13 UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Fred Arbanas, County Legislator, asked what direction the Legislature will take regarding the audit of the COMBAT funds. He asked if the Legislature, the County Executive or the Prosecuting Attorney will select the auditor.

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said she does not have a problem with the County Legislature selecting the auditing firm. She said Bob Spence suggested providing funds to the citizens commission and allowing them to choose the auditor. She said essentially this came about when the COMBAT Commission passed a motion at their meeting on February 12, 2004 asking that there be a review of the structure of COMBAT. The Commission thought that this should be done every 3-5 years. There has not been a citizen review of COMBAT since 1993 or 1994. To help with the process, Katheryn Shields asked former U.S. Attorney Jean Paul Bradshaw, former Prosecuting Attorney and former Judge Albert Riederer and other citizens to take a look at this Commission, to review and determine if Jackson County is handling the tax in the most efficient way and if the structure is the most efficient for getting the most good out of this tax. She said the Prosecuting Attorney reacted negatively to the suggestion and has been doing a variety of things.

Scott Burnett, Chairman, said in two weeks the County Legislature will take up the matter regarding COMBAT.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, said there will be no Finance and Audit Committee meeting since there is no legislation on the agenda. The Committee will meet in two weeks and discuss the scope of the audit for COMBAT. The citizens commission will look at performance issues and the Finance and Audit Committee will look at financial issues. He agrees with Bob Spence that the citizens committee report to the Legislature. There will be funds to hire an independent auditor and there should be a method of selection.

Fred Arbanas said in the past, the Legislature has hired auditing firms after interviewing them.

Ronald E. Finley agrees that the Legislature can interview or send out RFP's for auditing firms. He hopes in two weeks the committee can agree on the scope of the audit and prepare a formal resolution.
