5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, announced that this is the third year the Jackson County Recycling Committee will decorate a float and participate in the St. Patrick's Day Parade. She added that the "Blue Knights", a 12 member honor guard created last year by the Corrections Department, will march in the parade. The float will be delivered on Wednesday, March 15, 2000 to the garage at the Kansas City Courthouse and employees parking on the west side of the garage will need to park elsewhere. There was a drawing contest for children of Jackson County employees and the winners of the contest will ride on the float. All drawings will be blown up and displayed on the float. She invited all of the legislators, their children and grandchildren to ride on the float on St. Patrick's Day.

The Jackson County recycling committee has saved over \$150,000.00 of taxpayer money since its inception in 1996. Jackson County has recycled over 900 tons of paper saving over 14,000 trees. Katheryn Shields thanked all the volunteers of the recycling committee and commended them on their good work.

Katheryn Shields reported that 10 of the 16 shelters in Fleming Park have been replaced. The new shelters include new tables, grills and swing sets and will be open to the public on May 15, 2000. This project began last Spring and will continue through Fall until all shelters are completed.

Katheryn Shields introduced Thomas Warford, the employee of the month for January, 2000. He is a park ranger who has worked six years for Jackson County. He is commended for his outstanding work and for going above and beyond his call of duty. He volunteered to change his work schedule from 3-11 p.m. to 11 p.m. - 7 a.m. from mid November to January, 2000 in order to assist with security at Christmas in the Park. While working one morning, he saw suspects attempting to destroy some of the displays but was able to stop them from preventing extensive damage. She thanked him and presented him with a certificate, pin and check and congratulated him on receiving this award.
