A RESOLUTION authorizing the County Executive to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Kansas City, Missouri, for the furnishing of additional inmate beds at the Regional Correctional Center.

RESOLUTION NO. 18177, May 20, 2013

INTRODUCED BY James D. Tindall, County Legislator

WHEREAS, by Resolution 16883, dated April 20, 2009, the Legislature did authorize the execution of an Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Kansas City, Missouri to provide for the Regional Correctional Center (RCC); and,

WHEREAS, this original agreement authorized the detention of up to 150 inmates per day from the City and provided that the City would manage the population if it exceeded that cap; and,

WHEREAS, in analyzing trends since the original agreement, peak usage periods tend to occur on the weekends during certain times of the year; and,

WHEREAS, the City has proposed that the original cap of 150 inmates and detainees be expanded for short-term weekend overflow for up to 25 additional inmates, with compensation to the County in the amount of \$40.00 per day each; and,

WHEREAS, the attached Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Kansas City is a

suitable mechanism by which to implement the mutual understanding of the parties and obligations of the City and County with regards to the cooperative effort regarding the regional detention plan; and,

WHEREAS, execution of this Agreement is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Jackson County; now therefore,



<p>REQUEST SUMMARY</p>	<p>On the 4th of May, 2009 the County and the City of Kansas City entered into an agreement authorizing the formation, funding and staffing of the Regional Corrections Facility for the purpose of providing detention for inmates sentenced from the Kansas City Municipal Court. The agreement set a cap on 150 inmates per day, and provided that the City would manage the population if it should reach 150 for purposes of release.</p> <p>In analyzing the trends, it appears that the peak usage periods are generally over the weekend during certain times of the year as additional inmates and/or detainees are brought in but City's Municipal Court is not in session for purposes of case disposition. At the request of the City and City's Municipal Court, the County has worked to develop the capacity for short term weekend overflow of up to an additional 25 inmates.</p> <p>Since this is focused on the weekend and a short term stay, only basic services will be provided including housing, medical, and mental health services but the inmates will not be accessing the longer term programs (such as drug/alcohol treatment programs). The County will charge the City \$40 per day for each inmate per day over the 150 population cap for Saturday through Tuesday before midnight, limited to an additional 25 inmate</p>										

	beds. By the end of Tuesday, the City will manage the population to within the 150 cap. The City of Kansas City has budgeted \$75,000.00 for this overflow housing and if approved, this agreement would continue through May of 2014.
