#### 3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Dan Tarwater moved to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on 4/19/2004. Seconded by Fred Arbanas.

#### 4 HEARINGS

Joe Pace, who serves on the Board of Directors for the Inter City Fire Protection District, was present. He distributed a letter to the legislators requesting reimbursement of TIF funds to the district and explained the expenditures.

#### 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, introduced Steve Israelite, her recent appointment to the Jackson County Board of Services for the Developmentally Disabled. She said this was an important board as it serves the needs of citizens with developmental disabilities.

She stated that Mr. Israelite has spent many years in Kansas City in both public and community service. He is Executive Director of the Jewish Heritage Foundation, a major foundation in the city which funds health and human services. He also served for 10 years as Director of the Office of Public Housing where he administered a multi-billion dollar federal program, providing over 100,000 units of subsidized housing to low income families, elderly, and the disabled. Prior to becoming Director, Steve served for 17 years in the Department of Housing and Urban Development in various capacities. He also spent 4 years with the Peace Corps in the latter half of the 1960's; 3 years as a volunteer in Brazil and 1 year training other Peace Corps Volunteers. She thanked him for his willingness to serve in this capacity.

Katheryn Shields reported that a wonderful gesture was made last week by children from Raytown Middle School. She reminded everyone that last year four of the County's bison were shot and killed. Students in the Family and Consumer Science Club, led by 8th grader Kaylee McLaughlin, raised money to buy a young bison to donate to the Jackson County Parks Department. They presented the young bison to the County last week and named it "Dakota". Kaylee's father would bring her to Jackson County's hoofed animal habitat when she was a little girl.

Katheryn believed that this tremendous act of caring deserves to be recognized. On behalf of all Jackson County citizens, she thanked them for the gift, for their long hours spent raising money, and for the support of their parents and teachers at Raytown South Middle School. She said a special thank you to Kaylee McLaughlin for caring enough to make something good out of a truly tragic situation.

She reported that to date no one has been charged in the shooting incidents. The day after the shootings, last August, Jackson County held a news conference to establish a reward fund for information leading to an arrest. The reward is still available.

Katheryn Shields said that last Thursday, April 22, 2004 was Earth Day. In Jackson County, Earth Day usually means an event to encourage recycling. This year Jackson County loaded up an "environmentally friendly" vehicle with recyclables to make the statement that we can do more than just recycle. It was a natural-gas powered vehicle used in Jackson County Parks and Recreation.

Jackson County is also taking better care of what we have before going out to buy something new. The Public Works Department has taken money that we would have spent to purchase 2 new dump trucks and is using it to repair an entire fleet of 29 trucks instead. That is not just recycling, that is reuse.

The Public Works Department also intends to purchase another SUV. But they are going to buy the most fuel efficient, clean burning SUV on the market: the 2005 Ford Escape-Hybrid. The vehicle is made in Kansas City, Missouri at the Ford Claycomo plant. The money the county saves in gas for this vehicle will help pay for the Hybrid price difference in about 3 years.

Jackson County challenges citizens to imagine what making similar choices at home could mean for their budget, as well as for cleaner air.

Katheryn said the Party for the Planet was held on Saturday at the Kansas City Zoo. She said there were hundreds of walkers despite the rainy weather. Funds raised will be used for local environmental education.

Jackson County received an award for the "Top Government Walking Team", Saturday at the 8th Annual 5K Walk and Party for the Planet at the Kansas City Zoo.

She gave a special congratulations to the Ivanhoe Neighborhood for their National Award from Keep America Beautiful. Jackson County is a sponsor of Keep Kansas City Beautiful. The event brought together a variety of businesses and government into one place, showing our enthusiasm for maintaining our quality of life.
