## 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, presented employee of the month awards. The May 2002 Employee of the Month Award was presented to Robert Crowe, Jerry Galloway and Stan Grigg. These gentlemen were able to fix one of the X-ray machines in the courthouse so that the County did not have to make an expensive, out of state service call.

The award for June 2002 went to Marla Croy, an employee in the Payroll Department. She discovered an error in a paycheck for one of the MIS employees that he had failed to see. She corrected the mistake and personally informed the employee and he received his correct check in a timely fashion with minimum inconvenience.

The award for July 2002 went to Dan Davis, an employee in the MIS Department, who has been working closely with the development of the new web site. He worked hard to integrate the HART records search engine into the web site as well as working on the on-line job application and several other Internet initiatives that help Jackson County patrons get on-line, not in line.

Katheryn Shields announced that the 2002 Jackson County "Energy and Environmental Awareness Showcase" will be held on Thursday, October 10th at Bartle Hall starting at 11 A.M. This free event is sponsored by Johnson Controls and is part of the "Progress as Promised" initiative, which is designed to make our County buildings more energy efficient. All Jackson County employees are being encouraged to attend the event in order to be educated on topics such as energy use, recycling, building automation and HVAC. During this event, Jackson County will be receiving a national EPA "WasteWise" award. The award, given to only 2 of 144 eligible local governments nationwide, recognizes those partners who achieved and reported the most impressive waste reduction results for 2001. She said she was proud and honored to receive this award on behalf of Jackson County and she thanked the Legislature for their support on environmental initiatives.

Victor E. Callahan and Katheryn Shields met with the Mayors of several Jackson County municipalities last week regarding stop gap funding for bus routes in eastern Jackson County. Katheryn agreed to request monies from the Legislature after receiving proposals for funding from all the cities involved.

Katheryn Shields announced that the Kansas City Election Board is in need of judges and workers on election day, November 5, 2002. She encouraged interested individuals to participate in this community service opportunity. Scott Burnett, County Legislator, said they are in need of 1,200 workers and anyone interested should contact the Kansas City Election Board at (816) 842-4820.
