Dixie Flynn said the County Legislature needs to develop a policy on Tax Increment Financing.

Victor E. Callahan stated the three (3) legal reasons he opposes the ordinances relating to Tax Increment Financing (TIF):

- 1 The basic philosophical point that it is inappropriate and against the very foundations of government decision making, for an inferior government entity, a municipality, to expend the money and resources of a superior government entity, the County.
- 2 Regarding the drug tax expenditure, the ballot language that enacted the Anti-Drug Sales Tax which was approved by the voters of Jackson County, stated the money would only be used for fighting drug and drug related crimes. There was no contemplation that a portion of these funds would be used to pay redevelopment costs for a TIF project.
- 3 Victor Callahan would like to challenge the definition of blight used by the developers. This real estate is one of the most expensive in Eastern Jackson County, across from the Independence Center.
