Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, gave special thanks to the Records Response Team. She said privately raised funds were used to send each team member two AMC theater tickets with two soft drinks and a medium popcorn along with their appreciation certificate.

Ken Evans, Public Information Officer, distributed a booklet with information regarding the janitorial services provided by Woodley Building Maintenance.

Katheryn Shields said a list of the janitorial complaints has been compiled and provided to the Legislative Auditor for distribution to the Legislature. She said when Woodley was terminated she declared an emergency for the purchase of temporary janitorial service. The County solicited phone bids and hired B & G Services to clean on a temporary basis until approximately September 1, 1999, so the Purchasing Department can re-bid the contract. Per Mr. Finley's request, Ms. Shields said she would give a detailed report of this bid process to the Legislature prior to the next legislative meeting.

Terry Young, County Legislator, wanted to clarify that she did invite the County Executive to the public hearing today regarding Woodley Building Maintenance. Ms. Shields indicated that she had a conflict with her schedule but could be at the meeting by 2 p.m. Ms. Young was unable to reschedule the meeting because notice had gone out and she was unable to notify everyone of a time change.

Bob Spence, County Legislator, asked questions of the County Executive and asked the Legislative Auditor to verify the answers given.

He asked if the cost of the initial plan for a jail annex was in excess of 30 million. Ms. Shields said the previous Administration had a request for design/build contract for the jail annex that was estimated to be between 28-30 million dollars.

Mr. Spence said he heard it was going to cost several million more dollars to operate the annex. Ms. Shields said there was an estimate from consultants that it would cost almost 16 million dollars per year to operate the annex. The cost to run the existing jail at that time was approximately 11 million annually. There was a 5 million dollar difference in operating expenses.

Mr. Spence asked the legislative auditor to track in the audit of the contracts the County requested enhancements and not just the change orders. Ms. Shields said one such contract was with Mark I in the amount of \$675,000.00 and another \$150,000.00 of change orders that were enhancements to the program.

Mr. Spence asked if the County Executive anticipated the County getting out from under the court order. *Ms.* Shields said it is the decision of Judge Whipple. She said Judge Whipple met with Jane McQueeny, County Counselor, and during their conversation he indicated that he did not have a lot of confidence that Jackson County had the ability to maintain reasonable population levels without input from the federal court. She said the population control program is a program that has saved the County money. Prior to the program, the County was paying nearly \$700,000.00 annually to house prisoners in other facilities. Currently we trade prisoners with Clay County and pay very little. The population control office has a budget of \$501,000.00 in 1999 which includes two staff people who manage the daily population of the jail.

Mr. Spence reiterated *Mr.* Arbanas' request for the amount of money the County has paid to Claudia York, attorney for the inmate class. *Ms.* Shields said the County Counselor's office is working on that and should have an answer by the next legislative meeting.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, asked the legislative auditor to make note of Mr. Spence's questions and concerns regarding the jail annex and discuss them with the staff from the State Auditor's office when they meet on July 19. He said they should be considered in any recommendation regarding the scope of the contract or any further resolutions.

Ms. Shields stated that the jail annex built by this Administration is a smaller jail. It was also designed differently to reduce the cost. However, part of the reason the judge agreed to this was due to the population control coordinator being put into effect.
