5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said June 9, 1998, marks the second anniversary of Jackson County's recycling program. We celebrated the event by expanding our waste reduction/recycling efforts. The county has increased the number of county buildings that recycle from eight to twelve. Also, seminars were held today for employees to learn more about reducing waste and saving money at home by recycling. The first year of recycling, Jackson County saved \$30,000.00 by recycling and to date the county has saved 7,500 trees.

Katheryn Shields thanked Congresswoman McCarthy and Senator Bond for their work on the highway bill that benefits Jackson County. It includes \$4.5 million for the Little Blue Expressway and \$4.5 million for Missouri 150 and \$3 million for the construction of Struther Road and Interstate 470 Exchange.

Katheryn Shields, advised the Legislature that the County has spent between 2-3 million dollars for the year 2000 conversion. Her staff distributed an article that appeared in the Kansas City Star that stated Johnson County may spend as much as 17 million for their converson. This reflects a significant savings for the taxpayers of Jackson County.

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, asked Katheryn Shields the status of the Director of the COMBAT Commission since the Director is now working in the County Executive's office.

Janet Colt, Manager of Administration, said Susan Griffle is now the Administrative Assistant to the County Executive which was previously budgeted as the position of Governmental Liaison officer and held by Denise Phillips. She said the Administration has a professional services contract with Denise to finish some projects she had been working on.

Victor E. Callahan asked who is in charge of Public Works.

Katheryn Shields said Jim Davis is acting Director of Public Works until a Director is hired, which should be in approximately two months.
