# 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said that two unique initiatives in Jackson County are receiving national attention. They have captured the attention of the National Association of Counties (NACo). As a result, the Association has asked Ms. Shields to present these Jackson County programs as national models at NACo's annual conference to be held in Milwaukee, Wisconsin on Monday, July 14, 2003.

She will participate in panels focusing on the areas of mental health and energy performance. She said she is honored to be invited to share Jackson County's approach in these areas with other counties, and she hopes to learn from them as well. The Vision our citizens helped create in 1999 says, in part, that 'Jackson County will be the catalyst to resolve regional issues that improve the quality of life of all residents.' She said she is proud to see the vision of our citizens becoming a reality through these initiatives and others.

The Mental Health Workshop is entitled "The Sheriff, the Commissioner and the Judge: The Essential Partnership for Diverting the Mentally III from Jail." Katheryn said she will serve on a panel that includes the Sheriff of Los Angeles County, California and the District Attorney of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The panel will be moderated by NACo President, Ken Mayfield.

Beginning in the 1990's, the County Executive began bringing together a wide range of strategies and partnerships designed to provide treatment for the mentally ill and their families. In the ensuing years, Jackson County has created a comprehensive "three-tiered safety net" made up of in-jail treatment, mental health courts and crisis intervention teams in local law enforcement. Jackson County's community-wide and cooperative approach is unique in the nation.

The Energy Performance initiative is part of the County's environmental program. As the title of the County's presentation states, it is about "Saving Energy, Money and the Environment." Jackson County began a unique partnership with Johnson Controls in 1999, to improve the environment, county facilities and energy awareness. Jackson County is making needed improvements to four of its buildings, and taxpayers will actually save about 7.6 million over the next 15 years. Johnson Controls designed and installed energy-efficient building improvements including: steam energy and lighting retrofits, plumbing upgrades, indoor air quality sensors, and the installation of a Metasys building automation system. In keeping with Jackson County's environmental standards, Johnson Controls committed to recycling at least one-half of the old equipment and materials removed from the buildings, as well as construction waste.

Katheryn Shields said she was honored to be invited to make presentations on these initiatives. She said none of the successes would have been possible without the cooperation and support of the County Legislature.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, said he would like a report from Johnson Controls showing the savings.

Katheryn Shields said she will share the six month report from Johnson Controls with the County Legislature at the legislative meeting scheduled to be held on Monday, July 21, 2003.
