5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Mike Sanders, County Executive, said Mid-America Regional Council and Jackson County are hosting the Jackson County Commuter Corridors Transit Oriented Development (TOD) Workshop. The workshops or charrettes are planned for February 6th through 8th at the Ennovation Center, 201 N. Forest in Independence, MO. The following jurisdictions will be participating: Kansas City, Independence, Blue Springs, Lee's Summit, Oak Grove, Raytown, Grain Valley, Greenwood and Pleasant Hill.

The goal of the workshop is:

- Provide a corridor-wide perspective on TOD and recommend actions to maximize TOD opportunities.
- 2. Educate stakeholders on the principles of successful TOD, barriers to implementation, market concerns and the importance of a corridor wide perspective.
- 3. Identify potential station location options based on an interactive "mini-charrette" with each jurisdiction.
- 4. Develop a final report which summarizes the process, the station options within each jurisdiction, and the recommendations, next steps, responsibilities and timeframe for each action item.

The morning of February 6th will include all participating jurisdictions. The focus will be on individual municipalities in 2 hour increments, followed by a wrap-up session the afternoon of February 8th. Staff that represents Planning, Public Works, Parks and Economic Development from each municipality will participate.
