### COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made by and between JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI, a Constitutional Home Rule Charter County of the First Class of the State of Missouri, hereinafter referred to as "the County" and a Missouri not-for-profit corporation, SHEFFIELD PLACE 6604 EAST 12TH STREET KANSAS CITY, MO 64126, hereinafter referred to as "Organization".

WHEREAS, the County and Organization desire to enter into an Agreement to provide funding to be used for Sheffield Place Housing; and,

WHEREAS, the County deems it to be in the best interest of its citizenry to support such programs and activities; and,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the terms and provisions herein contained, the County and Organization respectively promise, covenant, and agree with each other as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

- 1. <u>Services</u>. Organization shall provide services Sheffield Place Housing, as is more fully set out in the proposal attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference. The term of this contract is January 1, 2020, through December 31, 2020, and as such, all expenditures must occur within this period. The budget Organization submitted as part of Exhibit A is considered final and non-changeable.
- 2. <u>Terms Of Payment</u>. The County agrees to pay Organization the total amount of \$15,000.00 in quarterly reimbursements up to \$3,750.00, Payments shall be made upon the County's receipt of the quarterly reports as set forth in paragraph 3

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hereof. The final payment will not be processed until the Organization's annual program report has been completely reconciled. The County reserves the right to audit all invoices and to reject any invoice for good cause. The County retains the right to deduct from an invoice of Organization any overpayment made by the County on a prior invoice. The County retains the right to make invoice corrections/changes. The County will not reimburse sales tax expense.

3. Reports/Other Documentation. Within 30 days after the conclusion of each calendar quarter under this Agreement, Organization shall submit a quarterly report through the Outside Agency Portal along with proof of payment and receipt documentation that reconciles to the quarterly report, including cancelled checks and/or a copy of the face of the check and corresponding bank statements, invoices, itemized credit card receipts and credit card statements showing proof of purchase and proof of payment and any other documents requested by the Department of Finance and Purchasing, to establish that the funds provided pursuant to this Agreement were used for the purposes set forth herein. All payments will be processed within 30 days of receipt of invoice, if the invoice is complete and accurate. All payments will be detained until reports are received and accurate. Any reports that are incorrect will delay payment. The last quarter's report is due by January 30th, 2021 and shall include an annual report which shall summarize all of Organization's activities pursuant to this Organization's failure to submit this annual report shall disqualify Agreement. Organization from future funding by the County. The final payment will not be processed until the Organization's annual program report has been completely reconciled. Organization must submit all quarterly reports in the format specified by the County

regardless of whether activity took place in each quarter, before the next quarterly payment will be processed. Any quarterly reports that are incomplete or incorrect will delay payment. Any unspent funds under this Agreement not invoiced by Organization within 30 days from the expiration of this Agreement shall be forfeited and not be paid.

Organization must notify the County in writing on Organization's letterhead, within five working days of the following changes:

- a. Organization name, address, telephone number, administration, or board of directors
- b. Organization funding that will affect the program under this contract
- c. Liability insurance coverage
- d. Management or staff responsible for providing services pursuant to this contract. When a management or staff position responsible for providing services pursuant to this contract is vacated and when the position is subsequently filled, the following will apply i.) reimbursement for a vacated position will be suspended until it is filled, and ii.) if another person under this contract assumes the duties of the vacated position, the Organization will not be allowed to bill the County for both positions.
- e. Any proposed or actual merger or acquisition either taken by the Organization or toward the Organization
- 4. <u>Submission of Documents</u>. No payment shall be made under this Agreement unless Organization shall have submitted to the County's Department of Finance and Purchasing through the Jackson County Outside Agency Portal accessible on www.jacksongov.org/auditor: (1) a written proposal setting out in detail the intended use of the County's funding, including the target population to be served; (2) Organization's IRS Form 990 from the previous fiscal or calendar year; (3) a statement of Organization's total budget for its most recent fiscal year; and (4) a detailed explanation of actual expenditures of the County's funds; (5) audited financial statement for Organization's most-recent fiscal or calendar year, or a certified public accountant's program audit of the County's funds. Organization must be chartered in the State of

Missouri, hold a certificate of good standing with annual registration through the Missouri Secretary of State and have received an exemption from Federal income taxes under Section 501c3 of the Internal Revenue Code. Any documents described herein which were submitted as a part of an application for funding need not be resubmitted to qualify for payment. Organization understands that no payment shall be made under this agreement until Organization's 2019 Outside Agency contract has been fully reconciled with the County's Department of Finance and Purchasing. No payment shall be made if Organization is out of compliance on any other County contract, or has not paid county taxes on all properties owned by Organization and assessed by the County.

- 5. **Equal Opportunity**. Organization shall submit an Affirmative Action Plan or Equal Employment Opportunity statement as required by the County Compliance Review Office. Organization shall maintain policies of employment as follows:
  - A. Organization and Organization's subcontractor(s) shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, age, disability, or national origin. Organization shall take affirmative action as set forth to ensure that applicants for employment and employees are treated without regard to their race, religion, color, sex, age, disability, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited, to the following: recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. Organization agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the policies of non-discrimination.

- B. Organization and Organization's subcontractor(s) shall, in all solicitation or advertisements for employees placed by them or on their behalf, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, religion, color, sex, age, disability, or national origin.
- 6. Employment Of Unauthorized Aliens Prohibited. Pursuant to §285.530.1, RSMo, Organization assures that it does not knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien to perform work within the State of Missouri and/or Jackson County, and shall affirm, by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation, its enrollment and participation in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees working in connection with the contracted services. Further, Organization shall sign an affidavit, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit B, affirming that it does not knowingly employ any person who is an unauthorized alien in connection with the contracted services.
- 7. Audit. The parties agree that the County may, for any reason and at any given time, examine and audit the books and records of Organization pertaining to this Agreement. Further, Organization agrees to establish and adopt such accounting standards and forms as recommended by the County prior to receipt of the County's first distribution of funds under the terms of this Agreement. The forms used to document expenditure of these funds may be changed from time to time by the County.
- 8. <u>Default</u>. If Organization shall default in the performance or observation of any covenant, term or condition herein contained to be performed by Organization, the County shall give Organization ten days written notice, setting forth the default. If said default shall continue and not be corrected by Organization within ten days after receipt

of notice from the County, the County may, at its election, terminate this Agreement and withhold any payments not yet made to Organization. Said election shall not, in any way, limit the County's rights to sue for breach of this Agreement.

9. Appropriation Of Funds. Organization and the County recognize that the County intends to satisfy its financial obligation to Organization hereunder out of funds annually appropriated for that purpose by the County. County promises and covenants to make its best efforts to appropriate funds in accordance with this Agreement. In the event no funds or insufficient funds are appropriated and budgeted, or are otherwise unavailable by any means whatsoever for payment due hereunder, County shall immediately notify Organization of this occurrence and this Agreement shall terminate on the last day for which appropriations were received, without penalty or expense to the County of any kind whatsoever, except as to the portions of the payment amounts herein agreed upon for which funds shall have been appropriated and budgeted or are otherwise available, or at any time after the last date that County has paid for the Services, if earlier.

#### County further agrees:

A. That any funds authorized or appropriated for services rendered under this Agreement shall be applied to the payments hereunder until all such funds are exhausted.

B. That County will use its best efforts to obtain authorization and appropriation of such funds including, without limitation, the inclusion in its annual budget, a request for adequate funds to meet its obligation under this Agreement in full.

- 10. <u>Conflict Of Interest</u>. Organization warrants that no officer or employee of the County, whether elected or appointed, shall, in any manner whatsoever, be interested in or receive any benefit from the profits or emoluments of this Agreement.
- 11. <u>Severability</u>. If any covenant or other provision of this Agreement is invalid, or incapable of being enforced by reason of any rule of law or public policy, all other conditions and provisions of this Agreement shall, nevertheless, remain in full force and effect; and no covenant or provision shall be deemed dependent upon any other covenant or provision unless so expressed herein.
- 12. <u>Indemnification</u>. Organization shall indemnify, defend and hold the County harmless from any and all claims, liabilities, damages, and costs (including reasonable attorney's fees directly related thereto) including but not limited to violation of civil rights and/or bodily injury to or death of any person and for damage to or destruction of property if and to the extent caused by the negligence, willful misconduct or omissions of Organization during the performance of this Agreement.
- 13. <u>Insurance</u>. Organization shall maintain the following insurance coverage during the term of this Agreement.
- A. Organization shall maintain Commercial General Bodily Injury and Property Damage Liability insurance, each in a combined single limit of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) each occurrence for bodily injury and property damage liability.
- B. Organization shall maintain, if any motor vehicles are used in the performance of the Services, Commercial General Bodily Injury and Property Damage Liability insurance, and Automobile Liability insurance including owned,

non-owned, or hired vehicles, each in a combined single limit of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) each occurrence for bodily injury and property damage liability.

- C. Organization agrees to provide the County with certificates of insurance evidencing the above described coverage prior to the start of Services, and annually thereafter, if required by the County. Such certificates shall provide that the applicable insurance policies have been endorsed to provide a minimum of thirty days advance notice to the County in the event of cancellation, non-renewal, or reduction in limits by endorsement.
- 14. <u>Term</u>. The term of this Agreement shall commence January 1, 2020, and shall continue until December 31, 2020, unless sooner terminated pursuant to paragraph 8, 15, or 19 hereof. If this Agreement is terminated by either party, the County shall pay only for those services actually performed by Organization as verified by the County's audit.
- 15. <u>Termination</u>. This Agreement may be terminated for any reason or no reason by either of the parties upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the other party's designated fiscal representative. All services and payments shall continue through the effective date of termination. Termination of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of the rights or obligations which the County or Organization may be entitled to receive as provided in this Agreement, or be obligated to perform under this Agreement for services prior to the date of termination. Should this Agreement terminate, all County written materials of any kind must be delivered and returned by Organization to the County within ten (10) days of the termination of this Agreement.

- 16. <u>Standard of Care</u>. Organization shall exercise the same degree of care, skill, and diligence in the performance of the Services as is ordinarily possessed and exercised by professionals operating under similar circumstances.
- 17. **Financial Contact.** Organization shall designate a fiscal representative to act as a liaison between the parties to resolve any problems, complaints, or special circumstances encountered in the billing of the services agreed upon here.

- 18. <u>Compliance Review</u>. The performance of this Agreement shall be subject to review by the County. The County Compliance Review Office and staff shall review this contract according to their responsibilities including site visits to any and all agencies. Organization agrees any display of hostile behavior, refusing and/or hindering a site review by any employee or staff member shall be grounds for suspension, termination or disqualification of this Agreement. The County warrants that all books, records, accounts, and any other documents in the possession of the County relating to this Agreement are public records open for inspection in accordance with Chapter 610, RSMo.
- 19. Remedies For Breach. Organization agrees to faithfully observe and perform all of the terms, provisions, and requirements of this Agreement, and Organization's failure to do so constitutes a breach of this Agreement. In such event, Organization consents and agrees as follows:

- A. The County may, without prior notice to Organization, immediately terminate this Agreement; and
- B. The County shall be entitled to collect from Organization all payments made by the County to Organization for which Organization has not yet rendered services in accordance with this Agreement, and to collect the County's reasonable attorney's fees, court costs and service fees if it is necessary to bring action to recover such payments.
- 20. <u>Transfer And Assignment</u>. Organization shall not assign or transfer any portion or the whole of this Agreement without the prior written consent of the County.
- 21. <u>Organization Identity</u>. If Organization is merged or purchased by another entity, the County reserves the right to terminate this Agreement. Organization shall immediately notify the county in the event it is merged or purchases by any other entity.
- 22. <u>Confidentiality</u>. Organization's records concerning the identities of those participating in its programs shall be strictly confidential; the County shall be entitled to examine said records in performing its audit and review functions, but shall not disclose said identities to any third party in any fashion.
- 23. <u>Incorporation</u>. This Agreement incorporates the entire understanding and agreement of the parties.

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What time period does this program run: All Year

Provide program description: To advance the mission of healing and self-sufficiency for homeless children and families, Sheffield Place offers four fully-integrated programs: 1) Residential Housing Services - Each family has a private living unit with a private bath (14 units have a maximum capacity of one mother and five children; three units have a maximum capacity of a mother and two children). Families share kitchens and a common laundry room. Families with income pay one-third of their adjusted income as a program fee; mothers without income perform an additional chore. 2) Residential Clinical Services - This highly-structured program provides: an hour of therapy and an hour of case management each week along with the requirement that mothers participate in a minimum of 15 hours of psycho-educational and therapy groups each week of the 30 hours offered. Residents are required to observe a nightly curfew; do daily chores; and be employed, in school, or actively seeking employment. Children take part in therapeutic programming as well. 3) Aftercare Clinical Services - Families in aftercare receive case management services in their homes along with other supportive services for as long as needed without charge. Families may return to the facility for therapy and psycho-social groups. Families in aftercare take part in the agency's quarterly social events. 4) Permanent Housing Services - Families receive supportive services through the aftercare program. Sheffield Place currently operates 10 units of permanent housing. Families pay adjusted rent and all utilities.

Describe the benefits of this program to Jackson County Missouri: Sheffield Place's mission is to help high barrier homeless families become self-sufficient. By helping families become stronger and self-supporting, the community becomes stronger through employed, tax paying citizens. Improving the lives of families also helps with improvement in neighborhoods & the community through the creation of engaged, voting citizens. Sheffield Place helps prevent crime by working with offenders, renovating vacant homes to improve neighborhoods, and being a positive presence in the community. The program teaches life skills, helps mothers secure and maintain employment which helps break the cycle of homelessness & poverty.

Describe target population to be served: Sheffield Place serves families that struggle with multiple barriers to achieving self-sufficiency. The mothers at Sheffield Place demonstrate the pervasive, negative effects of severe trauma. Nearly all have addiction issues and a mental health diagnosis - most commonly post-traumatic stress disorder, depression, bi-polar, adjustment, or anxiety disorder. The mothers grew up living with addiction, violence, homelessness, and poverty. For many this is a generational cycle. Without intervention, these families will remain in the generational cycle of addiction, poverty and homelessness. They will suffer from a lifetime of adverse mental and physical health outcomes and have lives cut short by as much as three decades. (Adverse Childhood Experiences Study, Felitti, Andra, et al., 1998; http://www.nimh.nih.gov/about/director/2011/no-health-without-mentalhealth.shtml) The National Institute of Drug Addiction's Substance Abuse in Women (June 2019) found that issues impacting women include "hormones. menstrual cycle, fertility, pregnancy, breastfeeding, and menopause. In addition, women themselves describe unique reasons for using drugs, including controlling weight, fighting exhaustion, coping with pain, and attempts to self-treat mental health problems. It was also fund that • Women often use substances differently than men, such as using smaller amounts of certain drugs for less time before they become addicted. • Women can respond to substances differently. For example, they may have more drug cravings and may be more likely to relapse after treatment. • Sex hormones can make women more sensitive than men to the effects of some drugs. • Women who use drugs may also experience more physical effects on their heart and blood vessels. • Brain changes in women who use drugs can be different from those in men. • Women may be more likely to go to the emergency room or die from overdose or other effects of certain substances. • Women who are victims of domestic violence are at increased risk of substance use. • Divorce, loss of child custody, or the death of a partner or child can trigger women's substance use or other mental health disorders. • Women who use certain substances may be more likely to have panic attacks, anxiety, or depression." Timely, evidence-based treatment that address the specific needs of women will empower them to end the generational cycle of homelessness, poverty, addiction, and abuse and lead healthy, productive, and self-sufficient lives. These services will be provided: • Recovery support services – including peer support and drug testing for residential and aftercare clients • Treatment services - group and individual for residential and aftercare clients • Clean, sober, safe supportive housing so that families may stabilize • Clean, sober, safe permanent supportive housing

What are the qualifications for participants: Families come to Sheffield Place from the street, homeless shelters, addiction recovery centers, domestic violence shelters, and increasingly from the internet. Homeless mother-led families needing the intensive addiction recovery, mental health, and life skills services the agency provides are admitted following an interview; families with less intensive needs receive referrals to appropriate services. The mother undergoes a drug test at admission and randomly thereafter. The mother does not have to be clean from alcohol and other drugs at admission, but she must begin recovery upon admission. Sheffield Place serves high-need homeless mothers with children.



### **WORK AUTHORIZATION AFFIDAVIT**

As a condition for any service provided to the County, a business entity shall, by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation, affirm its enrollment and participation in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees working in connection with the contracted services.

Business entity, as defined in section 285.525, RSMo pertaining to section 285.530, RSMo, is any person or group of persons performing or engaging in any activity, enterprise, profession, or occupation for gain, benefit, advantage, or livelihood. The term "business entity" shall include but not be limited to self-employed individuals, partnerships, corporations, contractors, and subcontractors. The term "business entity" shall include any business entity that possesses a business permit, license, or tax certificate issued by the state, any business entity that is exempt by law from obtaining such a business permit, and any business entity that is operating unlawfully without such a business permit.

Every such business entity shall complete the following affidavit affirming that it does not knowingly employ any person who is an unauthorized alien in connection with the contracted services. The completed affidavit must be returned as a part of the contract documentation.

This affidavit affirms that Sheffield Place, is enrolled in, and is currently participating in, E-verify or any other equivalent electronic verification of work authorization operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security under the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 (IRCA); and, Sheffield Place, does not knowingly employ any person who is an unauthorized alien in conjunction with the contracted services.
