WHEREAS, The Storytellers, Inc., is a unique program for current and new drug court participants in the Mental Toughness Project, which uses creative problem-solving methods for dealing with the participants' individual life problems; and,

WHEREAS, the Prosecuting Attorney's Office desires to enter into an agreement with The Storytellers, Inc., to provide weekly sessions to participants in the Mental Toughness Project for a period of December 1, 2010, through December 31, 2011, at a cost to the County not to exceed \$22,000.00; and,

WHEREAS, this agreement is in the best interest of the health, welfare, and safety of the citizens of Jackson County; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the County Executive be and hereby is authorized to execute a contract with The Storytellers, Inc., of Kansas City (Jackson County), MO, in a form to be approved by the County Counselor;

and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Finance and Purchasing be and hereby is authorized to make all payments, including final payment on the agreement.

Effective Date: This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its passage by a majority of the Legislature.

Scope of service:

To provide weekly sessions to current participants and new participants in the Mental Toughness project from December 2010 through December 2011 for no less than 40 sessions and no more than 45 sessions. This is a unique opportunity to provide transition programming while using creative problem solving methods dealing with the participants' individual life problems. Real time skill development with alternative methods in decision making and creating positive solutions will be the focus.

Sessions will occur once a week as well as branching out to area establishments, providing a wider scope of vision for participants and potential networking.

Another group will start the 18 session Mental Toughness Project that will provide new participants with an alternative to criminal charges and incarceration. Replicating the successful 2010 interactive based program, the new participants will begin to develop social skills, team work, a broader personal vision and communication skills.

Total Program Cost: \$22,000.00. The average cost is \$349.21 per session. This includes: Materials, incentives, and facilitation fess.

Michael Vance Toombs is an accomplished painter, art activist, and founder and CEO of Storytellers Inc., Artist Collective. Mr. Toombs is a community leader and champion for young people and working artists in the Greater Kansas City area. Michael began as a young student with Matthew Monks at the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art. He furthered his study through classes at the Kansas City Art Institute and completed a business entrepreneurial course of study through Donnelly College, Kansas City, Kansas. Michael left the corporate world as customer service manager for GEHA Insurance for 8 years where he help setup their customer service dept. which handled 3500 calls a day with 75 customer service reps. I left to develop my own business in the belief that "Art is a Change Agent for society's difficulties." Michael's art form is "interactive community based art". As Executive Director of Storytellers Inc, Michael has developed contracts with many high profile organizations including University of Missouri, Wichita State University, Environmental Protection Agency, Accessible Arts, Bartle Convention Center, Olorun Foundation in Burkina Faso, West Africa, Kansas City Kansas Public Schools, Kansas City Kansas Housing Authority, Jackson County Family Courts and C.O.M.B.A.T – Jackson County Prosecutors Office.

• Interactive Art Education projects for Youth

- O Storytellers Inc. in partnership with another youth serving organization developed a model of education for the *Department of Education* (AEMDD grant), making academics more accessible and understandable through the arts.
- O Storytellers Inc won the privilege of creating six installations at KCI Airport entitled *Thirty Years of KCI Airport and Celebrating the Legacy*, through Kansas City Municipal Arts Commission's One Percent for Art program. Storytellers, Inc. was also given the challenge of creating a temporary installation, the Barrier Project, consisting of 90 panels, designed by Michael Toombs, implemented by the artist collective with the young people of KCKS and KCMO.
- O The Storytellers Inc., Artist Collective has served over 14,000 young people in arts programming by contract and voluntarily in the last 7 years. Michael Toombs has provided arts education workshops in diverse settings including KIDZONE/Finish the Race Extended, Day, TREC Alternative School, Kansas City Kansas Public Schools, Kansas City Missouri School District, Gifted Students, Teachers in Relationships, Jackson County Juvenile Correction facilities, FEC work project, Jackson County and KCK Housing Authority, JTPA Jobs Program of Kansas City Kansas, and Summer Science Academy 9th –12th grades for the University of Kansas Medical Center.
- o Michael Toombs developed the following murals with KC Metro young people and families: *Inlightened* at the Bartle Hall Convention Center, 8th Street YMCA, Donnelly College, Missouri City Flood Recovery, and the Tanner Banner at Nelson Atkins Museum.
- o Michael directed 400 children from Quindaro Elementary, Kansas City, Kansas on a film, "What My Eyes See", a community awareness film. The film was broadcast on channel 62 locally.
- O The Miracle On 39th Street, A Prospect for Change: Michael Toombs and the Storytellers Inc., Artist Collective engaged adjudicated youth, the community of 39th and Prospect, City Government, C.O.M.B.A.T., Pan Educational Institute and Health Careers Pathways Program of the University of Kansas Medical Center. Using visual and performing art, the collective engaged over 300 area residents in creating a living stage with scenic murals depicting the young people at work, turning a 1965 Buick Wildcat into a mosaic-like mural. Young people were offered workshops in sidewalk

poetry, spoken word performances from local professional poets. A project pictorial features the project in the KC STAR Magazine.
