5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, was pleased to announce that last week, the United States Senate Appropriations Committee has given preliminary approval for a \$1.25 million grant for a proposed Education Center at the Fort Osage Historic Landmark, one of the historic sites in Jackson County. In addition, the County has already been awarded a \$100,000.00 federal grant in preparation for the Lewis and Clark Bicentennial. These grants will help our children better appreciate the rich history of Jackson County. She thanked the federal delegation for their assistance, including Senators Jean Carnahan and Kit Bond, and Representative Karen McCarthy and Sam Graves.

She said the Mental Health Court is a new initiative designed to address the unique needs of the mentally ill in our criminal justice systems. This initiative was made possible through the innovative collaboration of several area governments and agencies. It is noteworthy that Jackson County was able to accomplish this valuable service without a tax increase, and we have been able to bring together the criminal justice system and the mental health community in this effort to better serve our mental health consumers in Jackson County.

Katheryn Shields advised the Legislature that the jail population has been high for several months. Last week a number of matrix releases were necessary under the federal court order; 18 were released on Tuesday and 8 were released on Thursday. As the court ordered system requires, those with the least serious offenses are identified by the matrix. One third of the inmates were released into the custody of other jurisdictions.

Katheryn Shields responded briefly to Mr. Severeid's 5th report which dealt with condominiums and certificate of value.

The Jackson County Election Board made a presentation to emphasize the overcrowding in their facility located in the Independence Square Courthouse. Bill Baker, Chairman, Charles Dumsky, Member and Tammy Brown were present to speak on this issue.

The Legislature agreed to send out an RFP with a minimum requirement of 15,000 square feet to house the Jackson County Election Board offices.
