#### 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, presented a special proclamation to Park Ranger Aaron Gunzel. On July 22, 2000, Mr. Gunzel saw a 10 year old boy fall into the lake at the Longview Marina. He rushed to the scene and pulled the boy to safety. His response and quick reaction to the situation deserve the highest praise and his performance and professionalism are a credit to himself, the ranger division and all of Jackson County. Mr. Gunzel was presented with the first time ever Jackson County Employee of the year Award for 2000.

Katheryn Shields announced that Bernice J. Conley, longtime County Clerk for the Jackson County Legislature, passed away February 7, 2001 at the age of 80. She served as Clerk of the Legislature from 1961 to 1991 and served as both an elected and appointed clerk. In her honor Jackson County will fly its flag at half staff today and tomorrow.

Scott Burnett, County Legislator, congratulated Katheryn Shields on receiving the 2001 Missouri Arts Council Award.

Dennis Waits, County Legislator, asked for an update on the completion of the renovation at the Independence Annex.

Katheryn Shields said she knows that there are some change orders for the annex that will appear on the agenda at the next legislative meeting and therefore an update will be given at that time. The projected completion date is April 1, 2001.
