Re: RFP 19-18 Committee Evaluation and Recommendation

On May 3, 2018, the Finance and Purchasing Department received three qualified responses to the Request for Proposals 19-18 for the Comprehensive Medical, Dental and Pharmaceutical Services for the Inmate Population at the Jackson County Detention Center, Regional Correctional Center and KCPD arrestees. The following correctional medical providers submitted proposals: Correctional Health Partners (CHP), Advanced Correctional Healthcare (ACH) and Mend Correctional Care.

The six member Evaluation Committee's scores and ranking are as follows:

The Evaluation Committee, under advisement by the County Counselor's Office was able to negotiate the terms and conditions of an agreement. The Committee recommends that ACH's exceptions listed in Exhibit F are allowed except for the one referencing Para 14.7.1 (Hold Harmless and Indemnify) which will be covered in the mutually agreed contract.

The term of the contract is 36 months (3 years) that will automatically renew for two successive one year periods. The annualized amount to be paid to ACH is \$4,040,217.26. Upon the annual anniversary of the agreement, the annualized amount of increase for compensation will be the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for medical care or zero percent (0%), whichever is higher.

The Evaluation Committee recommends that Advanced Correctional Healthcare (ACH) be awarded the contract for RFP 19-18.

Medical Supplies (disposable)

Typically includes tongue blades, Band-Aids, gauze pads, medical tape, sterile water, saline, pregnancy tests, blood sugar strips, peak flow mouth pieces, O2 tubing, urine test strips, syringes, gloves for the medical staff, med cups, lancets, ammonia ampules, cotton-tip applicators, and alcohol preps. ACH may provide some initial medical supplies.

ACH pays for medical supplies.

Medical Equipment (durable)

Farm Ry

Typically includes exam table, exam stool, ophthalmic / otoscope, peak flow meter, digital thermometer, stethoscope, X-large and large blood pressure cuffs, refrigerator (small), and scales. ACH may provide some initial medical equipment.

The county pays for medical equipment.

Mobile Services (such as laboratory, X-ray)

Pool money pays for mobile services.

Off-site Services (such as ambulance transportation, hospitalization, etc.)

Pool money pays for off-site services.

Office Supplies (disposable)

Typically includes medical charts, paper, pens, staples, and Post-It notes.

ACH pays for office supplies.

Office Equipment (durable)

Typically includes a locking file, paper punch, staple remover, stapler, cabinet for storing medical supplies, computer, fax machine, copier/printer, and toner.

The county pays for office equipment.

Annual Pool

\$100,000 to pay for items noted in the overview including all pharmaceuticals, hospital inpatient and out-patient services, specialty services, dental, lab, x-ray, and ambulance services with all left over monies returned to the county.

Medical Claims Re-Pricing ACH will be responsible for the re-pricing of medical claims. Once claims are received, ACH will calculate the applicable discount, confirm the integrity of the claim and process for payment.

Tuberculosis (TB) Skin Tests For incarcerated patients: ACH pays for the TB serum and related supplies.

Biomedical Waste Disposal For facility staff: The county pays for the TB serum and related supplies.

ACH will be responsible for the provision of biomedical waste disposal services for the medical unit at the facility consistent with all applicable laws. Typical biomedical waste expected in the medical unit would be bandages, dressings, gloves, hypodermic needles,

laboratory containers, sharps, and syringes. ACH pays for biomedical waste disposal.

Electronic Medical Records (EMR) ACH partners with Advanced Inmate Medical Management, LLC to provide DetainEMR software, which was specially designed for use in the jail setting. Free troubleshooting. ACH provides EMR and all necessary hardware and software at no charge to Jackson County.
