WHEREAS, the Board of Police Commissioners of Kansas City, Missouri, has received a grant from the Missouri Department of Public Safety in the amount of \$676,673.98, for the Missouri Western Interdiction and Narcotics (MoWIN) Task Force, of which \$111,203.00 has been allocated to Jackson County; and,

WHEREAS, the County's portion of the grant proceeds will be used to provide salary and a vehicle allowance for two deputies within the Sheriff's Office; and,

WHEREAS, the grant requires no match and is for the period of July 1, 2016, through June 30, 2017; and,

WHEREAS, an appropriation is necessary to place the grant funds in the proper spending accounts; and,

WHEREAS, the County Executive recommends said appropriation; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the

The Compliance Training may be hosted in-person or as a webinar to provide post-award information to include, but not limited to, award acceptance, project implementation, reporting requirements, subaward changes, civil rights compliance, monitoring responsibilities, record retention, internal controls, and accounting responsibilities
- 3. Non-Supplanting: The Subrecipient assures that federal funds made available under this subaward will not be used to supplant other federal, state, or local funds but will be used to increase the amount of funds that would, in the absence of these funds, be made available for the activities of this project.
- 4. Change in Personnel: The Subrecipient agrees to notify, within a timely manner, the Missouri Department of Public Safety if there is a change in or temporary absence as it affects the 'My Profile' module, 'Contact Information' form, and/or 'Budget' form within WebGrants. The notification shall be sent through the 'Correspondence' component of WebGrants to the appropriate Internal Contact with the Change of Information form attached.
- 5. <u>Subaward Adjustments:</u> The Subrecipient understands that any deviation from the approved subaward must have prior approval from the Missouri Department of Public Safety. No additional funding shall be awarded to a Subrecipient but changes from one budget line to another budget line may be possible if the request is allowable and within the scope of the guidelines. Prior approval must be requested via the 'Subaward Adjustment' component of WebGrants.
- 6. Monitoring: The Subrecipient agrees to maintain the records necessary to evaluate the effectiveness of the project. In addition, the Subrecipient assures that all documentation or records relating to this subaward shall be made available to monitoring representatives of the Missouri Department of Public Safety, Office of the Director, immediately upon request. The Subrecipient assures that fund accounting, auditing, monitoring, and such evaluation procedures as may be necessary to keep such records as the

Missouri Department of Public Safety, Office of the Director, shall prescribe, will be provided to assure fiscal control, proper management, and efficient disbursement of funds received under this subaward.

7. Criminal Activity: The Subrecipient assures to formally report to the Missouri Department of Public Safety within 48 hours of notification that a Missouri Department of Public Safety grant-funded individual is arrested for or formally charged with a misdemeanor or felony regardless if the criminal offense is related to the individual's employment. The Missouri Department of Public Safety reserves the right to suspend or terminate grant funding pending the adjudication of the criminal offense.

The Subrecipient shall not make false statements or claims in connection with any Office of Justice Programs or DPS state-funded grant. 8. Non-Disclosure Agreements: The Subrecipient understands it cannot require any employee or contractor to sign an internal confidentiality agreement or statement that prohibits or otherwise restricts, or purports to prohibit or restrict, the reporting (in accordance with law) of waste, fraud, or abuse to an investigative or law enforcement representative of a federal department or agency authorized to receive such information.

The foregoing is not intended, and shall not be understood by the Subrecipient, to contravene requirements applicable to Standard Form 312 (which relates to classified information), Form 4414 (which relates to sensitive compartmented information), or any other form issued by a federal department of agency governing the nondisclosure of classified information.

In accepting this subaward, the Subrecipient:

- a. Represents that it neither requires nor has required internal confidentiality agreements or statements from employees or contractors that currently prohibit or otherwise currently restrict (or purport to prohibit or restrict) employees or contractors from reporting waste, fraud, or abuse as described above; and
- b. Certifies that, if it learns or is notified that it is or has been requiring its employees or contractors to exercise agreements or statements that prohibit or otherwise restrict (or purport to prohibit or

restrict), reporting of waste, fraud, or abuse as described above, it will immediately stop any further obligations of award funds, will provide prompt written notification to the Missouri Department of public Safety, and will resume (or permit resumption of) such obligations only if expressly authorized to do so by the Missouri Department of Public Safety.

Lobbying: The Subrecipient understands and agrees that it cannot use any federal funds, either directly
or indirectly, in support of the enactment, repeal, modification or adoption of any law, regulation or policy,
at any level of government,

Applicants for DPS awards with total costs expected to exceed \$100,000 are required to certify that (1) they have not made, and will not make, such a prohibited payment, (2) they will be responsible for reporting the use of non-appropriated funds for such purposes, and (3) they will include these requirements in consortium agreements and contracts under grants that will exceed \$100,000 and obtain necessary certifications from those consortium participants and contractors.

The signature of the authorized organizational official on the application serves as the required certification of compliance for the applicant organization. DPS appropriated funds may not be used to pay the salary or expenses of an employee of a Subrecipient, consortium participant, or contractor or those of an agent related to any activity designed to influence legislation or appropriations pending before Congress or any State legislature.

- 10. Fair Labor Standards Act: All Subrecipients of federal funds will comply with the minimum wage and maximum hour's provisions of the Federal Fair Labor Standards Act.
- 11. Employment of Unauthorized Aliens: Pursuant to Section 285.530.1 RSMo, the Subrecipient assures that it does not knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien to perform work within the State of Missouri, and shall affirm, by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation, its enrollment and participation in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees working in connection with the contracted services. Further, the Subrecipient shall sign an affidavit affirming that it does not knowingly employ any person who is an unauthorized alien in connection with the contracted services.

In accordance with <u>Sections 285.525 to 285.550</u>, <u>RSMo</u> a general contractor or subcontractor of any tier shall not be liable when such contractor or subcontractor contracts with its direct subcontractor who violates subsection 1 of Section 285.530, RSMo if the contract binding the contractor and subcontractor affirmatively states that the direct subcontractor is not knowingly in violation of subsection 1 of Section 285.530, RSMo and shall not henceforth be in such violation and the contractor or subcontractor receives a sworn affidavit under the penalty of perjury attesting to the fact that the direct subcontractor's employees are lawfully present in the United States.

- 12. <u>Relationship</u>: The Subrecipient agrees that they will represent themselves to be an independent Subrecipient offering such services to the general public and shall not represent themselves or their employees to be employees of the Missouri Department of Public Safety or the Office of the Director. Therefore, the Subrecipient shall assume all legal and financial responsibility for taxes, FICA, employee fringe benefits, workers' compensation, employee insurance, minimum wage requirements, overtime, etc.
- 13. <u>Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)</u>: The Subrecipient assures that its law enforcement agency is in full compliance with the state provisions of <u>Section 43.505 RSMo</u> relating to uniform crime reporting and will remain in full compliance for the duration of the project period.
- 14. <u>Racial Profiling</u>: The Subrecipient assures that its law enforcement agency is in full compliance with the state provisions of <u>Section 590.650 RSMo</u> relating to racial profiling and will remain in full compliance for the duration of the project period.
- Federal Equitable Sharing Funds: The Subrecipient assures that its law enforcement agency is in compliance with the state provisions of <u>Section 513.653 RSMo</u> relating to participation in the federal

forfeiture system and the reporting of proceeds received therefrom to the Missouri Department of Public Safety and the Missouri State Auditor.

- 16. <u>Custodial Interrogations</u>: The Subrecipient assures that its law enforcement agency is in full compliance with the state provisions of <u>Section 590.700 RSMo</u> relating to custodial interrogations and has adopted a written policy to record custodial interrogations of persons suspected of committing or attempting to commit the felony crimes described in subsection 2 of this section.
- 17. <u>DWI Law:</u> The Subrecipient assures that its law enforcement agency is in full compliance with <u>Section 577.005 RSMo</u> relating to the "DWI Law" and has adopted a written policy to forward arrest information for all intoxication-related traffic offenses to the central repository as required by <u>Section 43.503 RSMo</u>. In addition, the Subrecipient assures that its county prosecuting attorney or municipal prosecutor is in full compliance with <u>Section 577.005 RSMo</u> relating to the "DWI Law" and has adopted a written policy to forward all charge information for intoxication-related traffic offenses to the central repository as required by <u>Section 43.503 RSMo</u>.
- 18. <u>Texting While Driving</u>: Pursuant to Executive Order 13513, "Federal Leadership on Reducing Text Messaging While Driving," 74 Fed. Reg. 51225 (October 1, 2009), the Missouri Department of Public Safety encourages the Subrecipient to adopt and enforce policies banning employees from text messaging while driving any vehicle during the course of performing work funded by this grant, and to establish workplace safety policies and conduct education, awareness, and other outreach to decrease crashes caused by distracted drivers.
- 19. <u>Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988</u>: The Subrecipient assures that it will comply, and all its subcontractors will comply, with the <u>Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988</u>. The Law further requires that all individual contractors and grant recipients, regardless of dollar amount/value of the contract or grant, comply with the Law.
- 20. <u>ACORN</u>: Subrecipients understand and agree that it cannot use any federal funds, either directly or indirectly, in support of any contract or subaward to either the Association of Community Organizations for Reform Now (ACORN) or its subsidiaries, without the express prior written approval of OJP.
- 21. 4. Equal Employment Opportunity Plan (EEOP): The Subrecipient agrees to comply with the applicable requirements of 28 C.F.R. pt 42, subpt. These monies may not be utilized to pay debts incurred by other activities. The Subrecipient agrees to obligate funds no later than the last day of the project period. Any deviation from the approved subaward must have prior approval from the Missouri Department of Public Safety. The Subrecipient shall fully coordinate all activities in the performance of the project with those of the Missouri Department of Public Safety. The Subrecipient certifies that all expendable and non-expendable property purchased funds under this subaward shall be used for approved project purposes only.
- 5. <u>Financial Reporting Requirements</u>: The Subrecipient agrees to complete and submit any financial reports required for this program as outlined in the "JAG Solicitation". - 6. <u>Project Income</u>: The Subrecipient agrees to account for project income generated by the activities of this subaward, and shall report receipts and expenditures of this income on the monthly Claim report. The Subrecipient understands that all project income generated as a result of this subaward shall be expended during the life of the project period, unless otherwise stated.
- 7. Procurement: The Subrecipient assures that all procurement transactions whether negotiated or competitively bid and without regard to dollar value shall be conducted in a manner to provide maximum open and free competition. In addition, the Subrecipient assures that all procurement transactions will meet the minimum standards set forth in the "DPS Financial and Administrative Guidelines" and identified here:

grown within the state of Missouri and to all firms, corporations, or individuals doing business as Missouri firms, corporations, or individuals, or which maintain Missouri offices or places of business, when quality is equal or better and delivered price is the same or less, quality of performance promised is equal or better and the price quoted is the same or less, or when competing bids are comparable.

D. Have not within a three year period preceding this application had one or more public transactions (Federal, State, or Local) terminated for cause or default

- 11. <u>Audit</u>: The Subrecipient agrees to comply with the organizational audit requirements of <u>OMB Circular A-133</u>, <u>Audits of States</u>, <u>Local Governments</u>, <u>and Non-Profit Organizations</u>. This guidance states that non-federal entities that expend \$750,000 or more in federal funds (from all sources including pass-through sub-awards) in the agency's fiscal year (12-month turnaround reporting period) shall have a single organization wide audit conducted in accordance with the provisions of as further described in the <u>OJP Financial Guide</u>, <u>Chapter 3.19</u>, <u>Audit Requirements</u>. In the event of termination pursuant to this paragraph, all documents, data, and reports prepared by the Subrecipient under the subaward shall, at the option of the Missouri Department of Public Safety, become property of the State of Missouri.

In the event that the Missouri Department of Public Safety determines that a Subrecipient is operating in a manner inconsistent with the provisions of the application or is failing to comply with the applicable state requirements governing these funds, the Missouri Department of Public Safety may permanently or temporarily terminate the subaward. In the event a subaward is permanently terminated, the Missouri Department of Public Safety may take action as deemed appropriate to recover any portion of the subaward funds remaining or an amount equal to the portion of the subaward funds wrongfully used.

In addition, bulletproof vests purchased with JAG funds must be American-made. The latest NIJ standard information can be found at http://www.nij.gov/topics/technology/body-armor/safety-initiative.htm.
- 3. <u>Bulletproof Vest Policy</u>: The Subrecipient understands if monies are requested and awarded for the purchase of bulletproof vests that the law enforcement agency must have a written "mandatory wear" policy in effect. Per BJA, there are no requirements regarding the nature of the policy other than it being a mandatory wear policy for all uniformed officers while on duty. The Subrecipient will be required to forward a copy of such policy to the Missouri Department of Public Safety at the time of acceptance of the subaward.
- 4. <u>Criminal Intelligence Systems</u>: The Subrecipient agrees that any information technology system funded or supported by OJP funds will comply with 28 C.F.R. Part 23, Criminal Intelligence Systems Operating Policies, if OJP determines this regulation to be applicable. Should OJP determine 28 C.F.R. No monies from this subaward may be obligated to support methamphetamine lab operations unless the Subrecipient agrees to this special condition and fully participates in implementation of the Mitigation Plan.
- 7. NEPA: The Subrecipient agrees to assist BJA in complying with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the National Historic Preservation Act, and other related federal environmental impact analyses requirements in the use of these grant funds, either directly or indirectly. Will the event reach a geographic area that is not adequately served by COMBAT? (If YES, describe): The focus of this summit is on schools located in Kansas City, MO. Principals from approximately 100 elementary schools will be invited to participate.

Will the event reach an underserved or high risk population (in terms of Substance Abuse or Violence Prevention)? If YES, describe:

We know that when students are not in school, they are not building a strong foundation for learning. Studies have shown that boys of color, specifically African-American boys, have a greater likeliness to be suspended from school. Missouri is one of eleven states who reported higher gaps than the national average between the suspension rates of black students and white students for both boys and girls. One in four KCMO black male K-3 students were suspended in 2015. This event will show the discrepancies in suspensions throughout Kansas City, and hopefully provide insight, highlighting new ways of confronting students.

Will the event reach a key possible partner (and audience) that can help further COMBAT goals? If YES, describe:

This event will offer access to the leaders at the Health Department, the Mayor's office, and elementary schools. The event provides an opportunity to forge a relationship with statisticians at the Health Department that might be able to provide key data and analysis for COMBAT programs and evaluations. The event also provides the opportunity to reach school Principals, who are important partners in violence prevention efforts.

Turn the Page KC, the KC Health Department, and the Mayor's Office will convene district and building administrators – the leaders of Kansas City, MO elementary schools – to review aggregate and building level suspension data. Each school will be provided with a booklet that includes (a) city-wide aggregate data analyzed in several ways, and (b) exclusive building level data. After reviewing the findings and bright spots where leaders have successfully reduced suspensions, attendees will be invited to draft proposals of policies/programs they want to implement in their schools. Technical assistance will be offered to schools to measure whether policy changes at the school level significantly affected student outcomes.

- **5.** Is the Mission of the requesting organization compatible with that of COMBAT (list): The mission of Turn the Page KC is to mobilize the community to achieve reading proficiency at grade level or above for all third graders in Kansas City, Missouri. Reading at grade level by the end of third grade is one of the best predictors of high school graduation. Since students that drop out of school are more likely to engage in substance abuse related crime, the mission of Turn the Page KC fits with COMBAT's *Prevention* strategy.
- 6. Is there any conflict between the Mission of COMBAT and that of the requesting organization (list); or its other sponsors (e.g., other sponsors include liquor companies). Describe any possible such conflict:

There is no conflict between the Mission of COMBAT and Turn the Page KC, the Health Department, or the Kansas City Mayor's Office.



Summit on Chronic Absenteeism and School Suspensions in Grades K-3 (Planning Memo Shared by Mayor's Office, Health Department, and TTPKC)

Students that cannot read at grade level by the end of 3rd grade are four times less likely than their peers to graduate from high school. Chronic absenteeism is one of the greatest obstacles to 3rd grade reading success. Although some reasons for school absences are difficult to prevent, many students are told to stay home by their schools. Boys of Color—particularly Black boys—in Preschool through Grade 3 are significantly more likely to be suspended or expelled from school for identical infractions as their white counterparts

According to a 2015 study out of the University of California, Los Angeles, Missouri has the highest rate of preschool suspension of black males in the United States. One in four KCMO black male K-3 students were suspended in 2015.

Because Kansas City has made 3rd

Grade Reading level a city-wide priority, the Health Department, the Mayor's Office and Turn the Page KC partnered to analyze racial and gender bias in discipline and convene public, charter and private schools to examine policies and propose changes.

On May 25th, these institutions will convene district and building administrators – the leaders of Kansas City, MO elementary schools – to review aggregate and building level suspension data. Each school will be provided with a booklet that includes (a) city-wide aggregate data analyzed in several ways, and (b) exclusive building level data. Although individual building statistics will be shared only with that school, aggregate data will be presented by Dr. Sarah Martin-Anderson. After reviewing the findings and bright spots where leaders have successfully reduced suspensions, attendees will be invited to draft proposals of policies/programs they want to implement in their schools. Technical assistance will be offered to schools to measure whether policy changes at the school level significantly affected student outcomes. This incentive – in the form of technical assistance evaluation services – will be awarded to the most promising solutions.

THIS AGREEMENT is made this <u>30</u> day of <u>January</u>, <u>2017</u> by and between the Central Jackson County Fire Protection District (CJCFPD) (hereinafter the "Owner", and Jackson County Park and Rec (hereinafter the "User").

WHEREAS, Owner controls Property located at 4715 W. 40 Hwy, Blue Springs, Mo 64015 which User desires to use for purposes of conducting exercises, classes, meetings, conferences, or demonstrations for educational purposes; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to enter into an agreement, setting forth their respective rights and responsibilities relating to the usage of the Property.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. **Permission to Use.** Owner hereby gives User the permission to use the following portions of the Property during the above Time Period for the above described Type of Event (hereinafter the "Event"). Each such Event to consist of usage during one calendar day for a period not to exceed eight (8) hours, with all such days to be scheduled in advance subject to availability as provided in paragraph 7, below. In licensing the Property hereunder, however, Owner does not relinquish its right to control the Property and to enforce all necessary and proper rules for the management and operation of the same.
- 2. Audio Visual Support and Use. The CJCFPD Training Center classrooms and auditorium (not breakout classrooms) are equipped with a desktop computer loaded with the Microsoft Office 2007 suite, a fixed data projector and DVD/VHS player. Also available is a mobile visual presenter and a public access Wi-Fi network. All of these features are included in the classroom rental fee. It is strongly recommended the User arrive at the Training Center forty-five minutes before the scheduled event to ensure the equipment is working and their software programs are compatible with the system. To use the Training Center computer the users should bring a CD-ROM or USB drive with their presentation. If possible, arriving the day before would be preferred. Individuals who intend to use their own laptops in the classroom MUST contact the Training Center's Coordinator at 816-229-9118 two days prior to the event. A member of the TC staff will assist in the connection of your laptop to the room projector. Under NO circumstances should users manipulate any connections with AV equipment in the classroom.
- 3. Payment of Fee. User agrees to pay Owner the Usage Fee as stated above. Payment is due upon receipt of an invoice. User agrees to pay interest and attorney's fees if the invoice is not paid upon receipt. Prior to User's use of the Property, User agrees to tender to owner the damage/security deposit as stated above. Cancelation without at least seven days notice shall result in the forfeiture of the damage/security deposit referenced above.
- Beverages and Consumables. Beverages are available upon request at the rates listed below. User shall be responsible to Owner for the
 associated costs:
 - Vending machines are on site. You are welcome to bring in your own refreshments.
- Coffee can be provided at a cost of \$5.00 per urn. This also includes creamers, sugar, cups, and stirrers.
- Local catering companies can be provided.

- Damage/Security Deposit. Damage to or loss or destruction of the Property and items contained therein (including appliances, equipment, furniture and furnishings, if any) caused by the User, or any guest, invitee, or employee of User, shall be promptly repaired or replaced by User to the satisfaction of Owner, or in lieu of such repair or replacement, User shall pay to Owner an amount of money sufficient to compensate for the required repair and /or replacement. This includes any stains due to spilled beverages or food. Owner may retain the Damage/Security Deposit in full or partial satisfaction of any liability of User hereunder.
- 6. **Safety Guidelines.** User agrees to comply with all rules, regulations, guidelines and suggestions set forth by the Owner. This facility is tobacco free with designated smoking areas identified. These rules are to be enforced by the User.
- Purpose and Restrictions. User may not use the Property for any purpose other than the Event as described above. User agrees to all restrictions and instructions regarding the use of the Property. User shall not use the Property for any unlawful purpose or any purpose inconsistent with the purposes of Owner. INTRODUCED BY Alfred Jordan, County Legislator

WHEREAS, by Resolution 17999, dated October 15, 2012, the Legislature did authorize the execution of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Carpenters' District Council of Greater St. Louis & Vicinity to govern the terms and conditions of employment of members of its bargaining unit within the Prosecuting Attorney's Office through December 31, 2016; and,

WHEREAS, by Resolution 19334, dated December 5, 2017, the Legislature did authorize the extension of the MOU with the Carpenters' District Council of Greater St. Louis & Vicinity, through February 15, 2017; and,

WHEREAS, the parties have continued negotiations on a successor MOU, but have not yet reached agreement; and,

WHEREAS, in view of the pending negotiations, and in anticipation of arriving at a successor MOU, the Legislature has determined that it is appropriate to extend the terms of the prior MOU, through March 15, 2017; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the County Executive and the Prosecuting Attorney be and hereby are authorized to execute an Agreement to extend the MOU with the Carpenters' District Council of Greater St. Louis & Vicinity, for a period ending March 15, 2017, in a form to be approved by the County Counselor.
