WHEREAS, the City of Lee's Summit has requested to add a section of Ranson Road from State Route R-A to Browning Road to the list of CURS routes in Jackson County and has requested that the County replace a culvert located approximately 1/8 mile north of Browning Road as a CURS project; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Works concurs with the addition of Ranson Road to the CURS route and recommends the culvert replacement as a CURS project; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the Legislature hereby concurs with the City of Lee's Summit request for the adoption of Ranson Road from State Route R-A to Browning Road as a new CURS priority and the culvert replacement as a CURS project.

REQUEST SUMMARY	The City of Lees Summit has requested that Ranson Road, from State Route R-A to Browning Road be included as a CURS route and that the County design and construct a replacement culvert located approximately ¼ mile north of Browning Road. This section of Ranson Road has an average daily traffic of 4,354 and is a classified as a major arterial by Lees Summit. Ranson Road is part of a road system that extends from 150 Hwy, in Greenwood, north via Todd George to Woods Chapel, and continues as Lakewood Way north and ties into Little Blue Valley Expressway in Independence. The culvert the city is requesting to be replaced is narrow (approx. 16 ft wide) and recently was involved in an accident where a vehicle crashed into one of the concrete parapets. A new design would widen the road at the culvert, be capable of carrying all legal loads, and be sized to pass the appropriate flow from run-off. The Public Works Staff would manage the culvert replacement and would plan on designing the project in house, any rights of way needed would be negotiated by in house right of way agent, and the construction of the culvert would be overseen by Public Works Staff. The Director of Public Works concurs with Lees Summit's request and recommends approval of Ranson Road as a CURS route, and the culvert replacement as a CURS project.

RE: Addition of Ranson Road as a CURS Route

Please accept this letter as Lee's Summit's request to add a section of Ranson Road to the list of CURS routes in Jackson County. The section begins at a point approximately ½ mile south of Bailey Road, where MoDOT right-of-way ends, to the city limit at Hook Lane/Browning Road, a total length of approximately 1-1/2 miles. While it makes sense to add Ranson from Hwy 50 to M150 as suggested by Jackson County staff, we do not feel it is appropriate for Lee's Summit to make this request since MoDOT and Greenwood have jurisdiction over the other sections of the road.

We are also requesting that the County proceed with the design and construction of a replacement culvert located approximately 1/8 mile north of Browning Road using CURS funding. The existing concrete box culvert is currently missing the west railing after a recent crash. It is already designated as a one lane bridge to direct traffic away from the edges but it has still been repeatedly damaged by vehicles. The culvert needs to be widened to two lanes with shoulders if right-of-way width allows. Pavement marking and sign relocation or removal will also need to be included. Ideally, design work would be completed over the winter to allow construction to take place during the summer of 2011 while school is not in session.

We understand the CURS program doesn't allow for relocation of City owned utilities. There is a 4-inch water line along the west side of Ranson in this vicinity, so if it needs to be relocated the City will be responsible for that work and cost.
