					The "Teens in Transition" program of the Kansas City No Violence Alliance (NoVa), was a summer program focused on youth who had been identified as affiliated with various gangs and offered an opportunity to be involved during "high-risk" hours to participate in life skills activities. This program was a key collaborative effort involving key law enforcement and community leaders dedicated to reducing violence in the city's core.

		COMBAT has been a strong partner and supporter of this initiative with the Prosecutor's Office. The Jackson County Drug Commission reviewed this request for funding and voted to approve the forwarding of this request to the Legislature on August 5, 2014.

# Teens in Transition: a new summer youth program from KC NoVA (the Kansas City No Violence Alliance)

In a new program this summer, KC NoVA (the Kansas City No Violence Alliance) focused on 27 youth who have been identified as gang affiliated. Many of them had committed violent crimes or faced gun charges. The program was initiated this spring after Kansas City police asked if KC NoVA might be able to do something to help decrease youth violence in the city this summer.

Using KC NoVA intelligence data, client advocates identified youth affiliated with various gangs, ages ranging between 12 and 18. The youth were asked to spend eight weeks in a four-day-per-week program that would engage them in a variety of ways, including case management, tutoring, life skills, job training and art. This group met during "high-risk hours" (3:00-6:00pm) at the Arts Tech building at 1522 Holmes. The program began on June 3<sup>rd</sup> and will end on August 2<sup>nd</sup> (it was extended to a ninth week) with a special community beautification event at Linwood and Indiana.

The program is built around life skills taught by Michael Toombs and staff.

Throughout the program, the young people work on anger management, time management, coping skills, education through tutoring, team building, and finally community involvement. There is also intensive case management conducted by the KC NoVA Client Advocates where the youth are provided help with education, job training, housing, mediation, and any other assistance they or their family may need. Through the life skill sessions the youth will have created two permanent installations to be placed in

their communities as a reflection of how they see their community as one. One installation will be at Linwood and Indiana on a lot owned by Kansas City Public Schools and the second will be installed at Wards Chapel Church near 21<sup>st</sup> and Prospect. On Aug. 2, the youth will showcase their work from this summer at a special community event that will also feature barbeque and music. KC NoVA and Kansas City Public School board members have been invited to attend the event, as well as the youth and their families.

KC NoVA is a collaboration involving key law enforcement and community leaders, dedicated to reducing violence in the city's core. The governing board members of KC NoVA: Police Chief Darryl Forte, Mayor Sly James, U.S. Attorney Tammy Dickinson, Jackson County Prosecutor Jean Peters Baker, ATF Special Agent in Charge Greg Gant, FBI SAC Mike Kaste, UMKC Chancellor Leo Morton and Jackie Dunn, regional administrator of Missouri Probation and Parole.


