## 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said this year she was asked to be the honorary Chair of Kansas City's American Heart Walk on June 12, 2004. The American Heart Walk promotes physical activity and heart-healthy living in a fun family environment. It is to raise funds to fight America's No. 1 and No. 3 killers - heart disease and stroke. Proceeds from this event and the "Go Red for Women" campaign will go to fund lifesaving research. Jackson County has agreed to participate and raise \$20,000.00. This is achievable by having 200 walkers and each walker raising \$100 in pledges. Employees will be receiving information about how to get involved and there will be team captains from each department. Local sponsors include Humana and Truman Medical Center as well as other corporate and government participants. Again, the American Heart Walk is scheduled for June 12, 2004 at Mill Creek Park located at 47th and Broadway.

She was pleased to report that requests for tax rebate applications for low income seniors continues to increase. Last week the number had tripled to over 1,800 and this week the total is 2,055. The average refund for the Missouri Circuit Breaker is \$450. So assuming 2,055 people qualify for the average refund, this means almost \$925,000 for Jackson County seniors. Katheryn said she was proud of the program and very pleased with the results.
