Sandy Schermerhorn, County Counselor, said she has not yet seen the lawsuit but will review it when received and report back to the Legislature next week.

Bob Boley, Director of Assessment, explained the process used to reassess property in Jackson County, which is done every two years. He also answered questions from the Legislature.

14 NEW BUSINESS

Dixie M. Flynn, Legislator, asked how many names would be considered for the Jackson County Sports Complex Authority.

Victor E. Callahan, Chairman, said the letter from Governor Carnahan said that because Mr. Mackey has resigned from the Sports Authority the three name panel submitted is now incomplete. Therefore, the Legislature will nominate only one replacement candidate to complete the panel of three.

Victor E. Callahan stated that there will be no legislative meeting on July 7, 1997 in observence of Independence Day.
