WHEREAS, Ms. Mitchell's aptitude and determination is to be honored as she set a path for women in a male dominated profession being firefighting; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Jackson County Legislature hereby honors the late Captain Carolyn Mitchell for her trailblazing contributions to the firefighting profession.
