5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, presented the Employee of the Month Award to Aquita Westley, Human Resources Analyst who has worked with Jackson County since 1997. She processes the paperwork for all new hires in Jackson County. In January, Aquita's supervisor went on maternity leave and she assumed the added duties without missing a beat. Aquita received the Employee of the Month Award for February 2003.

Katheryn reported that Jackson County's new GIS Department has received \$45,000.00 in matching grant funds from the U.S. Geological Survey for its aerial photography project.

She also encouraged the County Legislature to vote affirmatively for the agenda item dealing with placing the Anti-Drug Sales Tax issue (COMBAT) on the August ballot.

Henry Rizzo, County Legislator, commended Katheryn Shields for working with the General Assembly and with lobbyist, Bill Waris. Last week, he called the County Executive because some additional language was necessary to pass an amendment. Katheryn made a phone call and because of her quick response the amendment was passed and the money we had in the budget was saved.

Katheryn Shields said Jackson County now has State TIF for the Harry S Truman Sports Complex. So as opportunities come forward for economic development there, we have one more tool in place to help. She commended Henry Rizzo for bringing issues to her attention and Representative Bob Johnson for getting the language included in a couple of bills and then successfully passing them.
