Katheryn Shields announced that our Public Works Road and Bridge Division will complete its move into the new Vehicle Service Center this Wednesday, two weeks ahead of schedule. They originally planned on moving on June 5, 2002. The project also came in under budget, saving the county at least \$100,000.00 in construction costs. A dedication ceremony is scheduled to be held on Wednesday, June 5, 2002 at 2 P.M. and invitations have been mailed. The new Vehicle Service Center is located at 34900 E. Old 40 Highway between Grain Valley and Oak Grove. The location was moved to a more central location of the unincorporated area of Jackson County where a majority of the road and bridge work takes place.
