5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields gave a report on the on-line payment results. She said Jackson County's E-government efforts are increasingly popular with taxpayers. In 2003, approximately 13,000 taxpayers paid on-line. In 2004, 21,000 taxpayers paid on-line and a total of \$17.5 million was collected. The largest payment on-line totaled almost half million dollars.

She said Jackson County will be rolling out many new features in E-government this year. Sometime in June or July it should be possible to make tee times for the Fred Arbanas golf course on-line and also park shelter rental should be on-line.

Katheryn Shields presented the October Employee of the Month Award to Deputies Bill Tye and Dave Hill from the Sheriff's Department. She explained that they were transporting a woman on a felony bad check warrant, when they noticed she was in respiratory distress. The deputies stopped the car and administered CPR until the EMS could arrive. The woman started breathing, was treated and transported to the hospital. These deputies are commended for their lifesaving actions.

She presented the September Employee of the Month Award to Sam Davis, Acting Superintendent, Road Maintenance Division in the Public Works Department. Part of Sam's job is dealing with citizens who need service, or have a complaint about roads in the unincorporated area of Jackson County. Many thank you letters have been received over the years based on Sam's professionalism and caring manner with the public. Sam is an excellent example of a public servant and is to be commended for his work on behalf of the citizens.
