DaRon McGee, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

2 THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Jeanie Lauer, seconded by Donna Peyton to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on March 06, 2025. The motion passed by a voice vote.

4 HEARINGS

None.

5 COMMUNICATIONS WITH AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Frank White, Jr., County Executive, was not present. Caleb Clifford, Chief of Staff, had no report.

Manuel Abarca IV, County Legislator, asked why the County Executive was absent. Caleb Clifford, Chief of Staff, replied the County Executive is not present and he has no information. Mr. Abarca asked for an excuse next week if the County Executive is absent, as it is prudent for the County Executive to be present particularly when the County currently does not have a budget.

Mr. Abarca inquired about taxation documents received last week and asked why these documents were not received timely. The documents he was referring to include an HSA registration document and W-2 form. He said this was county wide not just his documents. Mr. Clifford said he is not familiar but will contact the Human Resources Department for more information and report back to the County Legislature.

Mr. Abarca asked if the Administration is making statements suggesting members of the County Legislature are withholding county associates salaries or budget/wage increase. Caleb Clifford said he does not have any information but if Mr. Abarca wanted to share more details he is happy to look into it. Mr. Abarca gave details that employees said they were told positions cannot transition from temporary to permanent and increases are not able to be given because of a budget issue. He asked about the cultural impact or if there was a press release shared.

Mr. Abarca asked when taxpayers will receive their first taxation notice from the Assessment Department. Caleb Clifford asked if he was referring to the state mandated impact notices. Manuel Abarca IV confirmed and asked when the impact notices would be mailed. Mr. Clifford said he believes by state statute they need to be out some time in June. Whitney Miller, Chief Deputy County Counselor, confirmed the impact notices need to be mailed by June 15th each year. Mr. Abarca said last year, the County Legislature was told they would be mailed out in March which is why he was inquiring as to an exact date. He asked if there would be clarification regarding alleged increases. Caleb Clifford said the impact notices would have the estimated valuation and additional communication may be sent out by the Assessment Department prior to the impact notice which will probably be sent out in May.

Manuel Abarca IV asked if the Board of Equalization has begun going through the 2023 assessments that were appealed and resumed their processes. Mr. Clifford said he believes the BOE has had meetings but he is not sure if they have had hearings. He will check into it and report back to the County Legislature.

Mr. Abarca requested permission from the Chair and Vice Chair to continue documenting questions for the Administration's response. He suggested issues be included under UNFINISHED BUSINESS to maintain a consistent and accurate record of requests and to ensure follow up and answers are provided by the Administration. DaRon McGee agreed and directed the County Clerk to include issues under UNFINISHED BUSINESS for future legislative agendas.
