



<p>REQUEST SUMMARY</p>	<p>A resolution authorizing the County Executive to execute agreements with certain outside agencies funded by the County's Anti-Drug Sales Tax Fund for the 2010 fiscal year, which are engaged in Drug Abuse Resistant Education (D.A.R.E.) and D.A.R.E. like prevention activities and purposes, not to exceed \$824,101.00</p> <p>Exhibit A indicates the outside agencies and funding levels as recommended by the Jackson County Drug Commission for the 2010 fiscal year.</p> <p>Background: The Anti-Drug Sales Tax fund authorizes the County to execute agreements and contracted service for the purpose of providing substance abuse treatment, prevention, grant match, and other anti-drug initiatives in the community.</p> <p>Exhibit A indicates the county department and the outside agencies that the Jackson County Drug Commission is recommending funding in 2010 to provide D.A.R.E. and/or D.A.R.E.-like services in Jackson County.</p>										

	<p>Several meetings were conducted between COMBAT, DARE officers, and the respective Chief of Police of the various departments, during which several different funding allocations were examined and discussed. Final consensus was reached that the funding allocation formula be based upon the number of students enrolled in the core classes (either 5th or 6th grade plus one middle school grade).</p> <p>Funding recommendations were presented to the Jackson County Drug Commission on April 6, 2010, with the recommendation that the funding recommendation in Exhibit A be presented to the Jackson County Legislature.</p>
