## 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said she has been working on an issue with the courts regarding the number of judges to request from the State Legislature. She will attend a meeting on Wednesday, March 29, 1995, in Jefferson City, Missouri regarding this matter. The Administration and the Courts will be proposing one drug commissioner for downtown Kansas City, Missouri, and one additional circuit court judge for eastern Jackson County. The County's funding for this will be approximately \$93,000.00 for space renovation and \$20,000.00 for the salary of a bailiff in eastern Jackson County.

Fred Arbanas said Jackson County must insist that the State pay for all expenses to be incurred by the addition of two judges with the exception of the bailiff. The Administration agreed.
