task Force.

Bob Boley, Director of Assessment, said 84,000 tax bills have been adjusted and corrected bills will be mailed by December 31, 2000. The deadline for all personal property tax bills has been extended to January 31, 2001. Taxpayers are urged to pay the original tax bill if the adjusted bill is not received by January 10, 2001.

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said for those taxpayers who have already paid incorrect bills, refunds will be processed by Jackson County.

Bob Boley said he regrets the inconvenience but is confident that all bills affected have been corrected. On a positive note, he said this year Jackson County has gone to a lockbox system with UMB Bank, where tax payments are received and processed. To date, Jackson County has collected and distributed to the other taxing entities over 50 million dollars, which is three times more than what Jackson County had done at this time last year. Also, Jackson County has sent out 40,000 tax receipts to date. Last year no receipts had been mailed out by mid-December.

Victor E. Callahan presented a plaque to Ron Finley for serving as Vice Chairman of the Legislature for the past year. He said he has enjoyed working with Mr. Finley and the County Executive.

Ronald E. Finley, Vice Chairman, thanked Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, Katheryn Shields, County Executive, and Troy Thomas, Manager of Finance, for the time spent on finalizing the budget.

Bob Spence, County Legislator, said he would vote for the budget this year. However, he still thinks that Jackson County has made a habit of funding projects that he feels are outside the county's scope of services and an inappropriate expenditure of tax dollars. He thinks that every program the County supports are worthy programs which provide a great service for a couple of the cities and the County. He does not understand why the County funds one neighborhood in Kansas City for the last 8 years, birthday celebrations such as Martin Luther King or St. Patrick's Day and for the second year in a row the County will provide funding for the Sister City Program by sending students to Japan. He feels this type of funding takes money away from other basic services that Jackson County should be providing and it is also taking money away from the employees of the County. The money could be used to give employees better raises.

Ronald E. Finley, Vice Chairman, assumes the Chair.

Victor E. Callahan said he was pleased with the budget. He thinks it is a comprehensive budget that addresses many needs of Jackson County. The County is seen as a central health provider for our jurisdiction, for both older and younger citizens. As far as wage issues, the County is offering 3% raise to deputy sheriffs as well as \$200,000.00 to adjust their salaries further, which was a worthy need. He complimented Mr. Spence for voting for the budget, if there is a particular expenditure a legislator does not like then he/she can vote against that appropriation, but a budget is a comprehensive document that tries to approach various needs. He commended members of the Legislature and especially Ronald Finley for the time they spent working on the budget. He commended Katheryn Shields for her efforts also. They were able to restore funding to the Eastern Jackson County Drug Task Force and important additions have been made to the Public Administrator's office.

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, resumes the Chair.

Fred Arbanas, County Legislator, thanked Victor Callahan and Katheryn Shields for negotiating a workable budget.

Ronald E. Finley said the County has been able to absorb the 11% increase in health insurance premiums for employees in 2001 so that employees would not have to pay the additional amount. They have also established a pool for salary increases for the Sheriff's Department in 2001. He feels Jackson County employees are treated fairly and the Legislature and Administration are doing the best they can to address issues as they arise. He complimented the County Executive on her recommendations in these areas.
