5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Mike Sanders, County Executive, thanked everyone for working through a difficult situation to balance the 2007 budget. He thanked the transition team, Larry Blick, Anita Maltbia and Fred Siems; the Budget Committee, the courts, Prosecutor, Sheriff, the excellent county employees and the County Legislature. He gave special thanks to Troy Thomas, Director of Finance and Jeremy Willmoth, Assistant Director of Finance for the phenomenal job they did not only for Jackson County but also for the citizens of Jackson County.

The Administration recognizes that there is a potential shortfall in next year's budget so they will begin the process of working with other departments to find ways to make the County more efficient.

He said the County Legislature will receive periodic reports in 2007 from the Administration regarding the financial condition of Jackson County.

Mike Sanders said he is forming two Blue Ribbon Commissions. One commission will reassess how Jackson County is doing assessment, to ensure the process is fair and better serves the taxpayers. The second commission will evaluate COMBAT staff and its structure.

He reported that today was the pretrial conference with Judge Whipple to discuss the jail matrix litigation. He will share the information he receives regarding the conference with the Legislature.

Dan Tarwater thanked Mike and his Administration for their work on the budget. The County Legislature and Administration will be able to do more with less. The taxpayers want Jackson County to get the most out of every dollar and they expect the Executive and Legislature to be watch dogs of the money.

Henry C. Rizzo thanked Mike for forming the two blue ribbon commissions because he thinks COMBAT and Assessment are important departments in Jackson County.

Theresa Garza, County Legislator, asked how many county positions would be eliminated in the 2007 budget.

Mike Sanders, County Executive, said 21 positions were eliminated from the budget. There are roughly 70 vacant positions in Jackson County and the people whose positions have been eliminated can apply for open positions. If they do not wish to apply or are not selected, they will have the opportunity to meet with Human Resources to discuss their options. A packet will be provided to them regarding other employment opportunities or job training ideas. Each individual will receive 6 months of medical and dental insurance paid for by Jackson County to help smooth the transition. Each individual will get a severance package in addition to the sick and vacation time that they have accrued. The County Legislature has generously provided approximately one week compensation for every year of service they have completed with the County, up to a maximum of 8 weeks.

Dan Tarwater said these positions were in departments or jobs that were combined with others that made sense.

Mike Sanders mentioned that MIS and GIS departments have been combined as well as the Public Works and Facilities Management.

Henry C. Rizzo, Vice Chairman, said keeping the number down to 21 positions was magic with a \$6 million deficit. He said the most important asset of Jackson County are the employees.

Mike Sanders said there are no raises in this budget. However, as they look at doing more with less, they must have an eye toward being competitive with other employers. He said they look forward to getting back to the days of giving out raises when appropriate. He realizes that county employees are valuable, he values the hard work they perform to make the Administration and Legislature look good and they need to be rewarded. Mike Sanders said his staff worked hard with the County Legislature to keep the number as low as possible.
