Ryan Road, legally described as follows:

Description: All that part of the Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 5, Township 48, Range 30, in Jackson County, Missouri, lying North of Ryan Road, as now established, except part in road, if any.

Section 2. The Legislature, pursuant to the application of GA Investing, LP (RZ-2019-570), requesting the amendment embodied in this Ordinance and with notice that the Jackson County Plan Commission voted 6 to 0 to recommend <u>APPROVAL</u> of this application after a public hearing on July 18, 2019, does adopt this Ordinance pursuant to the Jackson County Charter authorizing the Legislature to exercise legislative power pertaining to planning and zoning.

Program Description, including Services, Frequency of services, and Sites of services,

A. Program Summary: Project RISE (Responsive Individualized Support and Early Intervention) aims to refine, implement, and evaluate a comprehensive, coordinated Stepped-Care Model of Intervention for nonfatal shooting victims presenting to the Emergency Department (ED) at TMC. This model involves three key components. The first - Component 1 - provides nonfatal shooting victims with information, crisis intervention, and advocacy in the immediate aftermath of a shooting. As a first step. all nonfatal shooting victims will be screened for PTSD risk. Admitted patients will be screened for PTSD once the victim is alert and medically stable. Victims released from the ED will be provided with psychoeducation about common trauma reactions and information on coping, and PTSD screening will be completed within one to two days after release by the RISE project team. Those victims at high risk for PTSD who request additional support will be provided with Psychological First Aid (PFA), an evidenceinformed early intervention developed by the National Center for PTSD and the National Child Traumatic Stress Network. PFA is based on research suggesting that practical, social, and emotional support can buffer against development of longer-term problems in trauma victims. This practical assistance and access to supportive resources to immediately reduce risk of re-victimization and/or retaliation, serves as a first step forward - often the hardest one - toward healing. Trauma sensitive practices are essential for victims to feel safe, develop trust, choice, collaboration and empowerment. The second - Component 2 would provide nonfatal shooting victims with readily accessible, continuous mental health support in the weeks and months after a shooting to bolster resilience and recovery. Continuous trauma support in the weeks and months after the shooting is achieved through offering survivors who experience ongoing distress, "stepped-up" care in the form of more intensive interventions, such as Skills for Psychological Recovery (SPR). SPR is a culturally-informed, structured intervention developed by the National Child Traumatic Stress Network and the National Center for PTSD. SPR utilizes skills-building components from cognitive-behavioral treatments for trauma-related mental health problems to facilitate recovery and enhance functioning in the aftermath of a traumatic event. Skills-building activities include: building problem-solving skills; promoting positive activities; managing physical and emotional reactions to upsetting situations; promoting helpful thinking; and rebuilding healthy social connections. These activities will be offered at TMC Health Sciences District by UMKC doctoral candidates in clinical psychology. These clinicians have completed extensive training in SPR and traumasensitive practices. Clinicians providing SPR will also make regular, weekly phone calls to individuals enrolled in the RISE Program. Care coordination will include a project case manager to promote ongoing engagement in services and provide participants and clinicians a chance to troubleshoot any potential barriers to engagement. This second step serves to close an identified gap in care for nonfatal shooting victims. For those who would like individualized SPR but do not wish to attend in-person services, TMC can also

offer one-on-one sessions using home-based telehealth. TMC Behavioral Health currently uses home-based telehealth for PTSD at the Healing Canvas location, and this option has been well received by our community. The third - Component 3 - provides nonfatal shooting victims with impairing, unresolved symptoms access to evidence-based mental health treatments. As determined by ongoing assessment from clinicians and Social Work Services team members, survivors meeting criteria for PTSD up to three months post-shooting, will receive evidence-based treatment for PTSD. Those survivors who prefer individual treatment will be given priority scheduling for services at TMC Behavioral Health Healing Canvas, and group treatments will be offered at TMC Health Sciences District. These three components, or Stepped Care Interventions, will provide responsive, individualized supports and early interventions for nonfatal gunshot victims and their families that will go a long way in reducing unnecessary suffering.

- B. Needs Statement: All Jackson County residents should have the opportunity to make choices that allow them to live a long, healthy life, regardless of their income, education, or ethnic background. The epidemic of violence that has plagued our community has made those choices difficult for some in Jackson County. Truman Medical Center (TMC) located in the Health Sciences District - is acutely aware of the impact of the level of violence - our Level One Trauma Center is the busiest in Kansas City, with 1.395 cases in 2018. Despite efforts to reduce gun violence, nonfatal firearm-related crime remains a significant problem both locally and nationally. An opportunity exists for a new model to provide adequate mental health care for nonfatal shooting victims in the aftermath of a violent crime. Nonfatal shooting victims are at risk for a wide range of crime-related mental health problems, including PTSD, that in and of themselves, may increase risk for revictimization and violent behavior. Thus, providing nonfatal shooting victims with more opportunistic, responsive mental health services is a critical element in reducing the "cycle of violence." With additional resources provided through COMBAT Anti-Violence Special Initiative (AVSI) funding, we propose a pilot project to test this concept by implementing a Stepped-Care Model of Intervention for PTSD with nonfatal shooting victims. Pending the success of this pilot proof of concept Project RISE, long-term objectives include dissemination of this model to other Emergency Departments in Jackson County.
- C. Include any partners and what they will do. The Jackson County Prosecutor's Office would be a key partner in this pilot project. Their "Bullet-To-Skin Intervention" or BTSI project team would offer support to the victims and their families, including assistance with very practical problems like home or vehicle repairs and crime scene cleanup.
- D. Area of Interest to be served. This pilot Project RISE addresses the COMBAT Anti-Violence Special Initiative (AVSI) community violence prevention and restorative justice, conflict and resolution areas of interest.

Please provide responses to the following questions:

- Discuss specific risk factors, and describe the incidence and prevalence of violence and their effects on the target population. Gun violence is a serious problem both locally and nationally, affecting thousands of men, women, and children throughout the United States each year. At Truman Medical Center (TMC) located in the Health Sciences District our team is witness to the damage caused by senseless acts of violence nearly every day. TMC internal Trauma Registry data for calendar year 2018 indicated 210 shooting victims were discharged living from TMC (81% male; 54% African American, 33% White; 79% below age 40). Specific risk factors for nonfatal shooting victims include numerous crime-related mental health problems, including posttraumatic stress disorder, or PTSD, which may increase their risk for re-victimization and/or violent behavior. Risk factors for the development and maintenance of PTSD include lack of social support, concerns for safety, lack of resources (including food, shelter, or financial resources), legal and/or occupational concerns, and other disruptions in interpersonal functioning. Note that these risk factors can also be important risk factors for criminal revictimization and/or perpetration of violence.
- 2. Discuss specific protective factors that will be utilized in buffering the risk factors that are present. Which, if addressed, can be expected to reduce violence. The interventions included in the first two components of the RISE Program - Psychological First Aid (PFA) and Skills for Psychological Recovery (SPR) are strategically designed to address the risk factors described above. Component One: Psychological First Aid includes eight core components that can be used in a flexible manner depending on patient needs. These components include: 1) engagement in a social contact that is compassionate and respectful; 2) stabilizing emotionally overwhelmed individuals using grounding techniques; 3) gathering information about immediate needs; 4) enhancing immediate and ongoing safety; 5) providing practical assistance to ensure that basic needs are met; 6) establishing contact with primary support persons; 7) providing information on coping strategies; and 8) linking survivors with collaborative services as needed. Component 2: Skills for Psychological Recovery provides survivors with skills that can be utilized in buffering the risk factors described above. These skills include: 1) effective problem solving; 2) managing reactions; 3) promoting positive activities; 4) promoting helpful thinking; and 5) rebuilding healthy social connections. These skills can further help reduce the risk of subsequent violence.
- 3. What Intermediate Outcomes would you say your project will achieve? Intermediate outcomes expected: 1) By the end of the pilot period (6 months), 75% of nonfatal gunshot victims presenting for emergency services at TMC will be screened for PTSD risk within two days of arrival in the Emergency Department (ED); 2) 90% of nonfatal gunshot victims screening for high risk for PTSD will receive Component 1- Psychological First Aid; 3) 50% of nonfatal gunshot victims who receive Psychological First Aid will receive at least one session of Component 2 Skills for Psychological Recovery.
- 4. What evidence do you have of these Intermediate Outcomes (e.g., what data have you/will you collect; what measures of success are available)?Documentation of PTSD risk screening and Psychological First Aid and Skills for Psychological Recovery sessions will be tracked through TMC's electronic medical records system. Additional data will be collected and analyzed by the

Project RISE team, including the Project Director and UMKC Psychology doctoral students, TMC Behavioral Health Crossroads Counseling, and TMC Trauma Services Registry.

- 5. Is your program evidence based? Yes or No If yes, please list the evidence based program your program models?

 Stepped care models for PTSD treatment among injured trauma survivors have been successfully implemented and evaluated in other medical centers around the nation (e.g., Zatzick et al., 2013) and have been shown to be associated with statistically significant reductions in PTSD symptoms compared to treatment-as-usual. The specific interventions embedded in our first two components, Psychological First Aid and Skills for Psychological Recovery, have both been recognized as evidence-informed interventions with emerging evidence (e.g., Watson, 2019), including evidence for the effectiveness of Skills for Psychological Recovery collected as part of an open trial for traumatically bereaved families at UMKC's Psychology Depatment (PI: Williams).
- 6. What types of collaborations do you envision that will enhance your program? The Project RISE initiative is a collaborative, interdisciplinary PTSD workgroup comprised of several departments within TMC, including the Emergency Department, Trauma Services, ICU Nurses, Social Work Services, Chaplains and Behavioral Health. It began in response to the question, "What if we led with a healthier response for nonfatal shooting victims?" This led to development of processes and procedures to identify vicitms at risk for PTSD and to provide meaningful interventions for them and their families. The pilot program funding request through COMBAT AVSI funding will enhance our success by ensuring that providers working together across departments are coordinating and staffing cases and providing services for nonfatal shooting victims and their families at different "touch points" throughout the program. How would they assist your efforts? Providers across departments will work to assist each other's efforts to ensure that nonfatal gunshot victims are provided with timely, responsive mental health supports. For example, nurses will provide nonfatal gunshot victims with timely PTSD risk screenings and place consults in the electronic medical record (EMR) for Social Workers to then provide timely and responsive Component 1 (PFA) early interventions. Social Workers will then help link victims to Behavioral Health team members for Compontent 2 (SPR) early interventions, thus ensuring that victims and their families are able to access continuous mental health services as needed.
- 7. How many clients do you anticipate you will reach? TMC typically treats and discharges between 20-30 nonfatal gunshot victims each month, and can conservatively estimate serving approximately 125 victims through this pilot project between August and December 2019. Assuming that we achieve our goals outlined in Question 3, approximately 94 victims (75%) will be screened for PTSD risk, and, if all of these victims were to screen positive for PTSD risk, 85 of these victims (90%) will receive Component 1 Psychological First Aid (PFA). We further anticipate that at least 50% of those receiving PFA, or approximately 43 victims, will receive Component 2 Skills for Psychological Recovery (SPR).

- A. Program Summary: T.E.A.M. KC will provide multi-dimensional youth empowerment and sustainability programs, including exposure to, and participation in sports, events, and workshops which will help improve the lives of youth in low to moderate income families in Raytown, Missouri. Summer learning programs provide a safe, nurturing environment for young people and can be part of a comprehensive public health approach to youth violence prevention. In addition to academic support, quality summer programs provide youth development opportunities for young people that contribute to mentally and physically healthy children and teens. T.E.A.M. KC has been successful in establishing collaborative partnerships with COMBAT through Sisters in Christ Raytown Hub, the Raytown School District, and Police Department to develop best practices to improve the delivery of programs and services for T.E.A.M. KC. Such partnerships will help connect youth to empowerment and sustainability programs that will teach them pro-social skills and abstain from delinquent behaviors. If funded, we will provide a free program that creates a safe zone for high risk Raytown community youth and support working parents. The 'summer' portion of the program will run from July 15, 2019 until August 12, 2019; Monday through Friday; from 11:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. We would like to continue through the beginning of the school year to provide after school care for these families. Operating through December 31, 2019; Monday through Friday; after school until 6 p.m. The program includes a schedule of non-competitive indoor and outdoor games, such as: kickball, softball, soccer, jump rope, and board games. Weekly field trips such as: bowling, fishing, and the zoo will also be included. Lunch will be provided. Eligible youth include sixth to eight graders within walking distance of the Raytown parks and church hubs. Upon final approval from the Raytown School District Superintendent, Dr. Markley, fliers will be distributed, at the middle schools, directing parents to sign their children up for the program at the Raytown COMBAT and Sisters In Christ Community Resource Services Hub.
- B. Needs Statement: Nationally, more than 15 million school-age children are on their own after school. That is 26% of school age children. Over 2,000 are in the Raytown area. Among them, more than 1 million (7%) are in grades K-5. If Raytown is following the national trend, over 200 of our children are in grades K-5; between the ages of 5 and 11. Children who are unsupervised after school are in danger of becoming victims of crimes or accidents. Raytown's children are also at risk of falling behind academically, socially, and emotionally. They are at higher risk than other children and youth of falling prey to substance abuse, gang involvement, teen pregnancy, and dropping out. Recently, (June 2019) Raytown lost two children to violence. Rayaun, 17, was gunned down in Coleman Living Good Park. According to interim Chief Hudspeth, there has never been a murder in this park. Rayaun's homicide has been an eye opener for our community. As a result, Mayor McDonough formed an adhoc group that consists of community participants, and

COMBAT representatives, Carolyn Whitney, Tammy Jordan, and Donna Shumate. A small; but, growing number of our children are avoiding these pitfalls and reaping the benefits of quality, affordable afterschool programs – evidence-based programs that keep kids safe, inspire them to learn, and help working families. Most youth are facing a six week summer break without wholesome activities while their parents or care givers are at work. There are households in the Raytown community with low to moderate incomes and the varying cost for summer camps can be a barrier to these families providing safe & constructive care for their children during these summer weeks.

- C. Include any partners and what they will do. Dr. Markley School Superintendent of the Raytown School District is in support of this pilot program and approved flier to be posted in their Peach Jar system of communication to the schools within Raytown School District & Community. Through these referrals the targeted population will be provided, Raytown Police Department will participate, Raytown Fire Department will participate, Raytown Christian Church will provide the site and lunches, Raytown businesses, Life Changes Church will provide transportation, volunteers and games.,
- D. Area of Interest to be served. Raytown School District, specifically Raytown South Middle will be targeted due to the referral of youth that have been referred through Combat. Three youth from Raytown Middle have been assessed. Out of the three grades were poor, a mother killed, 2 molested by boyfriend or father, single moms as well as little to no support. We felt it important to reach out specifically to Raytown South Middle and to develop a relationship for additional service needs since every referral has come from that participular school. Area Raytown Churches and Word of Mouth (Raytown Residents)

- 1. Discuss specific risk factors, and describe the incidence and prevalence of violence and their effects on the target population. Nationally, more than 15 million school-age children are on their own after school. Over 2,000 are in the Raytown area. Children who are unsupervised after school are in danger of becoming victims of crimes or accidents. These children are also at risk of falling behind academically, socially, and emotionally. They are also at higher risk of falling prey to substance abuse, gang involvement, teen pregnancy, and dropping out. Of the nearly 9,000 students enrolled in the Raytown School District, just over 2,000 are unsupervised in the Raytown area. These families need cost effective, safe after school care.
- 2. Discuss specific protective factors that will be utilized in buffering the risk factors that are present. Which, if addressed, can be expected to reduce violence. A small; but, growing, number of children are avoiding the pitfalls and reaping the benefits of quality, affordable afterschool programs evidence-based programs that keep kids safe, inspire them to learn, and help working families. About 67% of the students attending Raytown schools are from low income families. Income creates a barrier

to providing after school care. This barrier can be eliminated by this T.E.A.M. KC program. By providing engaging activities, the children serviced will be less likely to find themselves in harm's way or creating a harmful situation for other citizens. Less idol minds, create more productive atmospheres.

- 3. What Intermediate Outcomes would you say your project will achieve? Safety continued academic involvement healthy social interaction mentorships healthy physical activity support to parents
- 4. What evidence do you have of these Intermediate Outcomes (e.g., what data have you/will you collect; what measures of success are available)? The crime rate in Raytown is 96% higher than the national average. For every 100,000 people, there are 14.77 daily crimes. (area vibes) Nationally, 26% of school-age children are on their own after school. If Raytown follows the national average, over 2,000 children are left on their own. In Raytown, there is a 1 in 19 chance of becoming a victim of a crime. (area vibes) Supervision during schools off season, will provide these children with a safe alternative. After school programs help keep youth out of trouble, which in turn keeps costs to the public down. The way to help young people succeed is to invest in supports that help them along the way.
- 5. What changes would you make as you extend your work to reduce violence? This program would start immediately following the end of the school year. Pre-enrollment will gauge interest during the course of the year. Advertising during the year to create awareness in the community. Building trust in the community amongst leaders, parents, and children
- 6. How could you be more involved with the Criminal Justice system?
 Create a viable bridge between the community and law enforcement.
 Create a space where both sides learn to trust and understand each other.
 Begin to curb the chances of youth ending up in the criminal justice system.
 Begin to teach law enforcement how to positively interact with youth.
 Start the interaction at a younger & younger age to build relationships & trust early on.
- 7. What types of collaborations do you envision that will enhance your program? How would they assist your efforts? Heavy interaction between the children and authority figures. There will be plenty opportunity to play and interact with the participants of the summer camp. If the children are playing kickball, a compliment of police officers, teachers, clergy, etc. should be involved in the game playing, coaching. Whatever the children are doing during the program, community leaders should be involved. This will allow the children to see the police when there isn't a pressing matter. The children will have an opportunity to see the police as people. The police will also have the opportunity to interact with the children when there is nothing daunting hanging over their conversations. Law enforcement and other city leaders will get to know the participants as individuals and have the opportunity to get more invested in their futures.
- 8. How many clients do you anticipate you will reach? Our targeted goal is 25-30 youth to participate in program. In addition to getting the parents involved should significantly increase how many clients that will be reached.

MISSOURI HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION **COUNTY AGREEMENT**

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission (hereinafter, "Commission") and the County of Jackson, Missouri (hereinafter, "County").

WITNESSETH:

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, promises and representations contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- IMPROVEMENT DESIGNATION: The public improvement designated as Route H. Jackson County, Job No. J4P3212 shall consist of intersection improvements at the intersection of Pink Hill Road/Renick Road.
- IMPROVEMENT WITHIN COUNTY: The improvement within the County (2) is located as follows:

Route H one mile south of Route FF (Truman Road) and 0.5 mile north of Old Pink Hill Road. Length of Improvement within the county is 897.3 feet.

- LOCATION: The general location of the public improvement is shown on an attached sketch marked "Exhibit A" and made a part of this Agreement. The detailed location of the improvement is shown on the plans prepared by the Commission for the above-designated route and project.
- PURPOSE: It is the intent of this Agreement that the Commission shall provide without cost to the County, except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, a highway for traffic in the County and the Commission shall so design and construct the highway to serve operating necessities and requirements of local and through traffic.
- (5) RIGHT-OF-WAY USE: The County grants the right to use the right-ofway of public roads, streets, alleys and any other property owned by the County as necessary for construction and maintenance of said public improvement.
- CLOSE AND VACATE: The County shall temporarily close and vacate all streets or roads, or parts thereof, which may be necessary to permit the construction of the project in accordance with the detailed plans. When the Commission deems it necessary to close Pink Hill Road or Renick Road permanently during construction, the

County shall be advised in time to make provisions for the diversion and rerouting of traffic.

(7) <u>RIGHT-OF-WAY ACQUISITION</u>: Upon approval of all agreements, plans and specifications by the Commission and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the Commission will file copies of the plans with the clerk of the County and proceed to acquire at its expense, at no cost or expense to the County, any necessary right-of-way required for the construction of the improvement.

(8) UTILITY RELOCATION:

- (A) The Commission and the County shall cooperate to secure the temporary or permanent removal, relocation, or adjustment of public utilities or private lines, poles, wires, conduits, and pipes located on the right-of-way of existing public ways as necessary for construction of the improvement and the cost shall be borne by such public utilities or the owners of the facilities except where the County is by existing franchise or agreement obligated to pay all or a portion of such cost, in which case the County will pay its obligated portion of the cost.
- (B) The Commission shall secure the removal, relocation, or adjustment of any public or private utilities located upon private easements and shall pay any costs incurred therein.
- In cases of public utilities owned by the County which must be (C) moved, adjusted, or altered to accommodate construction of this improvement, and such county-owned utilities, poles, wires, conduits, and pipes are located within the present county jurisdiction and located on an existing road, not state highway right-ofway, but being taken over by the Commission as a part of its highway right-of-way, the County will perform the necessary removal, adjustment, alterations and relocation, and the Commission will reimburse the County except as otherwise provided. The County shall perform the removal, adjustment, alterations and relocation in accordance with the detail plans, estimates of costs and bills of materials prepared by the County in accordance with Federal Aid Policy Guide, Title 23 CFR Subchapter G, Part 645, Subpart A (FAPG 23 CFR 645A), dated December 9, 1991 and any revision of it, and approved by the Commission's District Engineer, and shall perform all work and keep the records of the costs in accordance with FAPG 23 CFR 645A and its revisions. Upon the completion of any such work and on receipt by the Commission of the original and four copies of a bill for the actual costs incurred by the County in making any such removal, adjustment, alteration and relocation, the Commission shall reimburse the County for the actual cost necessitated by construction of this public improvement. The Commission's obligation toward the cost of any such removal, adjustment, alteration and relocation shall extend only to those costs incurred in accordance with FAPG 23 CFR 645A and its revisions.
- (D) Should it be necessary to alter, relocate or adjust any county-owned utility facilities outside the present county limits on public right-of-way or on state

highway right-of-way within or outside the county limits or within the right-of-way of a public way, the alteration, relocation, or adjustment shall be made by the County at its cost.

- (E) The County agrees that any installation, removal, relocation, maintenance, or repair of public or private utilities involving work within highway right-of-way included in this project shall be done only in accordance with the general rules and regulations of the Commission and after a permit for the particular work has been obtained from the Commission's District Engineer or his authorized representative. Similarly, the County will allow no work on the highway right-of-way involving excavation or alteration in any manner of the highway as constructed, including but not limited to driveway connections, except in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Commission and only after a permit for the specific work has been obtained from the Commission's District Engineer or his/her authorized representative. The County shall take whatever actions are necessary to assure compliance with this Subsection.
- (9) <u>LIGHTING</u>: The Commission will, at its cost and expense, install, operate, and maintain basic highway intersection or interchange lighting at warranted locations on the improvement. The construction, installation, and maintenance of any other or further lighting system on the public improvement covered by this Agreement shall be only in accordance with the Commission's policy on highway lighting in effect, and to the extent deemed warranted by the Commission, at the time of any such installation. No lighting system shall be installed or maintained by the County on the improvement without approval of the Commission.
- (10) TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES: The installation, operation and maintenance of all traffic signals, pavement markings, signs, and devices on the improvement, including those between the highway and intersecting roads shall be under the exclusive jurisdiction and at the cost of the Commission. The County shall not install, operate, or maintain any traffic signals, signs or other traffic control devices on the highway or on roads and highways at any point where they intersect this highway without approval of the Commission.
- (11) <u>DRAINAGE</u>: The Commission will construct drainage facilities along the improvement and may use any existing storm and surface water drainage facilities now in existence in the area. The County shall be responsible for receiving and disposing of storm and surface water discharged from those drainage facilities which the Commission constructs within the limits of highway right-of-way to the extent of the County's authority and control of the storm sewer facilities or natural drainage involved.
- (12) <u>PERMITS</u>: The Commission shall secure any necessary approvals or permits from the Surface Transportation Board, the Public Service Commission of Missouri, or any other state or federal regulating authority required to permit the construction and maintenance of the highway.

of-way, the Commission shall construct the highway in accordance with final detailed plans approved by the FHWA (or as they may be changed from time to time by the Commission with the approval of the FHWA) at such time as federal and state funds are allocated to the public improvement in an amount sufficient to pay for the federal and state government's proportionate share of construction and right-of-way costs. The obligation of the Commission toward the actual construction of the public improvement shall be dependent upon the completion of plans in time to obligate federal funds for such construction, upon approval of the plans by the FHWA, upon the award by the Commission of the contract for the construction, and upon the approval of the award by the FHWA.

(14) MAINTENANCE:

- (A) Except as provided in this Agreement, upon completion of the public improvement, the Commission will maintain all portions of the improvement within the Commission owned right-of-way. Maintenance by the Commission shall not in any case include maintenance or repair of sidewalks whether new or used in place, water supply lines, sanitary or storm sewers (except those storm sewers constructed by the Commission to drain the highway), county-owned utilities within the right-of-way or the removal of snow other than the machine or chemical removal from the traveled portion of the highway.
- (B) When it is necessary to revise or adjust county roads, the right-of-way acquired for these adjustments and connections will be deeded to the County.
- (15) <u>ACCEPTED WITHIN HIGHWAY SYSTEM</u>: Effective upon execution of this Agreement, the Commission temporarily accepts the portion of the County road system described in this Agreement as part of the State Highway System for the purposes of this project. However, during the construction period contemplated in this Agreement:
- (A) The Commission will assume no police or traffic control functions not obligatory upon Commission immediately prior to the execution of this Agreement, and
- (B) The County shall perform or cause to be performed normal maintenance on the project site.
- (16) <u>COUNTY TO MAINTAIN</u>: Upon completion of construction of this improvement, the County shall accept control and maintenance of the improved County road that was temporarily accepted as part of the State Highway System for the purposes of this project pursuant to paragraph (15) above and shall thereafter keep, control, and maintain the same as, and for all purposes, a part of the County road system at its own cost and expense and at no cost and expense whatsoever to the Commission. All obligations of the Commission with respect to the County road system

under this Agreement shall cease upon completion of the improvement.

- (17) <u>POLICE POWERS</u>: It is the intent of the parties to this Agreement that the County shall retain its police powers with respect to the regulation of traffic upon the improvement contemplated. However, the County will enact, keep in force, and enforce only such regulations relating to traffic movement and parking restrictions as may be approved by the Commission and as are not in conflict with any regulations for federal aid. The Commission shall not arbitrarily withhold approval of reasonable traffic regulations, signs, and markings which will permit the movement of traffic in accordance with accepted traffic regulation practices.
- (18) <u>RESTRICTION OF PARKING</u>: Since the improvement is being designed and constructed to accommodate a maximum amount of traffic with a minimum amount of right-of-way, the County shall take whatever actions that are necessary to prevent parking upon the highway or any part of the area of the highway right-of-way within the limits of the improvement.
- (19) <u>OUTDOOR ADVERTISING</u>: No billboards or other advertising signs or devices or vending or sale of merchandise will be permitted within the right-of-way limits of the project and the County will take whatever actions are necessary to enforce this Section.
- (20) <u>WITHHOLDING OF FUNDS</u>: In the event that the County fails, neglects, or refuses to enact, keep in force or enforce regulations specified or enacts regulations contrary to the provisions in this Agreement, or in any other manner fails, neglects or refuses to perform any of the obligations assumed by it under this Agreement, the Commission may, after serving written request upon the County for compliance and the County's failure to comply, withhold the expenditure of further funds for maintenance, improvement, construction, or reconstruction of the state highway system in the County.
- (21) <u>FEDERAL HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION</u>: This Agreement is entered into subject to approval by the Federal Highway Administration, and is further subject to the availability of federal and state funds for this construction.

(22) INDEMNIFICATION:

- (A) To the extent allowed or imposed by law, the County shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Commission, including its members and department employees, from any claim or liability whether based on a claim for damages to real or personal property or to a person for any matter relating to or arising out of the County's wrongful or negligent performance of its obligations under this Agreement.
- (B) The County will require any contractor procured by the County to work under this Agreement:
 - (1) To obtain a no cost permit from the Commission's District

Engineer prior to working on the Commission's right-of-way, which shall be signed by an authorized contractor representative (a permit from the Commission's District Engineer will not be required for work outside of the Commission's right-of-way); and

- (2) To carry commercial general liability insurance and commercial automobile liability insurance from a company authorized to issue insurance in Missouri, and to name the Commission, and the Missouri Department of Transportation and its employees, as additional named insureds in amounts sufficient to cover the sovereign immunity limits for Missouri public entities (\$500,000 per claimant and \$3,000,000 per occurrence) as calculated by the Missouri Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, and published annually in the Missouri Register pursuant to Section 537.610, RSMo.
- (C) In no event shall the language of this Agreement constitute or be construed as a waiver or limitation for either party's rights or defenses with regard to each party's applicable sovereign, governmental, or official immunities and protections as provided by federal and state constitution or law.
- (23) <u>AMENDMENTS</u>: Any change in this Agreement, whether by modification or supplementation, must be accomplished by a formal contract amendment signed and approved on or between the duly authorized representatives of the County and Commission.
- (24) <u>COMMISSION REPRESENTATIVE</u>: The Commission's District Engineer is designated as the Commission's representative for the purpose of administering the provisions of this Agreement. The Commission's representative may designate by written notice other persons having the authority to act on behalf of the Commission in furtherance of the performance of this Agreement.
- (25) <u>COUNTY REPRESENTATIVE</u>: The County's Director of Public Works is designated as the County's representative for the purpose of administering the provisions of this Agreement. The County's representative may designate by written notice other persons having the authority to act on behalf of the County in furtherance of the performance of this Agreement.
- (26) <u>NOTICES</u>: Any notice or other communication required or permitted to be given hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed given three (3) days after delivery by United States mail, regular mail postage prepaid, or upon receipt by personal or facsimile delivery, addressed as follows:
